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## **UTAH ECONOMY GROWS AT SLOWER PACE IN 1999**

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Utah's economy continued to expand in 1999; however, for the third consecutive year, the rate of expansion slowed. Of seventeen indicators tracked by the Bureau of Economic and Business Research, only two declined during 1999. Seven of these indicators increased at a higher rate than during 1998, while eight indicators posted increases at lower rates. Highlights of Utah's economy during 1999 include:

- Population grew by 38,551 persons to 2,121,053 persons; the growth rate of 1.9 percent was up from 1.6 percent in 1998.
- Nonagricultural employment increased 2.4

- percent, down from a 3.0 percent increase in 1998.
- monthly Average nonagricultural wages rose 3.8 percent, down from a 4.4 percent increase in 1998.
- Nonagricultural payroll wages increased 6.4 percent, down from a 7.5 percent increase in 1998.
- С Total personal income increased 6.5 percent, down from a 6.7 percent increase in 1998.
- Per capita personal income rose by 5.0 percent, up from a 4.9 percent increase in 1998.

- Total assessed valuation rose by 5.8 percent, down from a 6.8 increase in 1998.
- Property taxes charged increased 12.2 percent, after increasing 0.6 percent in 1998.
- Gross taxable sales increased 4.7 percent, down from a 6.8 percent in 1998.
- C. The number of new dwelling units authorized decreased by 6.4 percent, after a 5.1 percent increase in 1998.
- Total construction value increased 4.5 percent, with residential construction

- value increasing by 2.3 percent and nonresidential value increasing by 4.1 percent.
- C New car and truck registrations increased by 4.5 percent, up from a 2.1 percent increase in 1998.
- C Federal "payments-in-lieuof-taxes" rose 3.2 percent after rising 1.8 percent in 1998.

Economic indicators for the past several years are examined to determine local and statewide trends in the Utah economy. State, regional and county level data are collected and tabulated for each of six categories: population, employment, income, taxes, c o n s t r u c t i o n, a n d miscellaneous.

Detail tables by county and state totals are presented for a total of 17 economic indicators covering a broad range of economic activities. In 1999, gains were made at the state level for 15 of the 17 indicators. Comparatively, in 1998, all but one the 17 indicators recorded

growth over the previous year. However, in 1999 only seven of the 17 indicators had a greater rate of increase than in 1998.

Areas of especially strong growth were property taxes charged, up 12.2 percent; total personal income, up 6.5 percent; nonagricultural payroll wages, up 6.3 percent, and net local sales tax allocations, up 6.3 percent.

## DISTRIBUTION OF GROWTH

The Mountainland counties posted strong economic growth during 1999. The region led the state in population growth at 3.7 percent, and in growth in total personal income which increased 9.2 percent. The region was second out of the seven multi-county regions in growth in both nonagricultural employment and in gross taxable sales with increases of 3.6 percent and 7.7 percent, respectively.

Economic growth in the Uintah Basin counties slowed from 1998. This region ranked seventh out of the seven regions in change in total personal income and gross taxable sales. Total personal income rose 0.9 percent and gross taxable sales dropped 7.7 percent. The region ranked fifth in population growth with a 1.0 percent increase and sixth nonagricultural employment with a 0.5 percent increase.

Percentage changes and rankings by multi-county district are shown in Table 1. Figures 1 through 4 show percentage changes by county for selected indicators.

In Utah's metropolitan counties, growth remained robust in absolute numbers,

even as rates of growth for some indicators were lower than in other areas of the state. For the third consecutive year, Utah County experienced the greatest increase in population of the 29 Utah counties. Additionally, Davis County surpassed Salt Lake County in population growth. Utah County added 12,833 residents, while Davis County added 6,045 residents and Salt Lake County added 5,411 residents. Collectively, these three counties accounted for 63.0 percent of the increase in Utah's population during 1999. These three counties also accounted for 76.6 percent of the new jobs in Utah, and 71.9 percent of the increase in gross taxable sales during 1999. Salt Lake County had the greatest change in total personal income during 1999, followed by Utah and Weber counties. Together, these three counties accounted for 78.9 percent of the increase in total personal income in Utah during 1999. Distribution of growth in numeric change and absolute numbers by county are presented in Table 2 and Table 3.

#### POPULATION GROWTH

The rate of population growth in Utah rose to 1.9 percent in 1999, with an increase of 38,551 new residents. Tooele County had the highest population growth rate during the year at 8.0 percent. Other counties with healthy population growth rates include: Piute (4.0%), Utah (3.8%), Washington (3.6%), Daggett (3.4%), Iron (3.4%), Beaver (3.3%), Wayne (3.2%), Summit (3.1%), and Wasatch (3.0%). Counties with less than average growth rates include Juab (1.8 %), Weber (1.6%), Cache (1.6 %), Garfield (1.5%), Sevier (1.5%), Kane (1.1%), Uintah (1.0%), Duchesne (0.9%), Sanpete (0.7%), and Salt Lake (0.6%).

Four of the 29 counties in Utah experienced a decrease in population from 1998 to 1999. The greatest percentage drop was in Carbon County, which lost 227 residents, or 1.0 percent. Other counties recording population declines were Emery, 56 residents or 0.5 percent; Millard with a loss of 70 residents or 0.6 percent; and San Juan with a loss of 8 residents or 0.1 percent.

#### **EMPLOYMENT**

Employment growth in 1999 was a healthy 2.4 percent, although down from a 3.0 percent growth rate in 1998. The growth rate nonagricultural employment was greatest in the Southwest counties, with a rate of 4.0 The Mountainland percent. counties also demonstrated growth above the state average. The Uintah Basin counties employment growth rate dropped to 0.5 percent, down from 2.6 percent in 1998. The Bear River counties experienced the lowest employment growth rate (0.2%), after growing 3.2 percent in 1998.

Wasatch County experienced the highest nonagricultural employment growth (14.4%) during 1999. Other counties recording employment growth above the state average were Garfield (7.5%), Daggett (6.8%), Grand (6.6%), Washington (5.0%), Piute (4.4%), Utah (3.6%), Sevier (3.4%), Rich (3.2%), Uintah (2.8%), and Davis

(2.6%). Five Utah counties posted a decrease in employment during 1999. These were Kane, down 0.2 percent; Morgan, down 2.4 percent; Emery, down 3.4 percent; Duchesne, down 4.0 and Box Elder, down 4.5 percent.

#### **INCOME**

The average monthly nonagricultural wage in Utah grew to \$2,291, an increase of 3.8 percent. Daggett County led the way with a 10.0 percent increase. Six of the eight counties with an above average percentage gain in average monthly wage were nonmetropolitan counties: Wasatch (6.8%), Grand (5.5%), Cache (5.2%), Sanpete (4.8%), and Wayne (4.1%). Of Utah's metropolitan counties, Utah had a 5.2 percent increase, Salt Lake a 4.1 percent increase, Weber a 3.6 percent increase, and Davis a 3.3 percent increase. Three counties experienced a decline average monthly nonagricultural wage. These were Garfield, down 0.5 percent; Duchesne, down 0.7 percent; and Box Elder, down 0.9 percent.

Four Utah counties had average monthly wages higher than the state average of \$2,291 during 1999. Emery County led the way with a \$2,728 average monthly wage. Other counties above the state average were Box Elder (\$2,561), Salt Lake (\$2,533), and Tooele (\$2,467).

Nonagricultural payroll wages increased 6.4 percent in 1999, after a 7.5 percent increase in 1998. Counties with above average increases in nonagricultural payroll were Wasatch (21.7%), Daggett (14.8%), Grand (12.5%), Piute

(10.7%), Utah (8.9%), Summit (8.0%), Washington (7.9%), Cache (7.6%), Garfield (7.0%), and Salt Lake (6.5%). Nonagricultural payroll dropped in three counties: Emery, down 0.3 percent; Duchesne, down 4.6 percent; and Box Elder, down 5.3 percent.

Total personal income increased statewide by 6.5 percent, while state per capita income increased by 5.0 percent \$23,356. Three counties experienced double-digit gains in both indicators. Wasatch County had gains of 20.8 percent and 16.5 percent in total personal income and per capita income, respectively. Similarly, Daggett County had gains of 14.8 percent and 15.6 percent in total personal income and per capita income, respectively, while Grand County had gains of 11.8 percent and 10.2 percent, respectively. Counties showing a decline in average total personal income were Beaver (-0.9%), Millard (-1.8%), Emery (-2.8%), Morgan (-3.0%), Duchesne (-4.2%), and Box Elder (-6.2%). Counties that posted declines in per capita income were Beaver (-2.4%), Millard (-2.8%), Emery (-2.9%), Tooele (-4.6%), Morgan (-5.1%), Duchesne (-5.5%) and Box Elder (-8.2%).

#### **TAXES**

The rise in Utah property values continued to moderate with a statewide increase of 5.8 percent for total assessed valuation in 1999 after a 6.8 percent increase in 1998. Counties with sizeable increases in assessed valuation were Wasatch (13.9%), Wayne (12.1%), Washington (11.3%), and Weber (11.0%). Counties

recording property valuations lower than in 1998 were Uintah (-0.3%), Juab (-2.4%), Summit (-3.8%), Millard (-5.1%), Daggett (-9.4%), Duchesne (-12.6%), and San Juan (-17.7%).

State gross taxable sales increased 4.7 percent in 1999, down from a 6.8 percent increase in 1998. The greatest increase occurred in Morgan County with a 22.1 percent increase over 1998. Other counties that experienced a greater than 10 percent increase in gross taxable sales were Grand (17.0%), Wasatch (14.1%), Iron (12.7%), and Juab (11.1%). Six counties showed a drop in gross taxable sales: Uintah, down 1.2 percent; Carbon, down 1.6 percent; San Juan, down 6.1 percent; Sevier, down 14.2 percent; Emery, down 20.4 percent; and Duchesne, down 23.5 percent.

#### CONSTRUCTION

Residential construction slowed in 1999. The number of new dwelling units authorized dropped 6.4 percent statewide, while the valuation of new residential construction grew 2.3 percent. Rural counties had the most significant percentage growth in number of new dwelling units. Counties with the highest growth were Morgan (480.0%), Wasatch (110.9%), Garfield (78.0%), Uintah (31.8%), Grand (28.9%), and Carbon (27.6%). Although the highest growth rates were in nonmetropolitan counties, the metropolitan counties still accounted for the majority of the new dwelling units constructed. Davis, Salt Lake, Utah, and Weber counties collectively accounted for 66.1 percent of the

dwelling units receiving building permits during 1999.

The value of new residential construction increased 2.3 percent during 1999, after rising 12.6 percent in 1998. Morgan (652.2%), Wasatch (155.5%), and Garfield (62.5%) counties had the highest gains in value of new residential construction.

New nonresidential construction rose from 1998 levels. The total value of new nonresidential construction rose 4.1 percent after a 16.2 percent increase in 1998.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

Utah posted a 0.3 percent decrease in the number of new cars and trucks registered during 1999, down from a 2.1 percent rise in 1998. The number of new registrations decreased by 221 to a total of 83,834. The percentage change varied widely by county.

Payments-in-lieu-of-taxes (PILTs) increased statewide by 3.2 percent in 1999, to \$9.78 million. These payments, made by the federal government in order to compensate for the loss of tax revenues on federally owned property are dependent upon funding levels established by Congress.

Salt Lake County received \$5,346 more in PILTs in 1999, an increase of 9.2 percent. Other counties receiving 5 percent or greater increases in PILT allocations in 1999 were Duchesne (9.0%), and Summit (6.9%).

#### **SUMMARY**

Utah's economy continued to expand in 1999 although at a slower pace than in 1998. While increases were generally lower than in the previous year, only two indicators declined in 1999. Utah's economy is growing, but the rate of growth is slowing. The majority of the growth is occurring along the Wasatch Front although Utah's nonmetropolitan counties are also participating in the economic prosperity.

Figure 1 Utah Population Growth by County Percent Change 1998 to 1999



Percent Change 1998 to 1999



Percent Change 1998 to 1999





Figure 4 Number of New Dwelling Units by County Percent Change 1998 to 1999
