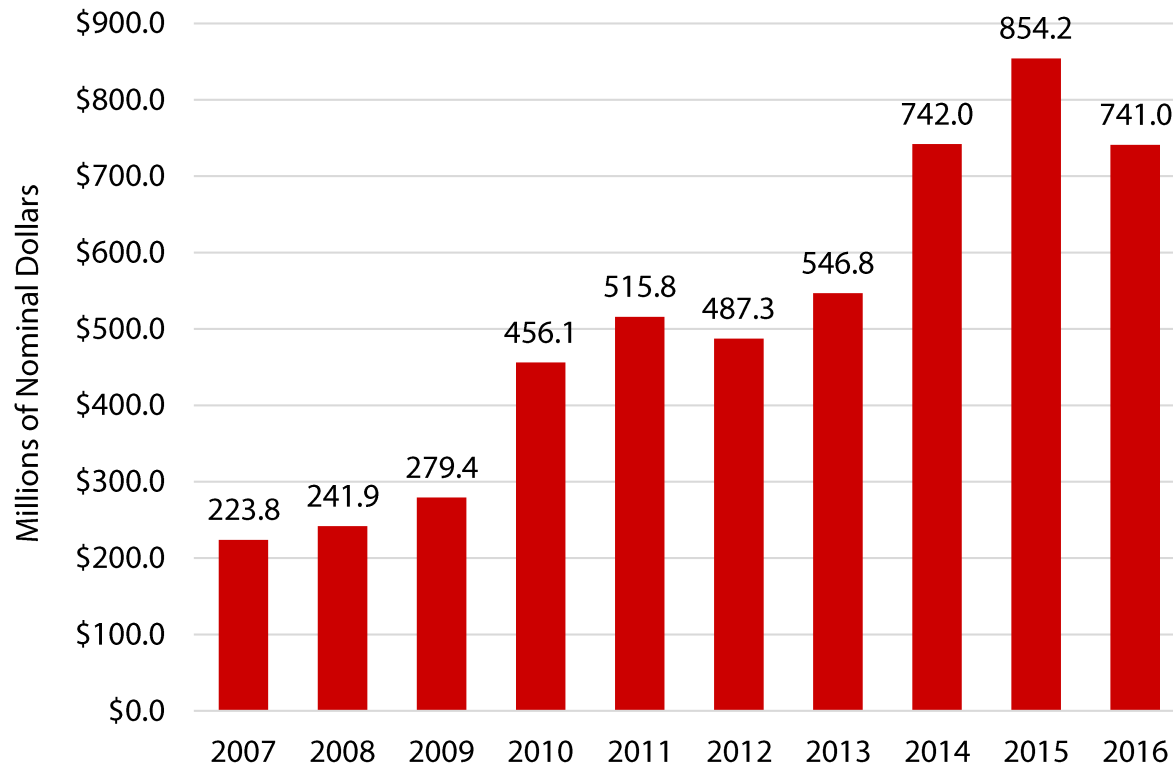

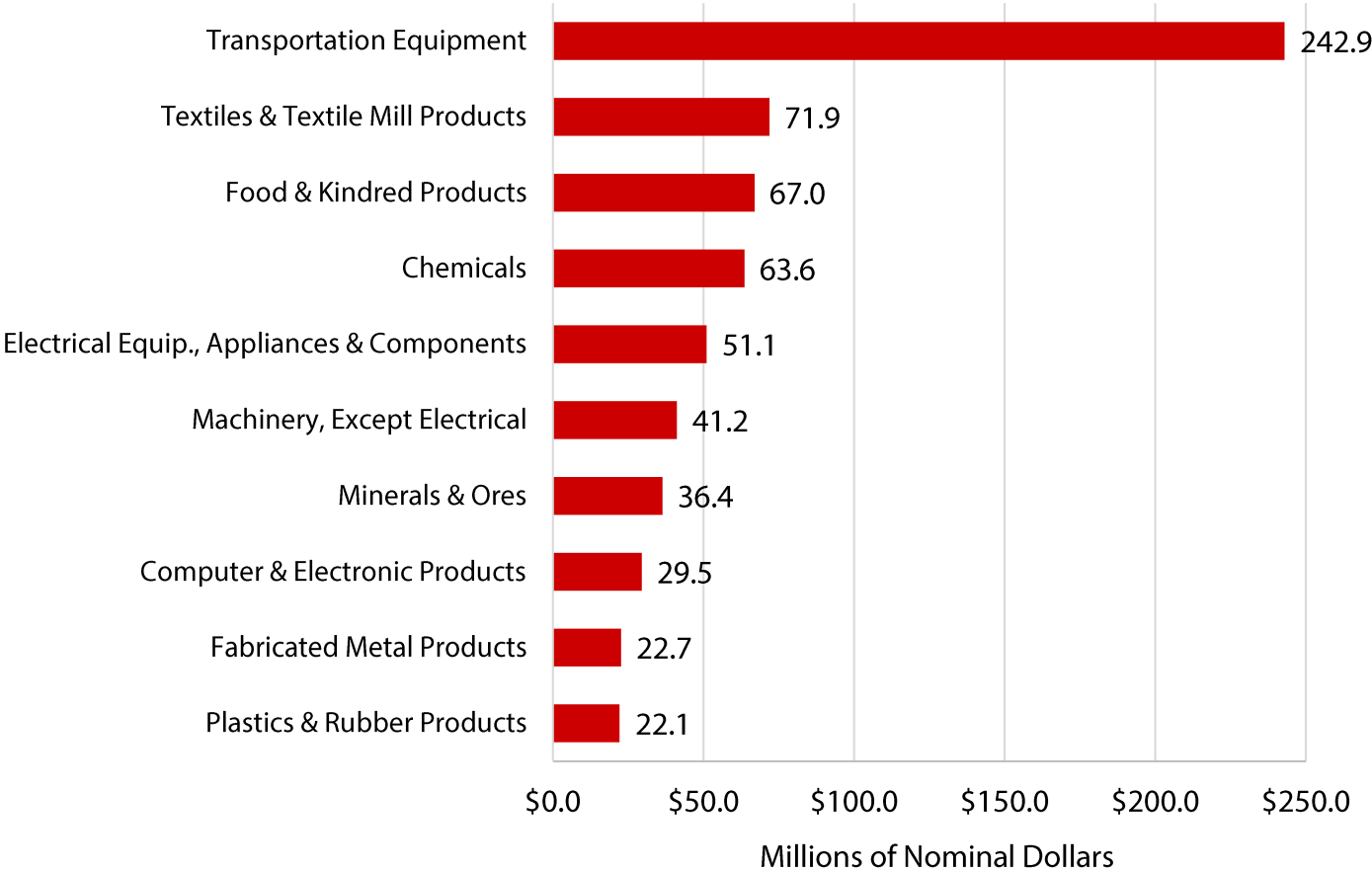

Utah's Total Commodity Exports to Mexico



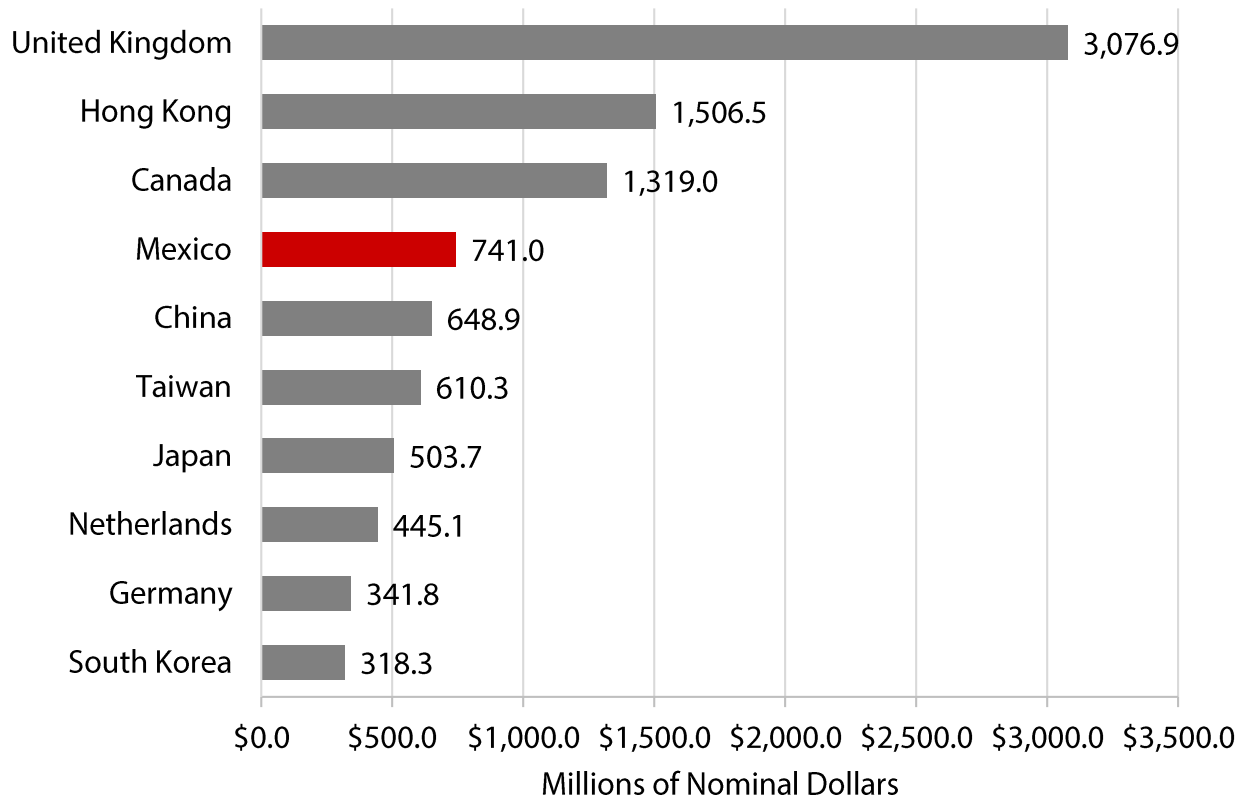

Utah's Top Ten Commodity Exports to Mexico, 2016



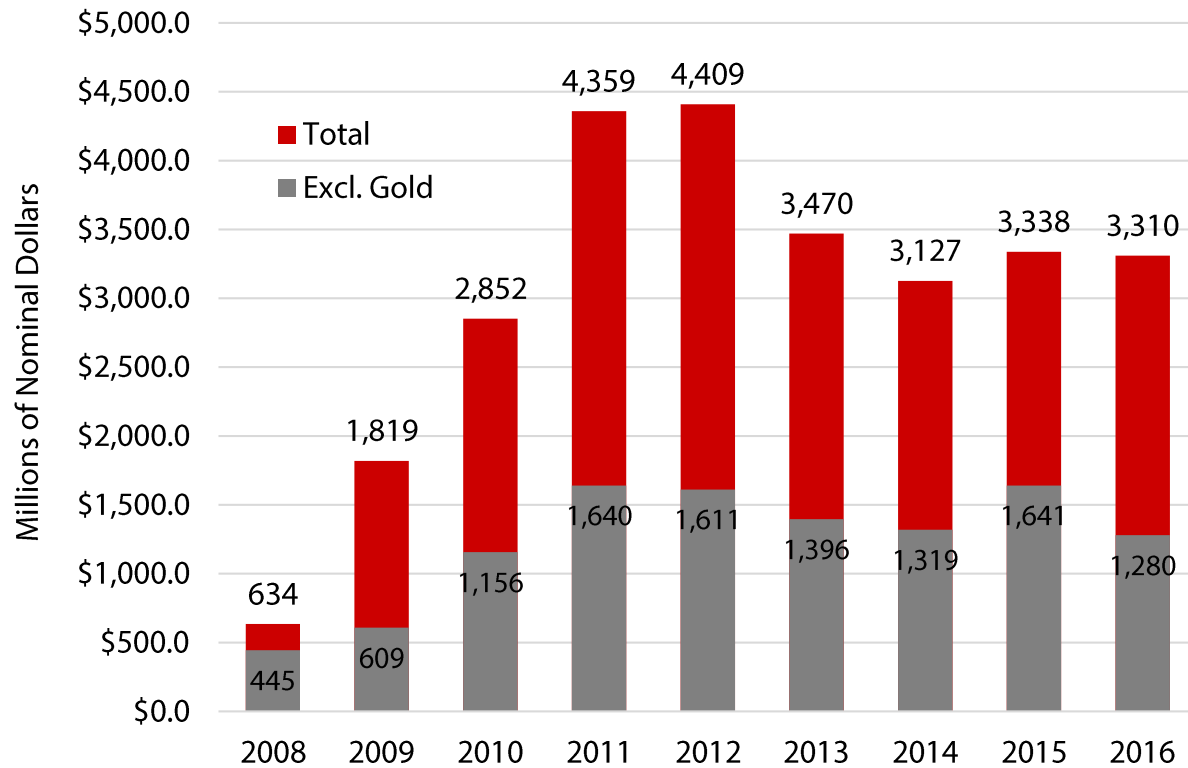

Utah Commodity Exports to Top Ten Purchasing Countries, 2016



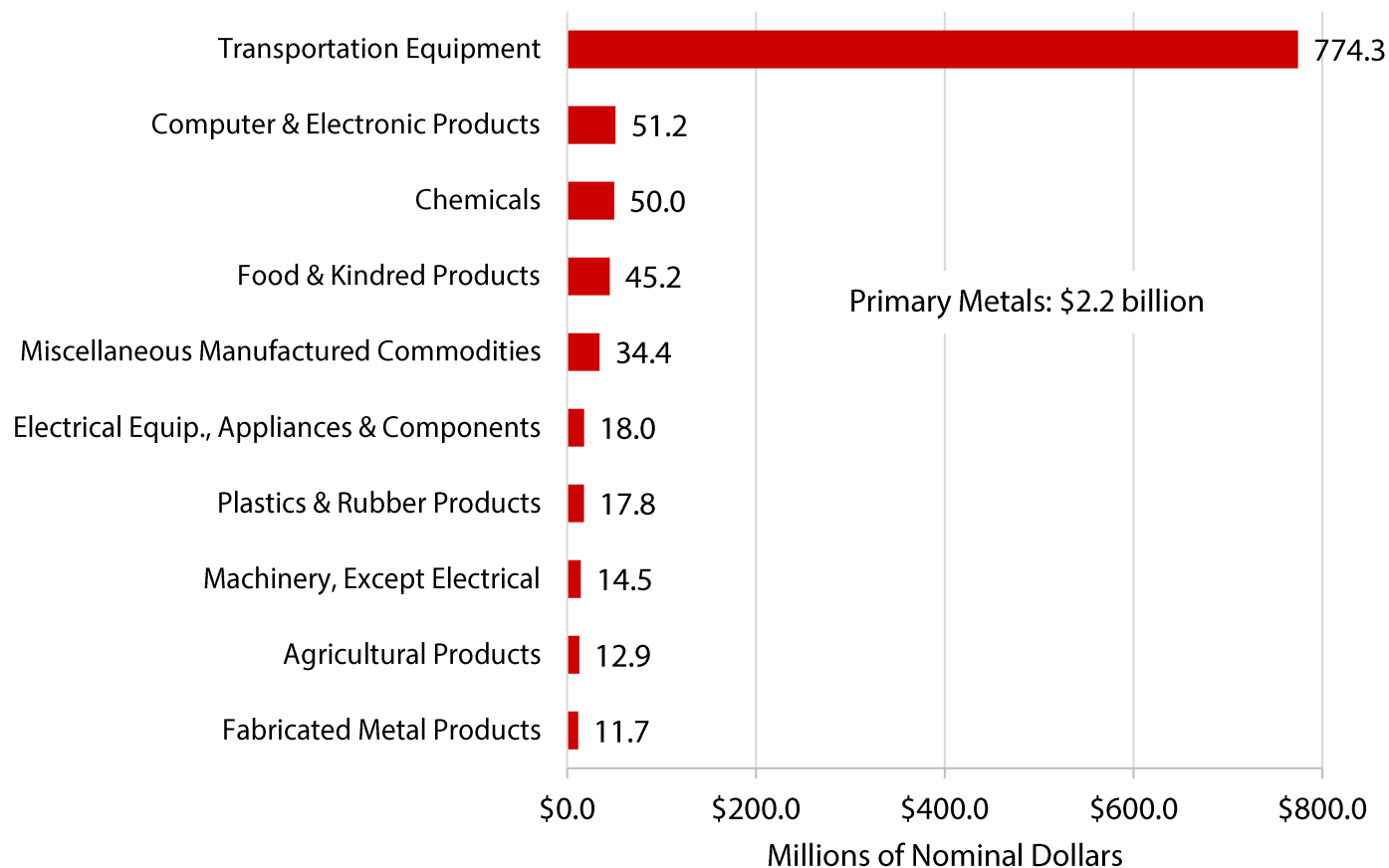
