

U.S. Census Bureau 2016 Population Estimates: Utah

The Population Division of the U.S. Census Bureau produces annual population estimates for every state, county, and incorporated place. Each release includes revisions and updates to the entire time series from April 1, 2010 to the current year. The May 2017 release for incorporated places is vintage 2016.

This fact sheet provides a summary of the state, county, and place level population estimates for Utah. Rankings of size, percentage change, and absolute change are included. Data for all counties and all incorporated places (population 1,000 or more) appear at the end of the document.¹

State of Utah and National Comparisons

- From July 1, 2015 to July 1, 2016, Utah’s population grew from 2,990,632 to 3,051,217, an increase of 60,585 (2.0 percent). This made Utah the fastest growing state in the nation between 2015 and 2016.
- From the 2010 Census to July 1, 2016, Utah grew from 2,763,885 to 3,051,217, an increase of 287,332 (10.4 percent). This places Utah with the fourth fastest growth in the nation since the 2010 Census.

- 74 percent of the state’s population growth from 2015 to 2016 occurred in the four Wasatch Front counties: Utah County (17,503), Salt Lake County (16,732), Davis County (6,513), and Weber County (4,107). The statewide growth from the 2010 Census to 2016 was also concentrated in the Wasatch Front counties (76 percent).
- For cities with at least 50,000 people in 2016, the city of Lehi ranked 11th in the nation for fast-growing populations. The city experienced 4.6 percent growth from 2015 to 2016, adding 2,702 people for a total population of 61,130. Between 2015 and 2016 in cities with 1,000 people or more, Herriman saw the highest absolute growth (4,548) and Vineyard saw the highest percent growth (24.2 percent).
- Logan was one of five cities in the nation to cross the 50,000 population mark between 2015 and 2016. Logan’s population in 2016 was 50,676. The top 10 largest cities in the state remained the same between 2015 and 2016, with Salt Lake having the largest population at 193,744.
