

# U.S. Census Bureau Estimates by County

## BACKGROUND

The Census Bureau released the county-level estimates for July 1, 2016, highlighting growth over the previous year. Three Utah counties, San Juan, Wasatch, and Juab, were in the top 10 fastest growing counties in the nation of all counties with a population of 10,000 or more. Among these, San Juan County was ranked as the fastest growing county. Wasatch and Juab were ranked fourth and ninth, respectively. This release also included Metropolitan and Micropolitan Statistical Areas. St. George, Provo-Orem, and Logan were among the top 20 fastest growing metro areas in the nation.

## FAST GROWING COUNTIES

- **San Juan County** grew by 1,188 people (7.6 percent), with 87 percent of the growth attributed to net migration.
- **Utah County** grew by 3 percent, and surpassed Salt Lake County in absolute growth (17,503) and net migration (7,447).
- **Wasatch County** and **Juab County** both grew by 4.7 percent and 4.2 percent, with over half of their growth attributed to net migration. These ring counties have seen much growth over the past few years.

## Metropolitan Statistical Areas (areas with a core of at least 50,000 people and strong commuting ties)

**St. George's metro area** (Washington County) grew by 4,795 people, ranking them sixth in the nation at 3.1 percent. St. George's growth is characterized by high net migration and low natural increase.

- **Provo-Orem's metro area** (Juab and Utah Counties combined) grew by 17,947, ranking them seventh in the nation at 3.1 percent. Natural increase is Provo-Orem's primary driver of growth.
- **Logan's metro area** (combined with Franklin County, ID) grew by 3,066, ranking them twentieth in the nation at 2.3 percent.

## Micropolitan Statistical Areas (areas with a core between 10,000 and 50,000 people and strong commuting ties)

- **Heber's micro area** (Wasatch County) was the fastest growing in the nation at 4.7 percent.
- **Cedar City's micro area** (Iron County) was the fifth fastest growing in the nation at 3.4 percent.
- **Summit Park's micro area** (Summit County) was the fourteenth fastest growing in the nation at 2.1 percent.
