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PERSONAL INCOME IN UTAH **COUNTIES 2000**

Personal income data provide important information highlighting the economic structure of Utah counties, as well as similarities and differences among the counties. For example, while per capita income in Utah for 2000 was \$23,436 or 79.6 percent of the U.S. per capita income, the variation among Utah counties ranged from \$40,528 per capita in Summit County, to a low of \$12,606 in San Juan County. Four counties, Davis, Kane, Salt Lake and Summit, have per capita incomes greater than the state average while the other 25 counties are below the average. Salt Lake County accounts for nearly one-half (47%) of all personal income in Utah. Total personal income

and per capita personal income by county for 1998-2000 are shown in Table 1.

Growth Sectors and Growth Counties

There are significant differences in the sources of personal income among various groups of Utah counties. Rural counties generally have more elderly people and hence a higher proportion of income from transfer payments such as Social Security. Transfer payments represent 10.1 percent of income for Utah but account for more than 20 percent of all income payments in Carbon, Daggett, Duchesne, Piute and San Juan counties. Transfer payments account for only 3.6 percent of income payments in Summit County, 7.9 percent in Davis County. 8.5 percent in Morgan County and 8.7 percent in Salt Lake County.

examination Αn earnings by industry shows that over 99 percent of Utah earnings come from nonfarm activity while less than 1 percent comes from farm earnings. Six counties receive 10 percent or more of earnings from agriculture: Beaver (39.3), Rich (28.9), Piute (24.3), Wayne (13.1), Millard (11.9), and Sanpete (11.1). The mining sector orientation of Carbon, Duchesne, Emery, and Uintah counties is shown by the share of earnings coming from that industry-29.8 percent for Emery, 21.2 per-

cent for Uintah, 19.6 percent for Carbon, and 15.8 percent for Duchesne.

The services sector is Utah's largest industry, accounting for over 28 percent of all earnings. Government and manufacturing are the second and third largest sectors accounting for 18.2 and 12.8 percent of earnings, respectively. Retail trade is the fourth largest sector and accounts for 9.7 percent of earnings. An examination of

Table 3 illustrates the wide variations among Utah counties in the share of earnings within each county that come from various industries.

Counties with a large share of earnings from manufacturing are Box Elder (54.6%), Cache (27.2%), Weber (21.1%), Juab (15.4%), Morgan (14.9%), Utah (13.1%), and Tooele (13.0%). The federal government is a major source of earnings for five counties—Daggett (26.7%),

Tooele (23.4%), Davis (21.4%), Garfield (14.0%) and Wayne (13.9%). When state and local government are added to federal government activity, total government-generated earnings reach 56.2 percent for Daggett, 39.7 percent for San Juan, 38.4 percent for Piute, 37.2 percent for Davis, 36.5 percent for Tooele, 33.3 percent for Garfield and 32.6 percent for Sanpete. Looking only at state and local government earnings, four

counties—Piute (34.9%), San Juan (31.9%), Sanpete (29.7%), and Daggett (29.2%)—all receive more than 25 percent of earnings from this source.

The high growth sectors of the Utah economy as measured by personal income and earnings between 1999 and 2000 were: agricultural services (14.7%), services (10.5%) and mining (8.3%). The one industrial sector that declined was farm earnings, which declined 11.7 percent.

While the growth in Utah's personal income between 1999 and 2000 was 6.9 percent, counties above the state growth rate were Beaver, Box Elder, Davis, Duchesne, Kane, Morgan, Summit, Tooele, Uintah, Utah, Wasatch, and Washington. Personal income in Salt Lake County increased 6.6 percent.

Careful study of the tables for each county will provide insights into the relative importance of each of the major industries within the county as well as the importance of sources such as dividends, interest and rental income. These tables are published annually to provide information on the sources of income and earnings for each of Utah's counties. (The complete time series covering the years 1969-2000 for personal income and earnings in Utah by county and industrial sector is available on the Bureau of Economic and Business Research Internet site (http://www.business.utah.edu/bebr/ Counties/index.html). The data are in Microsoft Excel format.)

Personal Income and Its Components

The Bureau of Economic and Business Research at the University of Utah publishes these tables from data prepared by the Bureau of Economic Analysis in the U.S. Department of Commerce. Table 3 presents the most recent BEA county personal income estimates for Utah.

Personal income is defined by the BEA to comprise the money value of current income received from all sources by, or on behalf of, persons residing in a given geographical area, including income received in both monetary and nonmonetary forms. Specifically, personal income consists of:

- Wage and salary disbursements, excluding social security taxes and o ther personal contributions for social insurance paid by employees.
- Other labor income, which consists of employer contributions for private life and medical insurance, private retirement programs and other private "fringe" benefits.
- Net income of owners of u n i n c o r p o r a t e d enterprises, excluding selfemployed contributions for social security and other social insurance.
- Property income, including dividends, interest and rent.
- · Transfer payments, i.e.,

personal payments by government or business for which no services are currently rendered.

Income derived from participation in the work force is referred to as labor and proprietors' income or earnings and includes (1) wage and salary disbursements, (2) other labor income and (3) net income of owners of unincorporated enterprises. Net labor and proprietors' income or net earnings is derived by deducting social security taxes and other social insurance contributions paid by workers, including selfemployment contributions paid by owners of unincorporated enterprises. Since wage and salary disbursements and other labor income are reported on a place-of-work basis, labor and proprietors' income must be adjusted for the effect of inter-area commuting at the earnings component personal income (which is defined on a place-of-residence basis). This adjustment is accomplished by estimating the difference between the net earnings of persons who reside in a given area but who work in other areas and the net earnings of persons who work in the given area but reside in other areas. This difference is the residence adjustment.

Per Capita Personal Income

A per capita personal income time series for the State of Utah from 1982 to 2001 is presented in Table 2. These data show that Utah's

position was 82 percent of the national average in 1982, but in 1989 slipped to only 75 percent. Since 1990 Utah has been making a comeback, with Utah's 2001 per capita personal income at 80 percent of the national average.

Per capita personal income figures for Utah counties in 1999 appear in Table 3 (as the second line item). Per capita personal income figures for the 50 states in 2001 are presented in Figure 1.

Technical Notes

BEA Income Imputations

The BEA personal income estimates include imputations or allowances for the value of certain types of income realizations, even though no monetary transaction is involved.

These include imputations for:

- wages and salaries paid in kind, i.e., in the form of food, clothing or lodging;
- rental value of owner-occupied dwelling units; food and fuel produced and consumed on farms; and
- interest earned on money deposited with financial intermediaries for which no interest is actually paid or credited.

This last item includes, for example, an imputation for the interest earning potential of ordinary bank demand deposit accounts, even though banks do not ordinarily pay interest on such accounts. For the state, imputed interest amounts to roughly 35 percent of total interest.

BEA Person Concept

Personal income as defined by the Bureau of Economic Analysis

includes the income of certain legal entities not ordinarily regarded as "persons," including nonprofit institutions serving individuals, private non-insured pension funds, health and welfare funds, and private trust funds. In effect, the current earnings of these organizations are credited directly to the ultimate beneficiaries for personal income accounting purposes. Since such organizations are considered to be persons, benefit payments by them to individuals are considered to be transfer payments between persons and not part of personal income. The undistributed earnings of life insurance carriers and private non-insured pension funds are also credited to persons for personal income accounting purposes.


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
