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Highlights

- The Uintah Basin, buoyed by higher oil prices, experienced the strongest economic growth of seven multi-county areas during 2001. The region led the state in growth in nonagricultural employment (6.3%), total personal income (6.7%), and gross taxable sales (11.5%). The Uintah Basin ranked third in population gain, up 2.5 percent.
- Utah's population increased 2.2 percent, with the highest growth rates occurring in counties near the Wasatch Front and in Washington County. Tooele County led the state in population growth with a 6.9 percent gain, followed by Washington (4.9%), Summit (4.1%), Utah (3.7%), and Wasatch (3.3%). Eight nonmetropolitan counties experienced decreases in population. Emery County saw the largest percentage population decrease, down 3.9 percent or 309 residents.
- Nonagricultural employment increased statewide by 2.2 percent, but dropped in 12 of the 29 counties. In contrast to past years, when the metropolitan counties experienced solid job growth, two of the four metropolitan counties saw decreases in employment. Salt Lake County lost 389 jobs, down 0.1 percent and Weber County lost 1,243 jobs, down 1.4 percent. Davis County added 2,734 jobs, up 3.2 percent and Utah County added 1,360 jobs, up 0.9 percent.
- Total nonagricultural payroll rose 3.5 percent in Utah. The largest increase was in Uintah County, up 17.2 percent, followed by Duchesne (17.1%), Kane (10.1%), Juab (8.7%), and Morgan (8.1%). Four counties experienced decreases in nonagricultural payroll. Daggett County saw the largest percentage drop in nonagricultural payroll, down 7.3 percent.

Utah's Economy: Slow Growth During 2001

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Annually, the Bureau of Economic and Business Research examines economic indicators for the past several years to determine local and statewide trends in the Utah economy. State, regional and county level data are collected and tabulated for each of six categories: population, employment, income, taxes, construction, and miscellaneous. Detail tables by county and state totals are presented for a total of 17 economic indicators covering a broad range of economic activities.

In 2001, gains were made at the state level for 15 of the 17 indicators. Comparatively, in 2000, 14 of the 17 indicators recorded growth over the previous year. Areas of especially strong growth were federal payments-in-lieu-of-taxes (PILTs), up 47.5 percent; federal mineral royalties, up 30.7 percent; value of new residential construction, up 10.0 percent; property taxes charged, up 8.4 percent; permits for new dwelling units, up 8.4 percent; and total assessed valuation, up 8.1 percent.

Distribution of Growth

The Uintah Basin counties posted strong economic growth during 2001. The region led the state in nonagricultural employment growth at 6.3 percent, growth in total personal income at 6.7 percent, and growth in gross taxable sales which increased 11.5 percent. The region was third out of the seven multi-county regions in population growth at 2.5 percent.

Economic growth in the Southwestern counties was also strong. This region ranked first in change in population growth at 3.8 percent. The Southwestern counties ranked second in growth in nonagricultural employment (3.8 %); total personal income (5.1%); and gross taxable sales (6.7%). Percentage changes and rankings by multi-county district are shown in Table 1. Figures 1 through 4 show percentage changes by county for selected indicators.

In Utah's metropolitan counties, growth was mixed, with some key indicators dropping in Salt Lake County. Salt Lake led the 29 Utah counties in population increase, followed by Utah, and Davis counties. Salt Lake County added 17,502 residents, while Utah County added 13,798 and Davis County added 4,041. Collectively,

these three counties accounted for 68.7 percent of the increase in Utah's population during 2001. These three counties accounted for 54.1 percent of the new jobs in Utah, with Salt Lake County losing 389 jobs while Davis and Utah counties added 2,734 and 1,360 jobs, respectively. These three counties were also responsible for 69.4 percent of the increase in total personal income during 2001. Utah County had the greatest absolute growth in gross taxable sales during 2001, up \$157 million, followed by Washington (up \$137 million) and Davis (up \$128 million) counties. Salt Lake County ranked last among all counties in change in gross taxable sales, with a decline of \$92 million. Distribution of growth by rates of change and by absolute numbers by county is presented in Tables 2 and 3.

Population Growth

The rate of population growth in Utah dropped to 2.2 percent in 2001, with an increase of 49,417 new residents. Tooele County had the highest population growth rate during the year at 6.9 percent. Other counties with healthy population growth rates include: Washington (4.9%), Summit (4.1%), Utah (3.7%), Wasatch (3.3%), Juab (3.1%), and Uintah (3.0%). Counties with less than average growth rates include Davis (1.9%), Duchesne (1.7%), Salt Lake (1.7%), Sanpete (1.6%), Morgan (1.6%), Cache (1.6%), Weber (1.5%), Rich (1.4%), Sevier (1.3%), Daggett (1.2%), Box Elder (0.9%), and Kane (0.0%).

Eight of the 29 counties in Utah recorded fewer residents in 2001, up from five counties during the previous year. The greatest percentage drop was in Emery County, which lost 309 residents, or 2.9 percent. Other counties recording population declines were Garfield, 133 residents or 2.8 percent, Carbon with a loss of 538 residents or 2.6 percent, Piute with a loss of 32 residents or 2.2 percent, San Juan with a loss of 297 resident or 2.1 percent, Grand with a loss of 114 residents or 1.3 percent, Millard with a loss of 135 residents or 1.1 percent, and Wayne with a loss of six residents or 0.2 percent.

Employment

Employment growth in 2001 was 0.6 percent, down from a 2.5 percent growth rate in 2000. The growth rate in nonagricultural employment was greatest in the Uintah Basin counties, with a rate of 6.3 percent. The Southwest, Mountainland, Bear River, and Central regions also demonstrated growth above the state average, growing 3.8, 1.2, 0.8, and 0.7 percent, respectively. The Southeast counties experienced a drop in employment (-2.3%), after declining 3.8 percent in 2000.

Piute County experienced the highest nonagricultural employment growth (14.5%) during 2001. Other

counties recording employment growth above the state average were Duchesne (7.5%), Uintah (6.5%), Washington (6.4%), Juab (6.1%), Tooele (4.6%), Morgan (4.5%), Summit (4.0%), Kane (3.3%), Davis (3.2%), Rich (2.5%), Wayne (1.7%), Cache (1.7%), Grand (1.2%), Utah (0.9%), and Wasatch (0.7%). Twelve Utah counties posted a decrease in employment during 2001, up from seven counties during 2000. These were Salt Lake, down 0.1 percent; Sanpete, down 0.7 percent; Iron, down 0.7 percent; Millard, down 0.9 percent; Box Elder, down 1.2 percent; Beaver, down 1.3 percent; Weber, down 1.4 percent; Garfield, down 2.2 percent; Carbon, down 2.4 percent; Emery, down 2.8 percent; San Juan, down 5.3 percent; and Daggett, down 8.6 percent.

Income

The average monthly nonagricultural wage in Utah grew to \$2,470, an increase of 2.8 percent. Uintah County led the way with a 10.1 percent increase. Seventeen of the 20 counties with above-average percentage gains in average monthly wage were nonmetropolitan counties: Duchesne (8.9%), Kane (6.6%), Rich (5.8%), Grand (5.4%), Wayne (5.4%), Emery (5.1%), Sevier (4.7%), Millard (4.5%), Sanpete (4.1%), Summit (3.8%), Iron (3.7%), Wasatch (3.4%), Beaver (3.3%), Morgan (3.3%), Tooele (3.1%), and Cache (3.0%). Of Utah's metropolitan counties, Weber had a 3.6 percent increase, Davis a 3.5 percent increase, Salt Lake a 3.0 percent increase, and Utah a 1.3 percent increase. Piute County experienced a decline in average monthly nonagricultural wage, down 6.5 percent.

Four Utah counties had average monthly wages higher than the state average of \$2,470 during 2001. Emery County led the way with a \$2,991 average monthly wage. Other counties above the state average were Box Elder (\$2,756), Salt Lake (\$2,740), and Tooele (\$2,585).

Nonagricultural payroll wages increased 3.5 percent in 2001, down from a 7.4 percent increase in 2000. Counties with above-average increases in nonagricultural payroll were Uintah (17.2%), Duchesne (17.1%), Kane (10.1%), Juab (8.7%), Morgan (8.1%), Washington (8.1%), Summit (8.1%), Rich (8.0%), Tooele (7.8%), Wayne (7.1%), Davis (6.8%), Grand (6.6%), Piute (6.5%), Sevier (5.1%), Cache (4.7%), Wasatch (4.2%), Millard (3.6%), and Sanpete (3.5%). Nonagricultural payroll dropped in four counties; Garfield, down 0.1 percent; Box Elder, down 0.5 percent; San Juan, down 3.6 percent; and Daggett, down 7.3 percent.

Total personal income increased statewide by 4.0 percent, while state per capita income increased by 3.3 percent to \$24,204. Counties with greater-than-average increases in total personal income are: Tooele (8.8%), Wasatch (7.7%),

Beaver (7.7%), Uintah (7.0%), Summit (6.6%), Duchesne (6.4%), Washington (5.8%), Davis, (5.6%), Morgan (5.1%), Box Elder (5.0%), Rich (4.7%), Sevier (4.3%), Utah (4.3%), and Garfield (4.0%). Total personal income dropped in San Juan County, down 0.7 percent. Per capita income rose faster than the state average in 14 counties: Garfield (6.7%), Emery (5.5%), Carbon (5.1%), Beaver (4.6%), Duchesne (4.5%), Kane (4.4%), Wayne (4.3%), Box Elder (4.1%), Wasatch (4.1%), Rich (3.8%), Uintah (3.7%), Piute (3.7%), Davis (3.6%), and Grand (3.3%). Three counties posted declines in per capita income; Iron, down 0.3 percent; Juab, down 0.3 percent; and Grand, down 3.3 percent.

Taxes

The rise in Utah property values continued with a statewide increase of 8.1 percent for total assessed valuation in 2001 after a 7.8 percent increase in 2000. Counties with sizeable increases in assessed valuation were Morgan (13.2%), Summit (12.8%), Washington (12.4%), Weber (12.4%), Davis (12.3%), Utah (12.1%), Carbon (11.1%), San Juan (10.1%), Wasatch (9.9%), Garfield (9.9%), Kane (9.3%), Daggett (9.3%), Tooele (8.7%), and Uintah (8.6%). Counties recording property values rising less than the state as a whole were Juab (7.8%), Duchesne (7.8%), Iron (7.4%), Wayne (6.2%), Salt Lake (5.5%), Grand (4.8%), Cache (4.5%), Box Elder (3.4%), Beaver (3.4%), Sevier (3.1%), Piute (3.1%), Rich (2.9%), Millard (2.8%), and Sanpete (0.8%). Only Emery County experienced a drop in property values, down 3.8 percent.

State gross taxable sales increased 2.4 percent in 2001, down from a 5.5 percent increase in 2000. The greatest increase occurred in Emery County with a 30.8 percent increase over 2000. Other counties that experienced a greater than 10 percent increase in gross taxable sales were Uintah (13.1%), Millard (12.1%), Summit (11.6%), Washington (11.1%), Sanpete (10.4%), and Tooele (10.1%). Nine counties showed a drop in gross taxable sales: Salt Lake, down 0.6 percent; Box Elder, down 0.7 percent; Piute, down 1.4 percent; San Juan, down 2.3 percent, Rich, down 3.2 percent; Beaver, down 4.0%; Kane, down 5.5%; Juab, 5.8%; and Garfield, down 9.1%.

Construction

Residential construction rebounded in 2001. The number of new dwelling units authorized rose 8.4 percent statewide, while the valuation of new residential construction increased 10.0 percent. Growth in the number of new dwelling units was distributed between rural and urban counties. Counties with the highest growth were Summit (68.9%), Davis (40.3%), Daggett (35.7%), Juab (18.2%), Salt Lake (16.4%), Cache

(11.8%), and Washington (11.4%). Although high growth rates occurred in the nonmetropolitan counties, the metropolitan counties still accounted for the majority of new dwelling units receiving permits. Davis, Salt Lake, Utah, and Weber counties collectively accounted for 68.9 percent of the dwelling units receiving building permits during 2001.

The value of new residential construction increased 10.0 percent during 2001, after dropping 4.4 percent in 2000. Daggett (95.8%), Summit (42.3%), Davis (30.7%), Carbon (17.6%), Salt Lake (15.4%), Utah (14.5%), Cache (12.4%), and Juab (12.1%) counties had the highest gains in value of new residential construction.

New nonresidential construction dropped from 2000 levels. The total value of new nonresidential construction declined 20.0 percent after a 1.5 percent increase in 2000.

Miscellaneous

Utah posted a 30.7 percent increase in federal mineral royalties paid during 2001. The amount of royalties paid increased by \$23.6 million to \$100.6 million. Four counties—Carbon, Duchesne, Emery, and Uintah—accounted for 87.9 percent of federal mineral royalties paid. One-half of these royalties, paid by companies extracting nonmetallic minerals on federal land, are returned to the state of origin.

Payments-in-lieu-of-taxes (PILTs) increased statewide by 47.5 percent in 2001, to \$15.3 million. These payments, made by the federal government in order to compensate for the loss of tax revenues on federally owned property, are dependent upon funding levels established by Congress.

Tooele County received \$532,000 more in PILTs in 2001, an increase of 64.1 percent. Other counties receiving 50 percent or greater increases in PILT allocations in 2001 were Iron (62.5%), Garfield (58.9%), Rich (55.0%), Weber (54.9%), and Wayne (51.6%).

Summary

Utah's economy expanded only slightly during 2001. Of the 17 indicators tracked, the rate of increase slowed for 11 indicators, while two recorded actual declines versus 2000. The residential construction indicators—number of new dwelling units and value of new residential construction—both chalked-up relatively strong gains in 2001. The number of new dwelling units was up 8.4 percent and the total value up 10.0 percent. The population, employment and wages indicators, the three most important measures of demographic and economic change, were positive in 2001, but all grew at a slower pace than in 2000.

Figure 1: Utah Population Growth by County Percent Change 2000 to 2001




Figure 2: Average Nonagricultural Employment by County Percent Change 2000 to 2001



Figure 3: Gross Taxable Sales and Purchases by County Percent Change 2000 to 2001




Figure 4: Number of New Dwelling Units by County Percent Change 2000 to 2001


