

Dr. Jennifer Robinson is the associate director of the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute. In addition to her administrative duties, Dr. Robinson leads research projects on a variety of topics utilizing both quantitative and qualitative research methods.

Dr. Robinson earned her B.S. in Political Science, Master of Public Administration, and Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Utah.

Prior to her work at the University of Utah, Dr. Robinson worked for the Utah House of Representatives, and is the co-author of two books: "Native Vote: American Indians, the Voting Rights Act, and the Right to Vote (Cambridge University Press, 2007) and "The Rise of the West in Presidential Elections" (University of Utah 2010). She has served for 10 years on the University of Utah Veteran's Day Committee, is a member of the Salt Lake Chamber's Capitol Club, and serves on the St. Paul's Preschool's Board of Directors. In 2014, Governor Herbert appointed Dr. Robinson to the Utah Women in the Economy Commission.
