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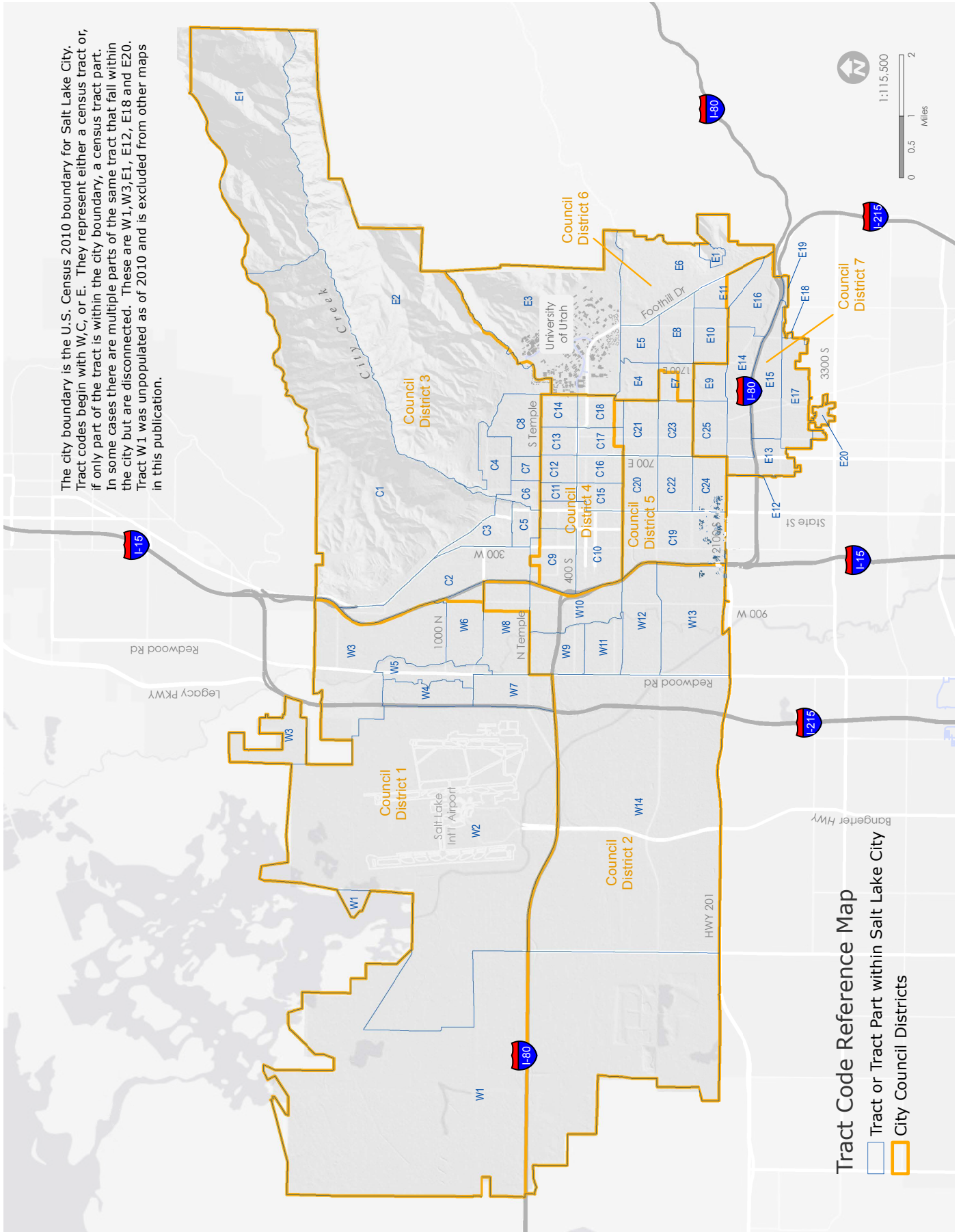
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The city boundary is the U.S. Census 2010 boundary for Salt Lake City. Tract codes begin with W,C, or E. They represent either a census tract or, if only part of the tract is within the city boundary, a census tract part. In some cases there are multiple parts of the same tract that fall within the city but are disconnected. These are W1,W3,E1, E12, E18 and E20. Tract W1 was unpopulated as of 2010 and is excluded from other maps in this publication.

INTRODUCTION

This *Salt Lake City Change Atlas: 2000–2010* has been sponsored by Salt Lake City Corporation. It presents ten-year changes in the basic demographic characteristics of the residents of Salt Lake City as recorded in the 2000 and 2010 decennial Censuses of Population and Housing. This is the third in a series of atlases prepared by the Bureau of Economic and Business Research which examine the spatial variation in demographic, household, housing unit, and group quarters population characteristics within Salt Lake City. The first in the series was based on the 2000 Census.¹ The second replicated these analyses utilizing results from the 2010 Census.² This volume presents the changes that have occurred from 2000 to 2010 for the same topic areas.

Salt Lake City has experienced significant demographic, economic, and cultural change, especially over the past 30 years. As dramatic as this transformation has been for the city as a whole, these citywide averages obscure the tremendous variation and diversity that exist at the neighborhood level.

There is no single Salt Lake City—there is a tapestry of many communities with a wide range of characteristics. The Salt Lake City School District reports over 100 languages spoken in the homes of its students. This depth and breadth of cultural, linguistic, ethnic, and intellectual diversity are unprecedented in Utah. This “Crossroads of the West” is emerging as a global city.³

Following the structure of the two previous atlases, content is organized by topic: total population, age structure, racial and ethnic composition, household types, group quarters populations, and housing unit counts and tenure. The analyses presented here include only the parts of census tracts that are contained within Salt Lake City. Data for these partial tracts appear in the data tables and maps. Some of these partial tracts have either no population or minimal population and have therefore been excluded from discussion in the text.⁴ The rest of the partial tracts do have sufficient population counts to merit inclusion in the textual discussion.⁵

Boundaries of census tracts and council districts are generally redrawn after each enumeration. In order to compare results of the 2000 and 2010 enumerations, all data have been translated to the 2010 census tract and 2010 council district geographies. Only the portions of census tracts that are within the Salt Lake City boundary are included. The summary files from Census 2000 and 2010 were used to generate all of the change products in this document. The comparability of data between different years (e.g. Census 2000 and Census 2010) is not always straightforward since the data is aggregated to geographical areas that may change over time. The changes in data values, absolute and percentage, between the Census 2000 and Census 2010 that are reported in this document are based on a normalization of Census 2000 geographical areas to Census 2010 geographical areas. This normalization allows the data to be tabulated for different geographical areas. The normalization procedure used here involves grouping Census 2000 blocks to build areas that have external boundaries that approximate the various Census 2010 geographical areas such as Census 2010 places, council districts and tracts. The data for the Census 2000 blocks is then aggregated to generate Census 2000 data for geographies approximating the Census 2010 geographies. Because Salt Lake City is densely populated, Census 2000 blocks in Salt Lake City tend to be small in area. For this reason, the approximations built out of these blocks ranged from very good to excellent for geographical units in Salt Lake City. Note that the absolute and percentage changes calculated in the tables are based on non-rounded numbers for 2000 and 2010. Thus, any discrepancies in the absolute and percentage changes arising from using the rounded 2000 and 2010 numbers presented in the tables can be attributed to rounding error.

POPULATION

2.1 Population by Age

This section presents graphic (Figures 1 through 9) and tabular data (Tables 1 through 18) for changes in the total population, selected age group populations, and dependency ratios. These 2000 to 2010 changes are presented for census tracts and city council districts in Salt Lake City using data from the 2000 and 2010 decennial census enumerations.

The resident population of Salt Lake City was 181,775 in 2000 and 186,440 in 2010. This is a population increase of 4,665 or 2.6 percent. Most of this is accounted for in Council District 1 (1,906 increase), Council District 2 (1,734 increase), and Council District 4 (1,481 increase). Council Districts 5 and 6 had small increases (364 and 328, respectively). Population declined in Council Districts 7 (loss of 187) and Council District 3 (loss of 961). Census tracts with the largest increases in population from 2000 to 2010 were Census Tract 1025 of District 4 (1,880 increase), Census Tract 1029 of Council District 5 (1,217 increase), Census Tract 1147 (part) of Council District 1 (885 increase), and Census Tract 1003.07 also of District 1 (878 increase). Population declines were more geographically dispersed across the city.

The number of preschool-age persons (younger than 5 years old) was nearly unchanged between 2000 and 2010, increasing by only 48 persons. The preschool age population increased most significantly in Council District 2 (increase of 232) and decreased the most in Council District 3 (declining by 197) and Council District 4 (declining by 140). Tracts with the largest increases were Tract 1027.02 in Council District 2 (increase of 157), Tract 1147 (part) in Council District 1 (increase of 109), and Tract 1027.01 of Council District 2 (increase of 109). Census Tract 1003.08 of Council District 1 had the largest decline of this population (loss of 131).

The school-age population (ages 5–17) of Salt Lake City declined from 28,546 to 27,551 from 2000 to 2010, a decline of 995 persons. Only Districts 1 and 2 had increasing school-age populations, with increases of 718 and 342, respectively. Tracts with the largest increases were Tract 1003.07 in Council District 1 (increase of 312), Tract 1147 (part) in Council District 1 (increase of 263), and Tract 1027.02 of Council District 2 (increase of 231). The largest declines were in Tract 1020 of Council District 4 (decline of 195) and Tract 1007 of Council District 3 (decline of 155).

The college-age population, defined as persons 18 through 24 years of age, declined in Salt Lake City from 2000 to 2010 by 1,588. This population was 27,675 in 2000 and 26,087 in 2010. Only Council District 6 had an increase in this population (177) while Council District 3 had the largest decline (439). Tracts with the largest increase in this population are Tract 1014 of Council District 6 (increase 411) and Tract 1025 of Council District 4 (increase of 291). Tracts with the largest declines were Tract 1005 in Council District 1 (loss of 265) and Tract 1011.02 of Council District 3 (loss of 235).

The population of working-age persons, defined as the population 18 through 64 years of age, increased by 8,021 persons (or 6.7 percent) from 2000 to 2010 in Salt Lake City. This population increased from 118,869 to 126,890 over this period. The working-age population increased the most in Council District 4 (increase of 2,164), followed by Council District 2 (increase of 1,489). The only district that experienced a decline of working-age persons was Council District 3 (decline of 260). Two census tracts with the greatest increases in this population were Census Tract 1025 in Council District 4 (increase of 1,639) and Census Tract 1029 in Council District 5 (increase of 1,102). Tracts with the largest numeric declines in the working-age population are Tract 1011.02 of Council District 3 (decrease of 215), Tract 1005 of Council District 1 (decrease of 172), and Tract 1020 of Council District 4 (decrease of 169).

The Salt Lake City retirement-age population declined by 2,409 or 12.1 percent from 2000 to 2010, falling from 19,925 to 17,516. While all council districts had declines in this population, the largest numeric declines were in Council District 7 (decline of 874) and Council District 5 (decline of 651). Tracts with the largest numeric declines were Tract

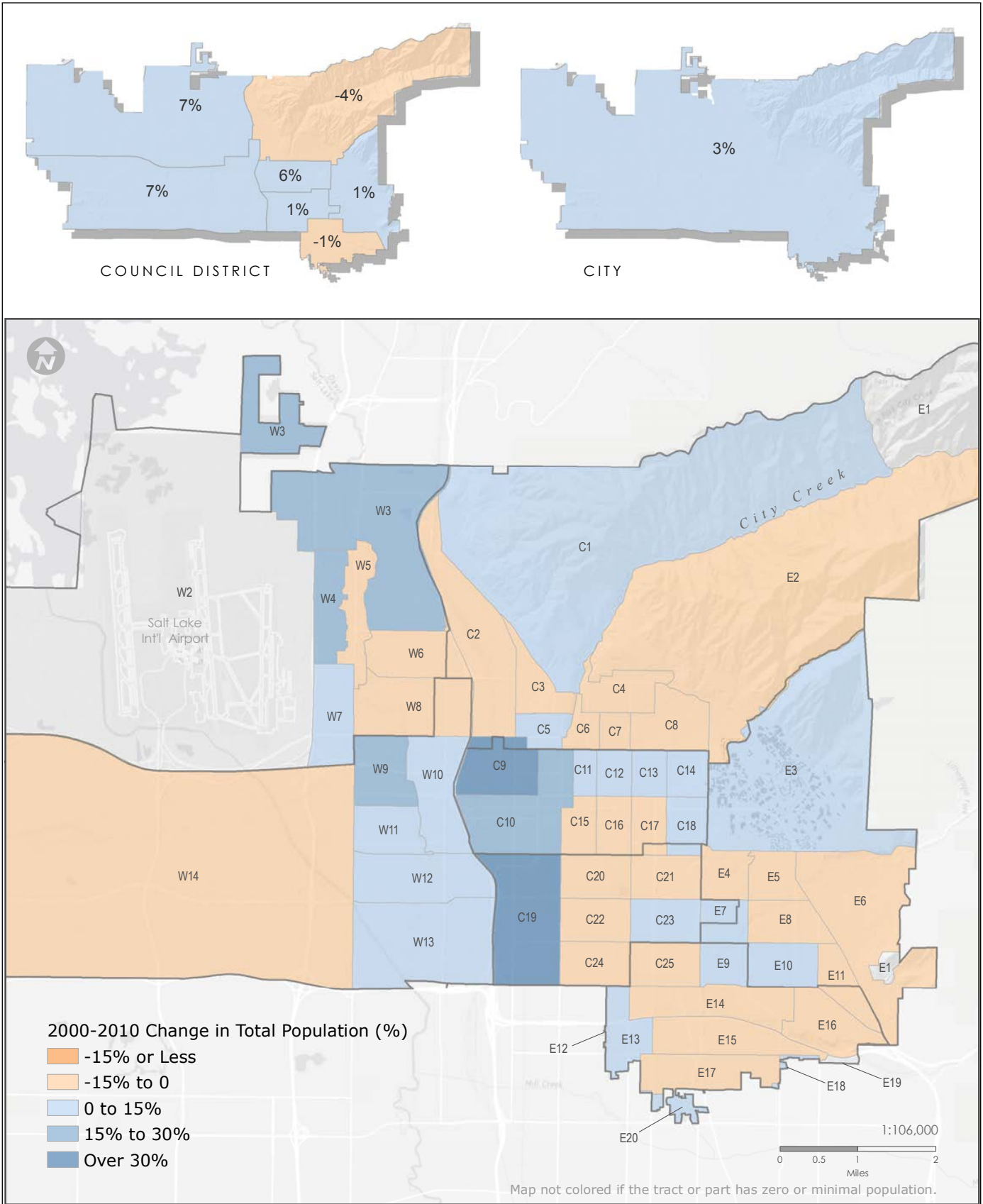
1032 of Council District 5 (decline of 270) and Tract 1048 of Council District 7 (decline of 270). Of the few tracts experiencing increases in the retirement-age population in Salt Lake City, the greatest increases were in Tract 1148 of Council District 3 (increase of 130) and Tract 1019 of Council District 4 (increase of 102).

The youth dependency ratio is the ratio of the number of persons under the age of 18 per 100 working-age persons, defined as the population 18 through 64 years of age. Because the Salt Lake City working-age population increased and the youth population declined from 2000 to 2010, the youth dependency ratio declined from 36.2 youth per 100 working-age persons to 33.1 youth per 100 working-age persons. Thus the youth dependency ratio fell by 3 for Salt Lake City. Only Council District 1 had an increase in this measure (an increase of 0.3, rising from 55.4 to 55.7 youth per 100 working-age persons). All other council districts experienced declines in the youth dependency ratio, with the largest decline in Council District 4, where the youth dependency ratio fell from 18.9 to 13.8, a decrease of 5.1. Tract 1027.02 in Council District 2 had the largest increase, with the ratio increasing from 53.9 to 65.8 (increase of 11.9). Tract 1020 in Council District 4 had the largest decline in the youth dependency ratio, as it fell by 10.9, from 33.8 in 2000 to 22.9 in 2010.

The retirement-age dependency ratio is the number of persons 65 years and older per 100 working-age persons (ages 18 through 64). The retirement-age dependency ratio for Salt Lake City fell from 16.8 in 2000 to 13.8 in 2010, a decline of 3.0. Only Council District 3 experienced a slight increase in the ratio, as it went from 17.0 in 2000 to 17.2 in 2010. For all other council districts, the retirement-age dependency ratio declined from 2000 to 2010. The most dramatic declines were experienced in Council District 7, where the ratio fell from 20.6 to 14.7 (decline of 5.9) and Council District 5, where the ratio fell from 15.0 to 10.4 (decline of 4.6). The only census tract that experienced a significant increase in the retirement-age dependency ratio is Census Tract 1148 of Council District 3, where the ratio increased from 23.0 to 30.7 (increase of 7.7). Largest declines in retirement-age dependency ratios occurred in Census Tract 1118.02 (part) of Council District 7, where the ratio declined from 69.8 to 41.1 (a decline of 28.7) and Census Tract 1147 (part) of Council District 1, where the ratio declined from 32.9 to 19.1 (decline of 13.8).

The total dependency ratio is the sum of the youth and retirement-age ratios. It is the sum of the number of people less than 18 years old plus the number of people 65 years and older per 100 persons ages 18 through 64. Salt Lake City's populations of youth and retirement-age persons declined from 2000 to 2010 while the working-age population increased. The total dependency ratio decreased from 52.9 to 46.9 (decline of 6.0) over this period. This ratio declined for all council districts, with largest decreases in Council District 7, where the ratio fell from 53.8 to 44.6 (decline of 9.2) and Council District 5, where the ratio fell from 47.2 to 38.5 (decline of 8.7). Very few census tracts had increasing total dependency ratios from 2000 to 2010 in Salt Lake City. Tracts with the largest increases were Census Tract 1027.02 of Council District 2, where the ratio increased from 65.1 to 74.2 (increase of 9.1) and Census Tract 1003.06 of Council District 1, where the ratio increased from 54.1 to 60.5 (increase of 6.4). The largest declines in the total dependency ratio were in Census Tract 1118.02 (part) of Council District 7, where the ratio declined from 98.1 to 68.6 (decline of 29.5), Census Tract 1141 of Council District 7, where the ratio declined from 59.1 to 42.5 (decline of 16.6), and Census Tract 1032 of Council District 5, where the ratio declined from 62.4 to 45.9 (decline of 16.5).

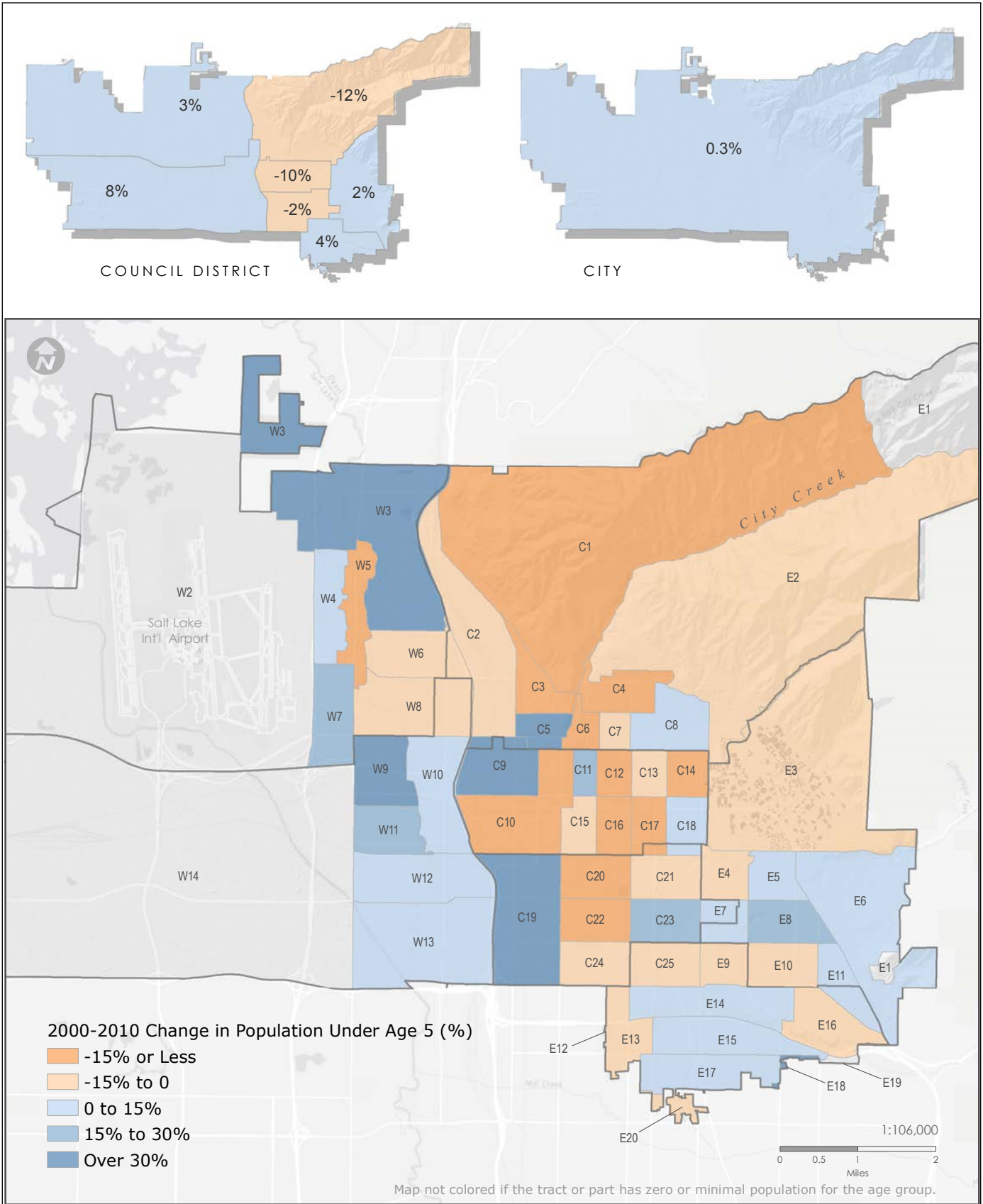

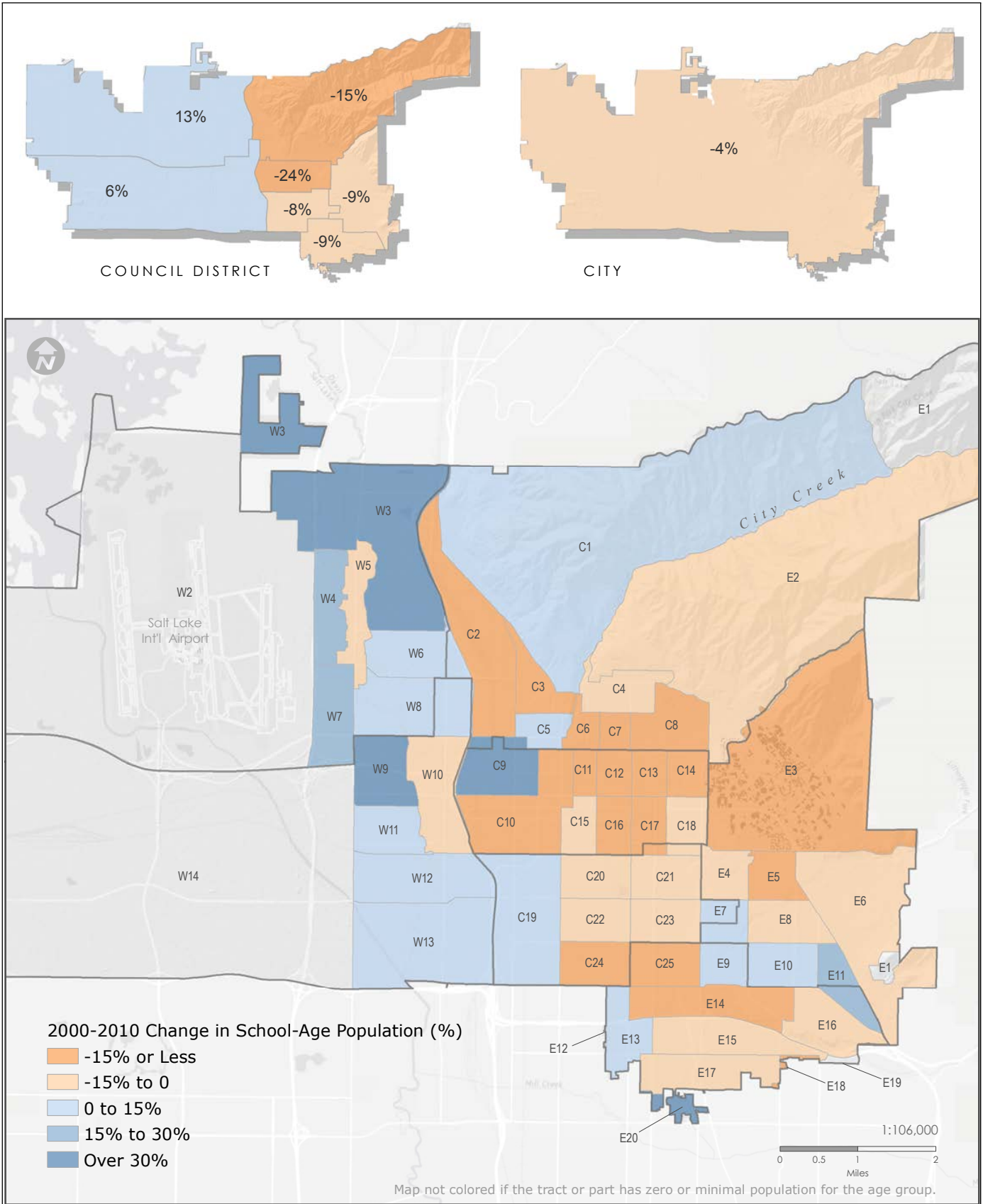

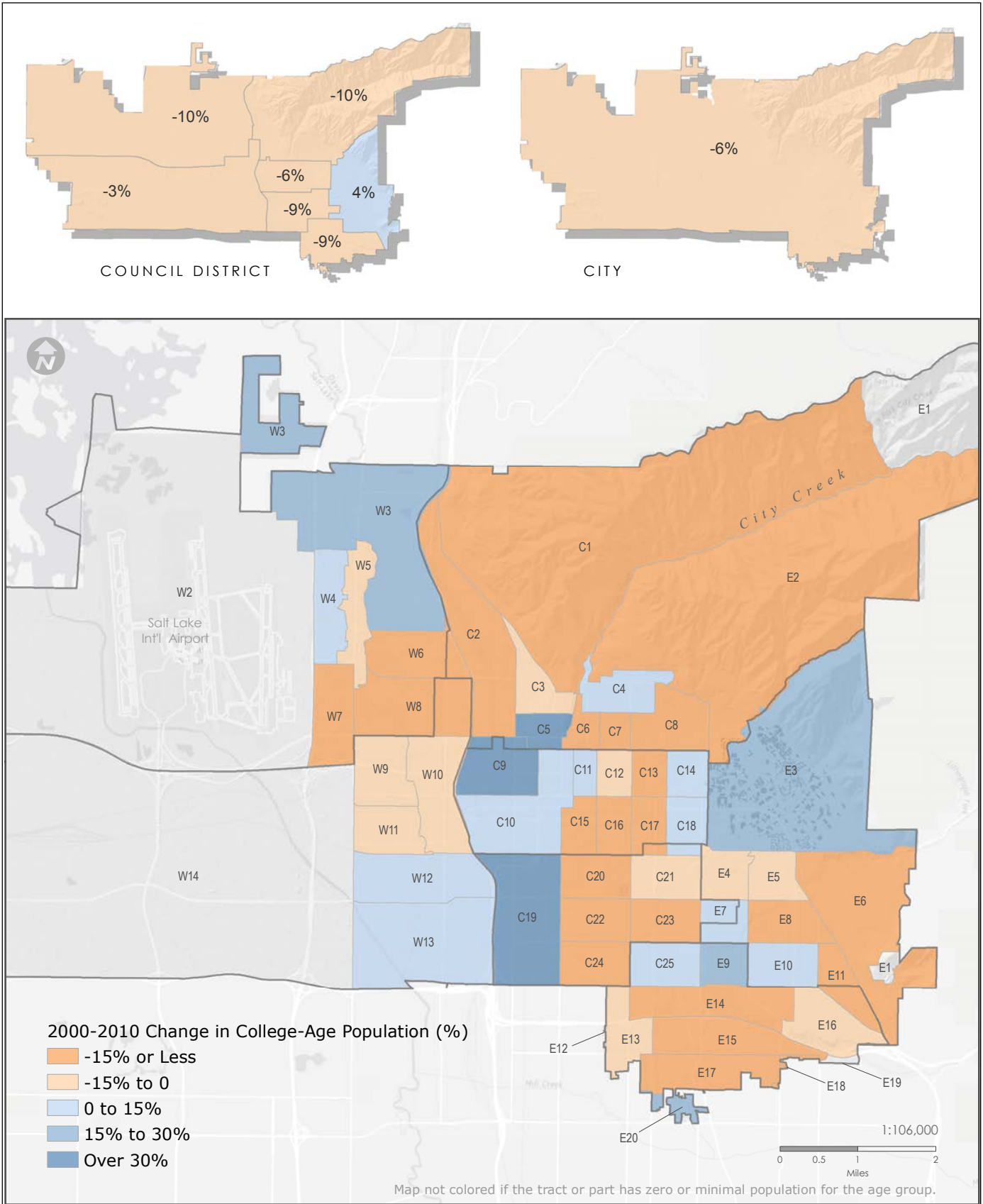

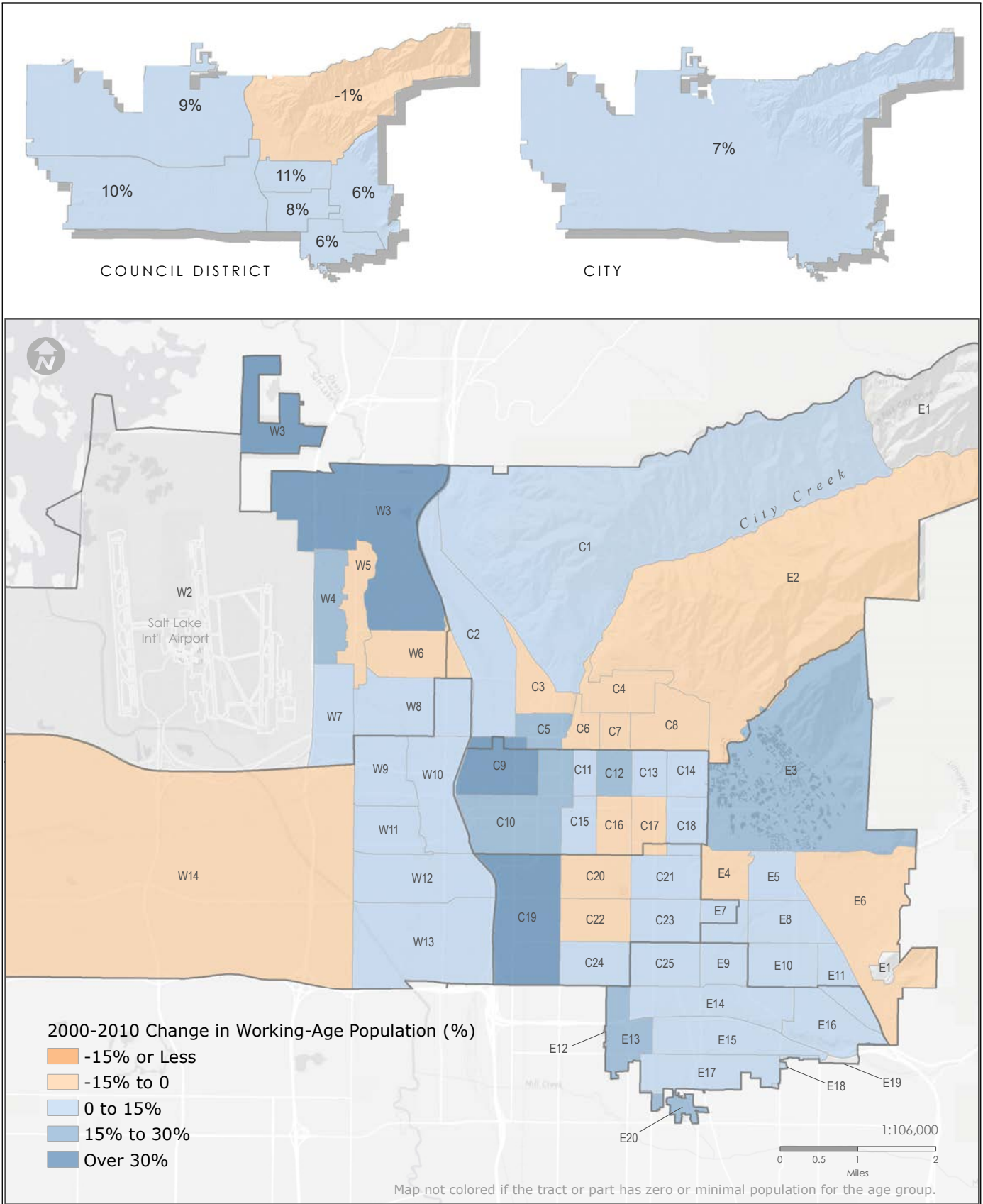

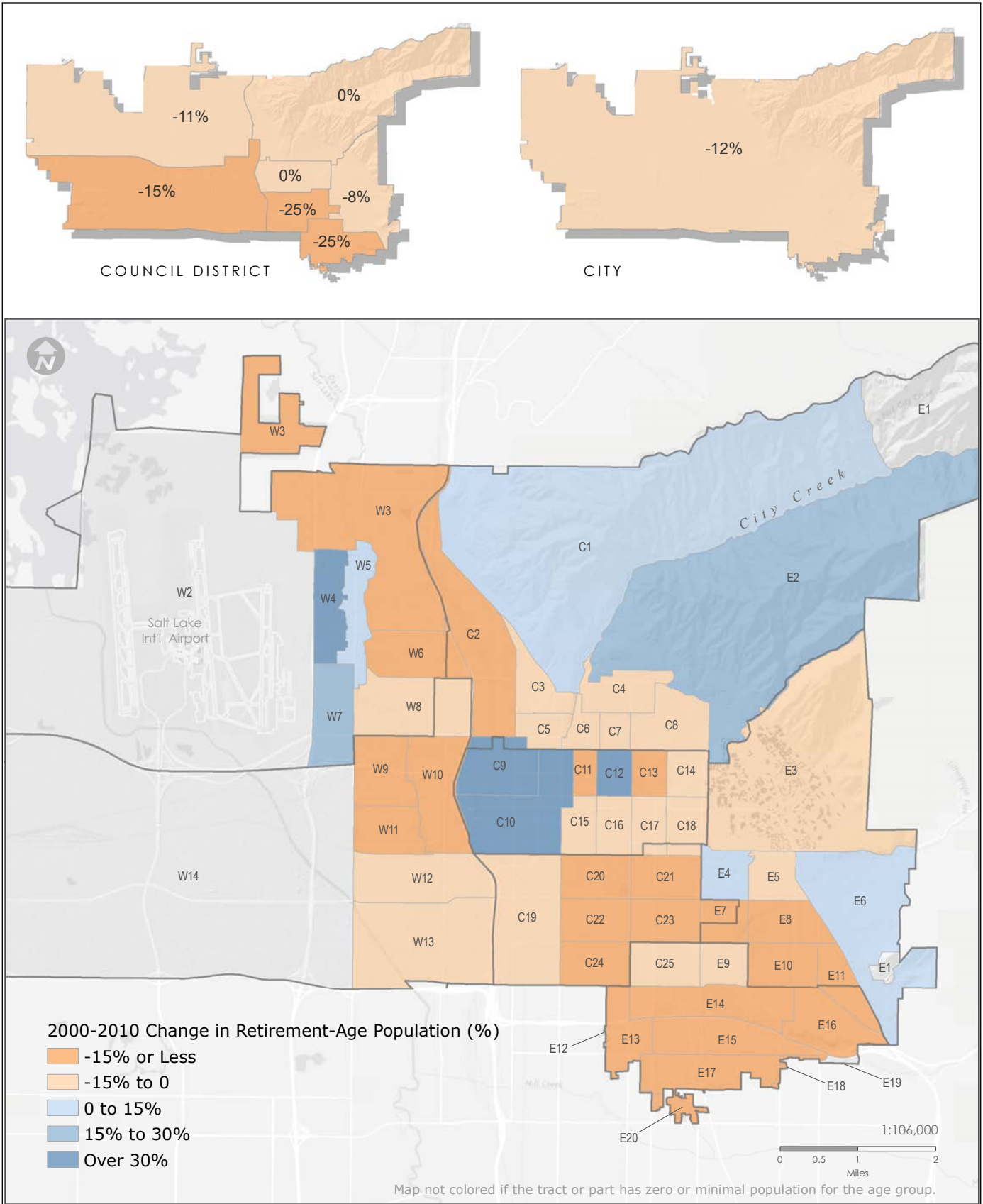

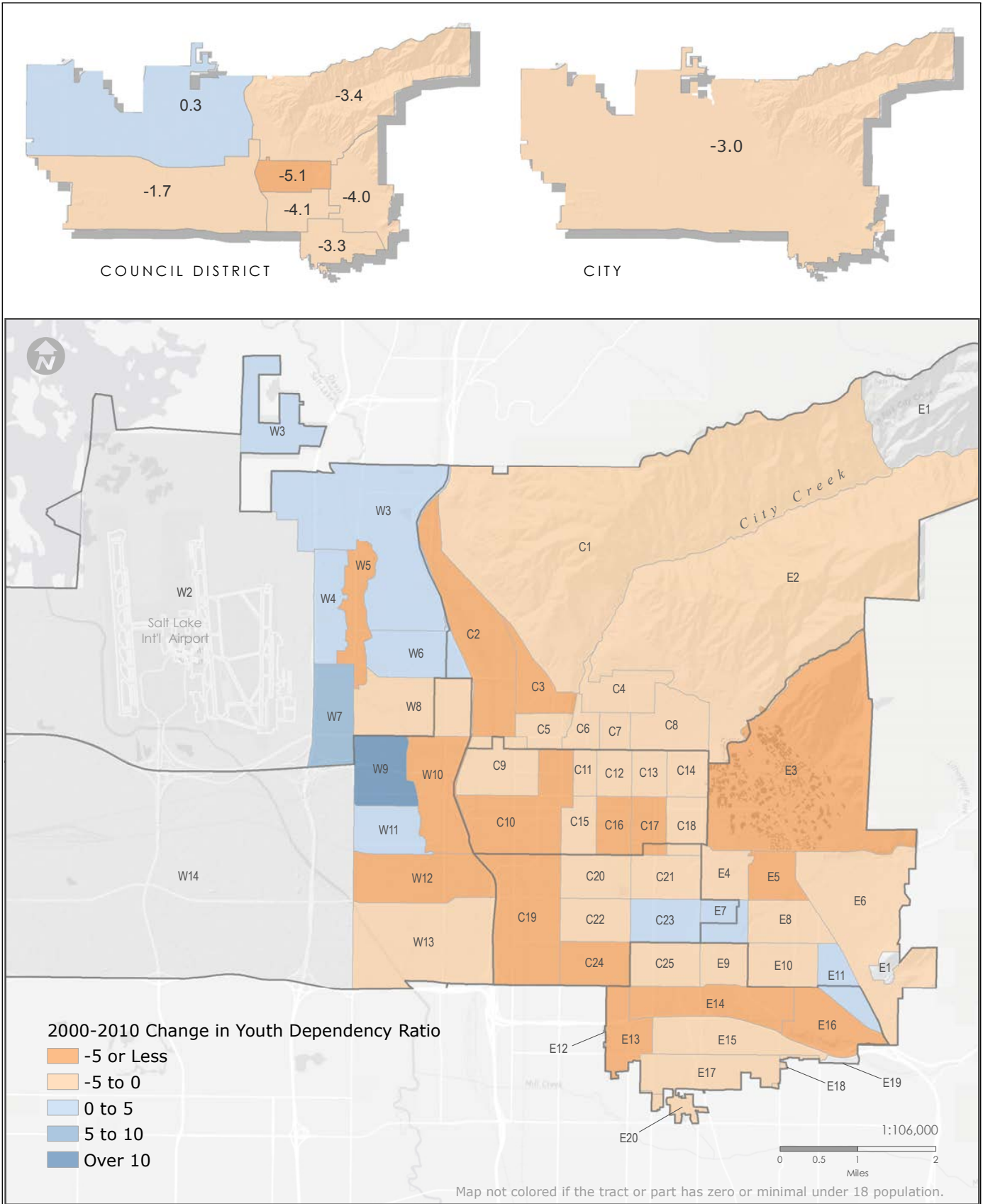

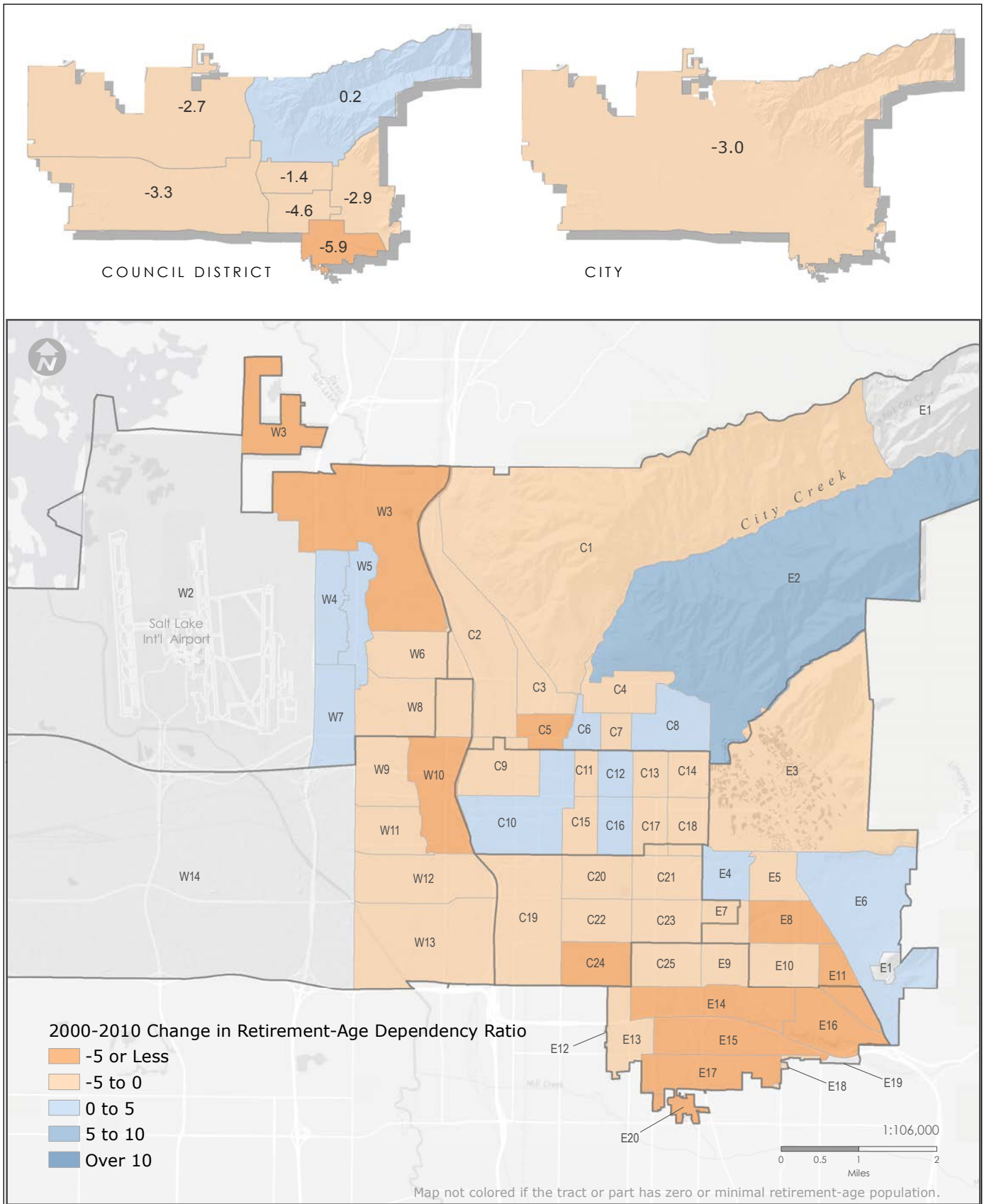

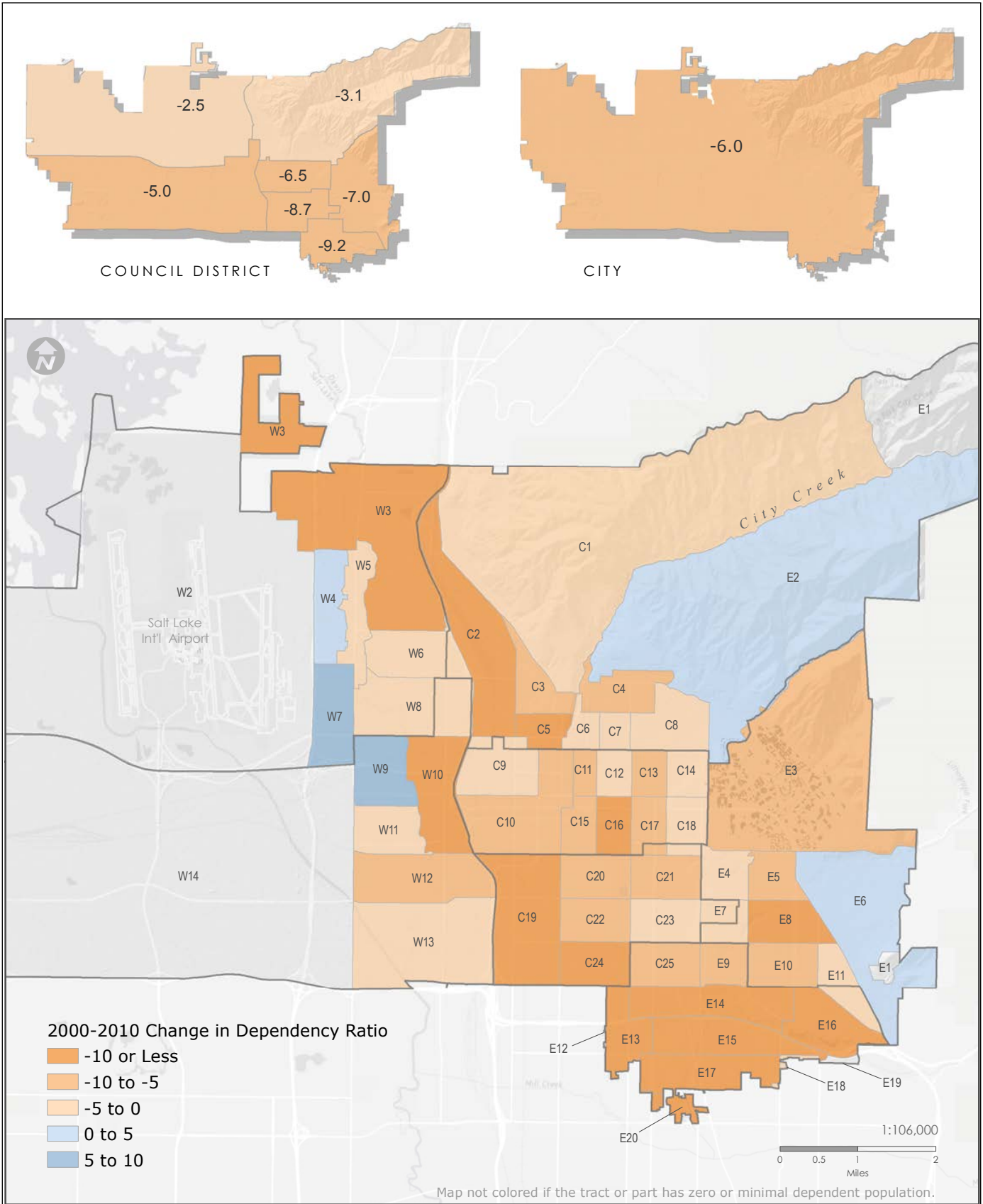

2.2 Population by Race/Ethnicity

This section presents graphic (Figures 10 through 17) and tabular data (Tables 19 through 34) for changes in the population by race, ethnicity, and minority status. Census 2010 race and ethnicity categories are the same as in 2000. Respondents selected from among five major race categories: White, Black or African American, American Indian and Alaska Native, Asian, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and Some Other Race. More than one race may be selected. The only officially recognized ethnicity is Hispanic or Latino, which may be of any race. For this volume, population is first classified into two groups: Hispanic or Latino and not Hispanic or Latino. Those who are not Hispanic or Latino are further classified into White alone, Black or African American alone, American Indian and Alaska Native alone, Asian alone, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander alone, and All Others (which includes Some Other Race alone and two or more races). The categories are mutually exclusive and exhaustive. According to this classification system, minorities are those who do not consider themselves non-Hispanic White alone. Alternatively, minorities are all persons who self-identify as Hispanic or Latino plus those non-Hispanics who are any race except White alone.

The non-Hispanic White population of Salt Lake City declined by 6,084 from 2000 to 2010, falling from 128,409 to 122,325. All council districts except Council District 4 (increase of 1,285) had declines in this population. Largest numeric declines in the non-Hispanic White population were in Council District 1 (decline of 2,342) and Council District 2 (decline of 1,718). Census Tracts 1003.08 and 1005, both located in Council District 1, had the largest declines among tracts, with losses of 682 and 646, respectively. Census Tract 1025 within Council District 4 had an increase of 1,218.

The non-Hispanic Black population of Salt Lake City increased from 3,108 in 2000 to 4,613 in 2010, an increase of 1,505. All council districts had increases in this population, the greatest being in Council District 3 (increase of 377) and Council District 5 (increase of 336). The largest tract-level increases were in Census Tract 1029 of Council District 5 (increase of 252) and Census Tract 1005 of Council District 1 (increase of 128). Very few tracts had small decreases in the non-Hispanic Black population.

The Salt Lake City population of non-Hispanic American Indian and Alaska Native persons declined from 1,966 in 2000 to 1,624 in 2010, a decrease of 342. This population decreased in all council districts, with Council District 2 experiencing the largest decline (loss of 116). Because of the small population counts at the census tract level, percentage changes vary widely. Tracts with the largest absolute numeric declines in the non-Hispanic American Indian and Alaska Native population are Census Tract 1032 of Council District 5 (decline of 51) and Census Tract 1028.02 (part) of Council District 2 (decline of 49). Census Tract 1025 of Council District 4 had the largest numeric increase among tracts (increase of 35).

The non-Hispanic Asian population increased by 1,653 persons, increasing from 6,498 to 8,151 in Salt Lake City from 2000 to 2010. Most of this increase is concentrated in Council District 6 (increase of 733) and Council District 4 (increase of 636). Census Tract 1014 (University of Utah) in Council District 6 has the highest non-Hispanic Asian population in the city and accounted for 461 of the increase. The tract with the largest decline in this population is Census Tract 1026 of Council District 2, with a decline of 142.

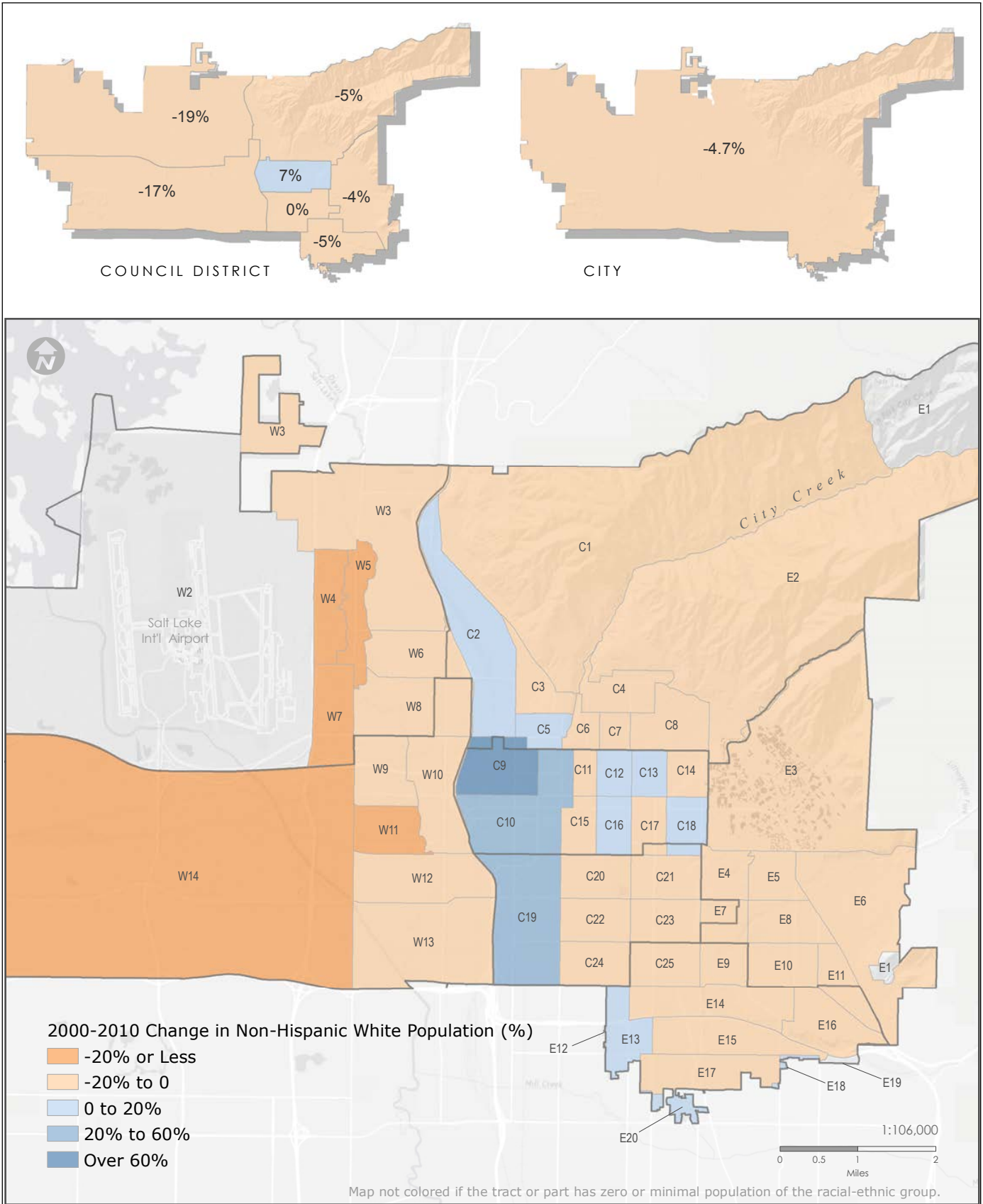
The non-Hispanic Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander population of Salt Lake City increased by 313 persons from 2000 to 2010, rising from 3,393 to 3,706. Council Districts 1 and 3 accounted for much of this change, with increases of 167 and 117 persons, respectively. Only Council District 5 had a decline of the non-Hispanic Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander population over this period (decrease of 46). Tracts with the greatest increases include Census Tract 1003.07 (increase of 131) and Census Tract 1147 (part) (increase of 97), both of which are part of Council District 1. The tracts with the greatest declines in this population are Census Tract 1026 (decline of 99) in Council District 2 and Census Tract 1003.06 (decline of 87) in Council District 1.

The population of persons who identify as non-Hispanic Some Other Race or Two or More Races rose in Salt Lake City by 237 persons, increasing from 4,147 in 2000 to 4,384 in 2010. This population declined in Council Districts 2 (decline of 233), 4 (decline of 80), 3 (decline of 9), and 1 (decline of 8). Council Districts 7, 6, and 5 had increases of the non-Hispanic Some Other Race or Two or More Races population of 239, 209, and 119, respectively. Tracts with the largest increases in this population are Census Tract 1025 in Council District 4 (increase of 81) and Census Tract 1033 in Council District 7 (increase of 80). Tracts with the greatest declines are Census Tract 1028.02 (part) in Council District 2 (decrease of 133) and Census Tract 1003.08 in Council District 1 (decrease of 90).

The Salt Lake City Hispanic population rose from 34,254 in 2000 to 41,637 in 2010, an increase of 7,383. Most of this increase occurred in Council Districts 1 (increase of 3,875) and 2 (increase of 3,787), with smaller increases in Council Districts 7 (increase of 386) and 6 (increase of 268). The Hispanic population declined by 486 in Council District 3, 431 in District 4, and 16 in Council District 5. Tracts with the largest increases in the Hispanic population are Census Tract 1003.07 in Council District 1 (increase of 1,138), Census Tract 1028.02 (part) in Council District 2 (increase of 980), and Census Tract 1028.01 in Council District 2 (increase of 976). Tracts with the largest declines are Census Tract 1020 in Council District 4 (decline of 469) and Census Tract 1007 in Council District 3 (decline of 290).

Salt Lake City's minority population increased by 10,749 from 2000 to 2010, rising from 53,366 in 2000 to 64,115 in 2010. Minority populations increased in all Council Districts, with the greatest increases in Council District 1 (increase of 4,248) and Council District 2 (increase of 3,452). Census tracts with the largest increases were Census Tract 1003.07 and 1147 (part), both in Council District 1, and Census Tracts 1028.02 (part) and 1028.01, both in Council District 2. These four tracts had increases in their minority populations of 1,361, 975, 943, and 895, respectively. Tracts with the largest declines in the minority population are Census Tract 1020 in Council District 4 (decline of 479) and Census Tract 1007 in Council District 3 (decline of 295).

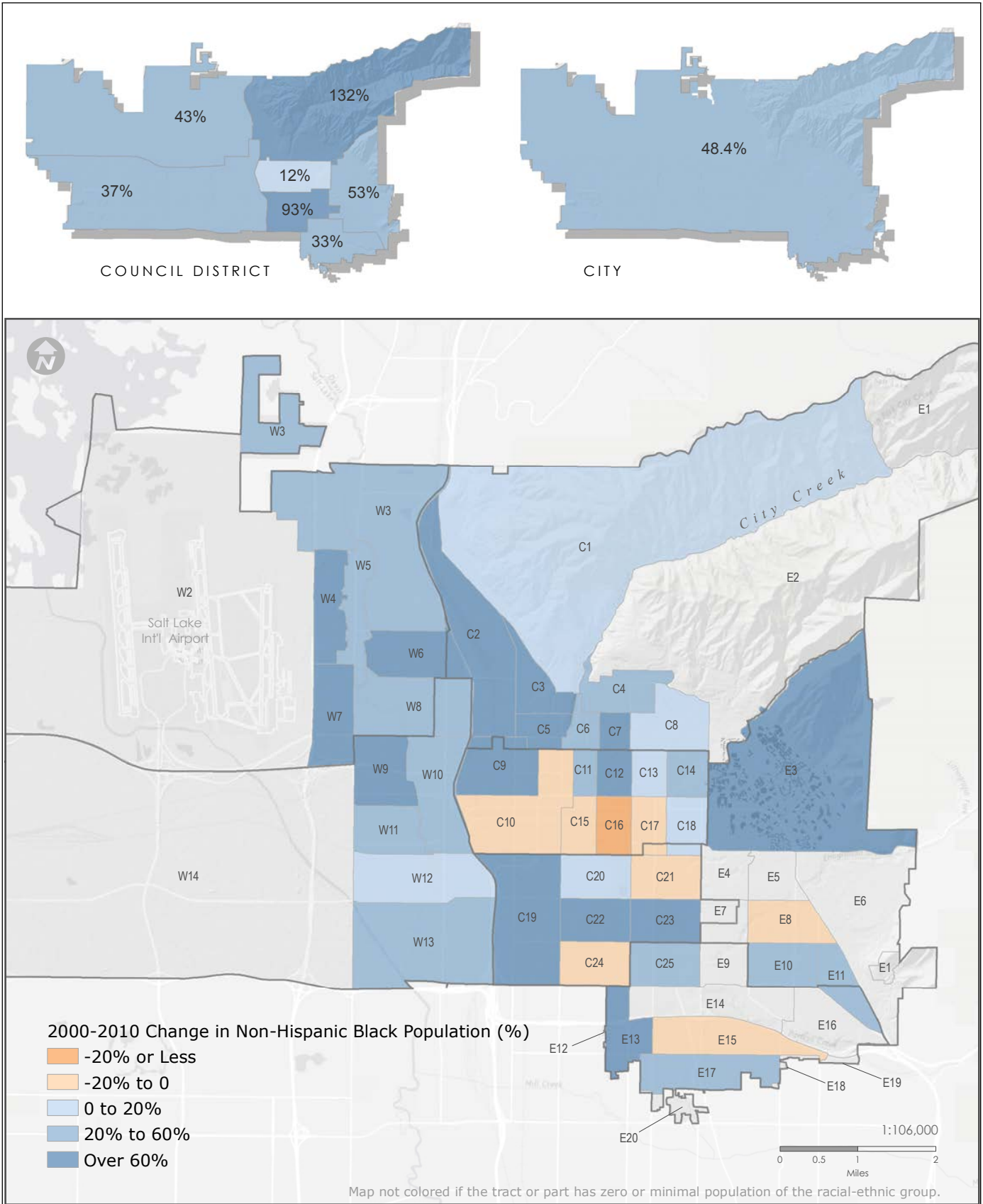

Figure 12: Non-Hispanic American Indian and Alaska Native Population in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

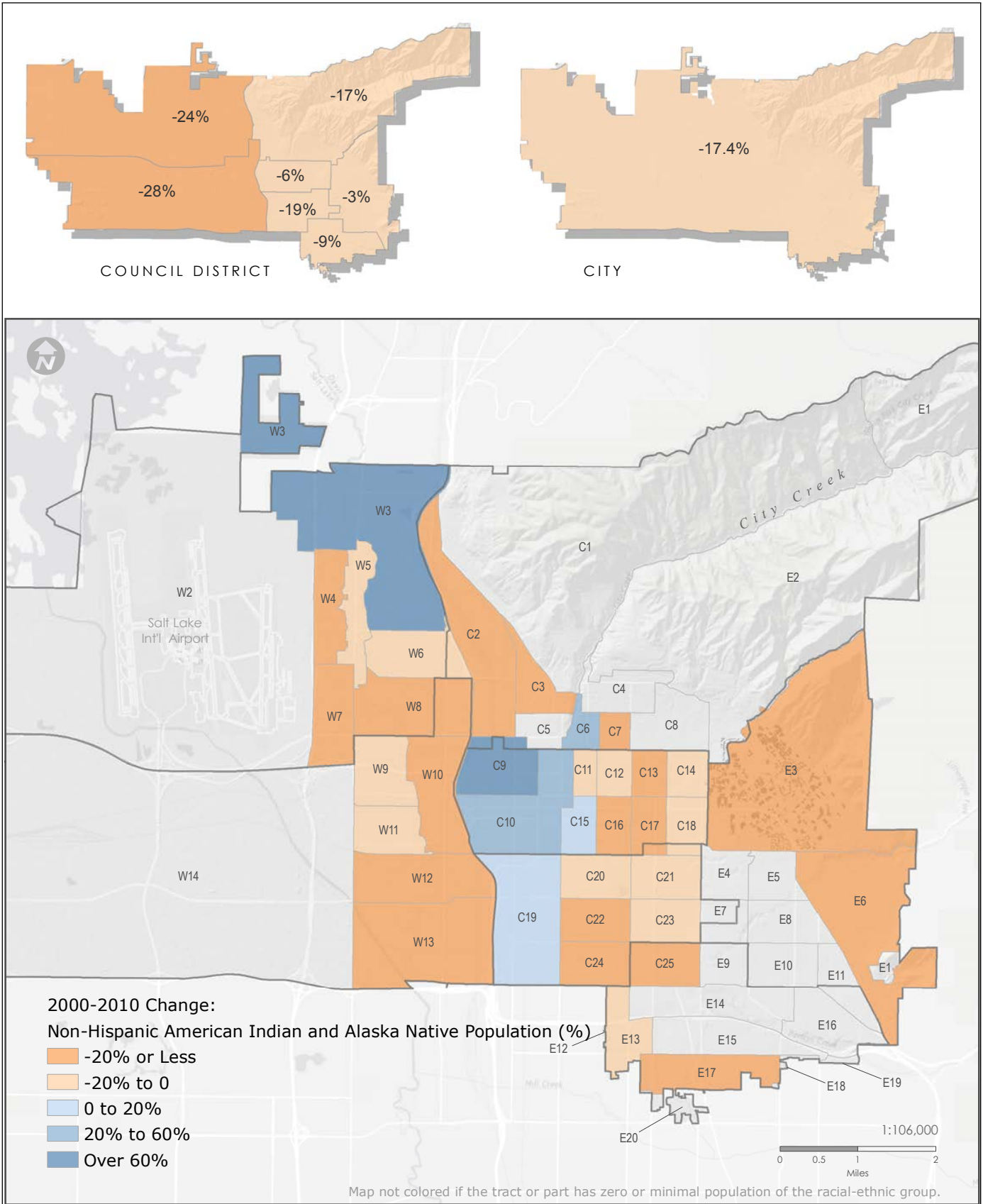

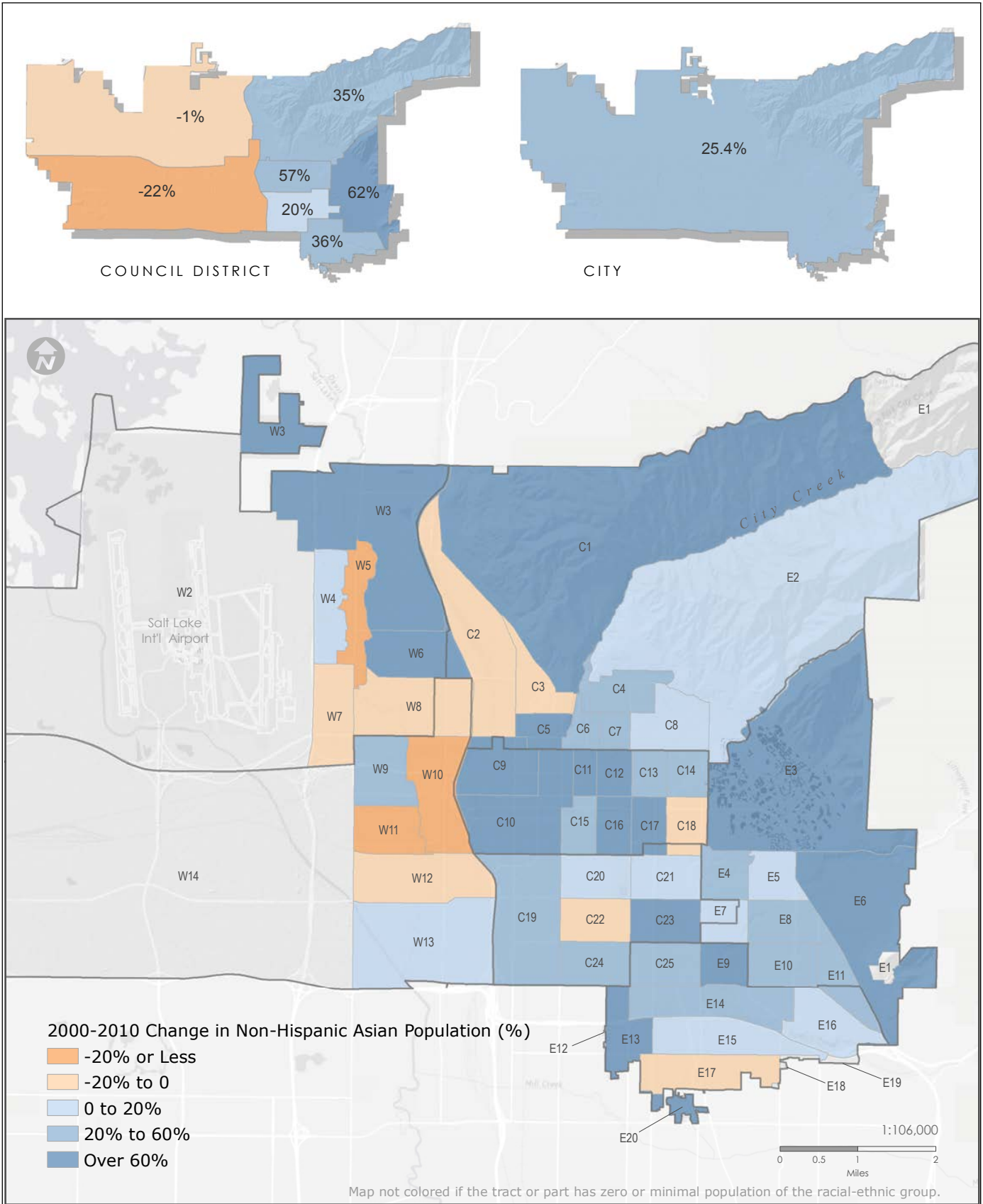

Figure 14: Non-Hispanic Native Hawaiian & Other Pacific Islander Population in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

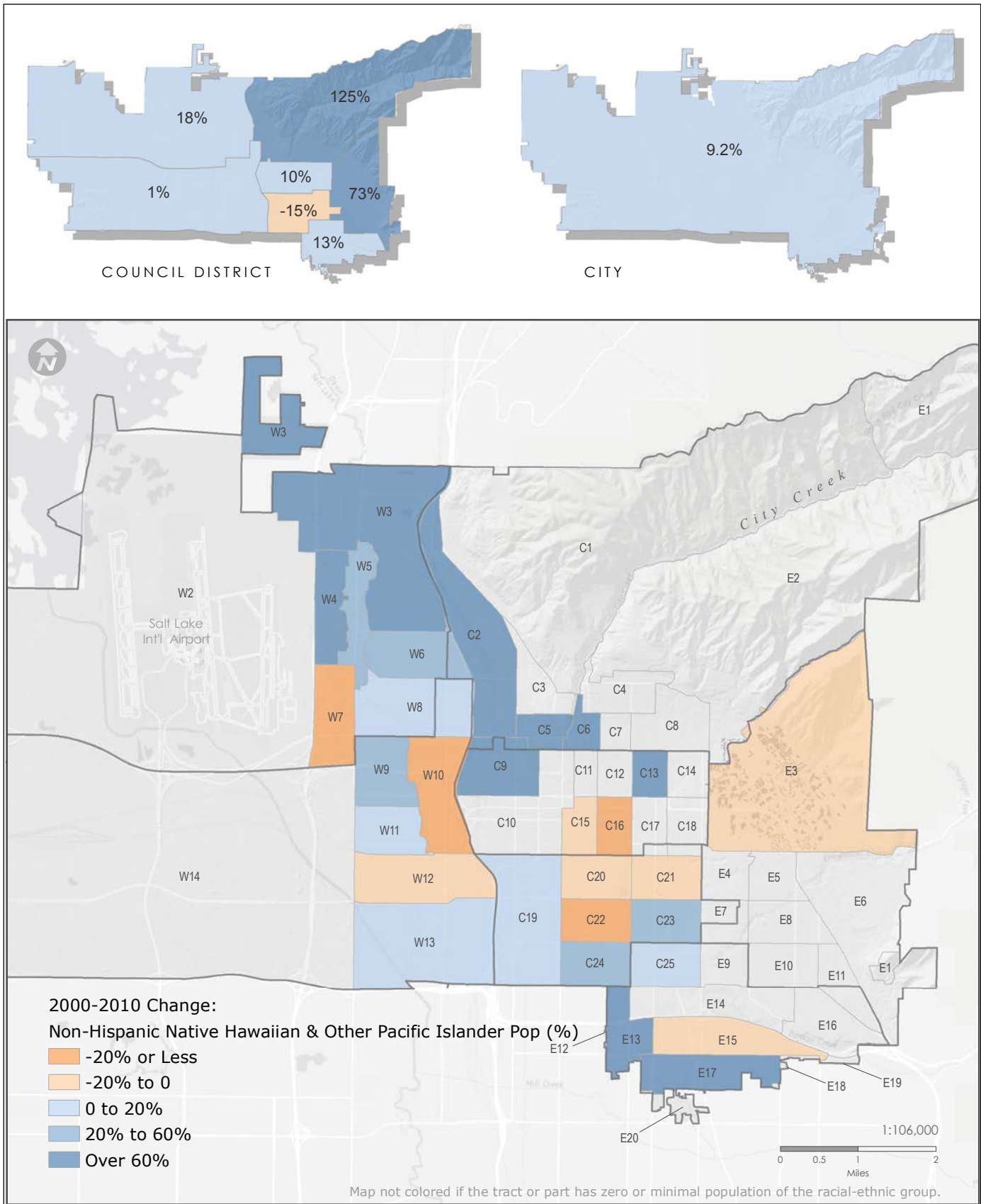

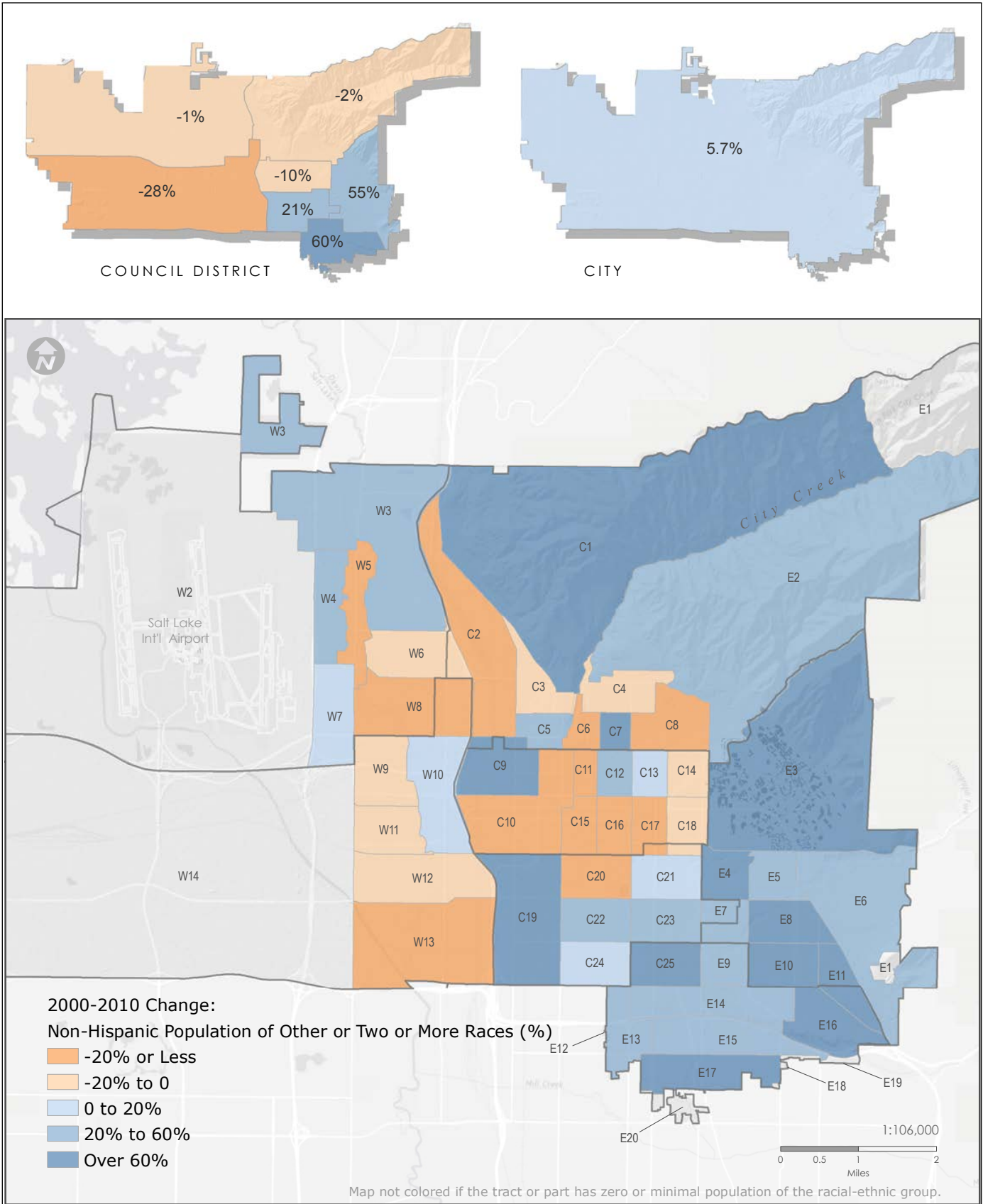

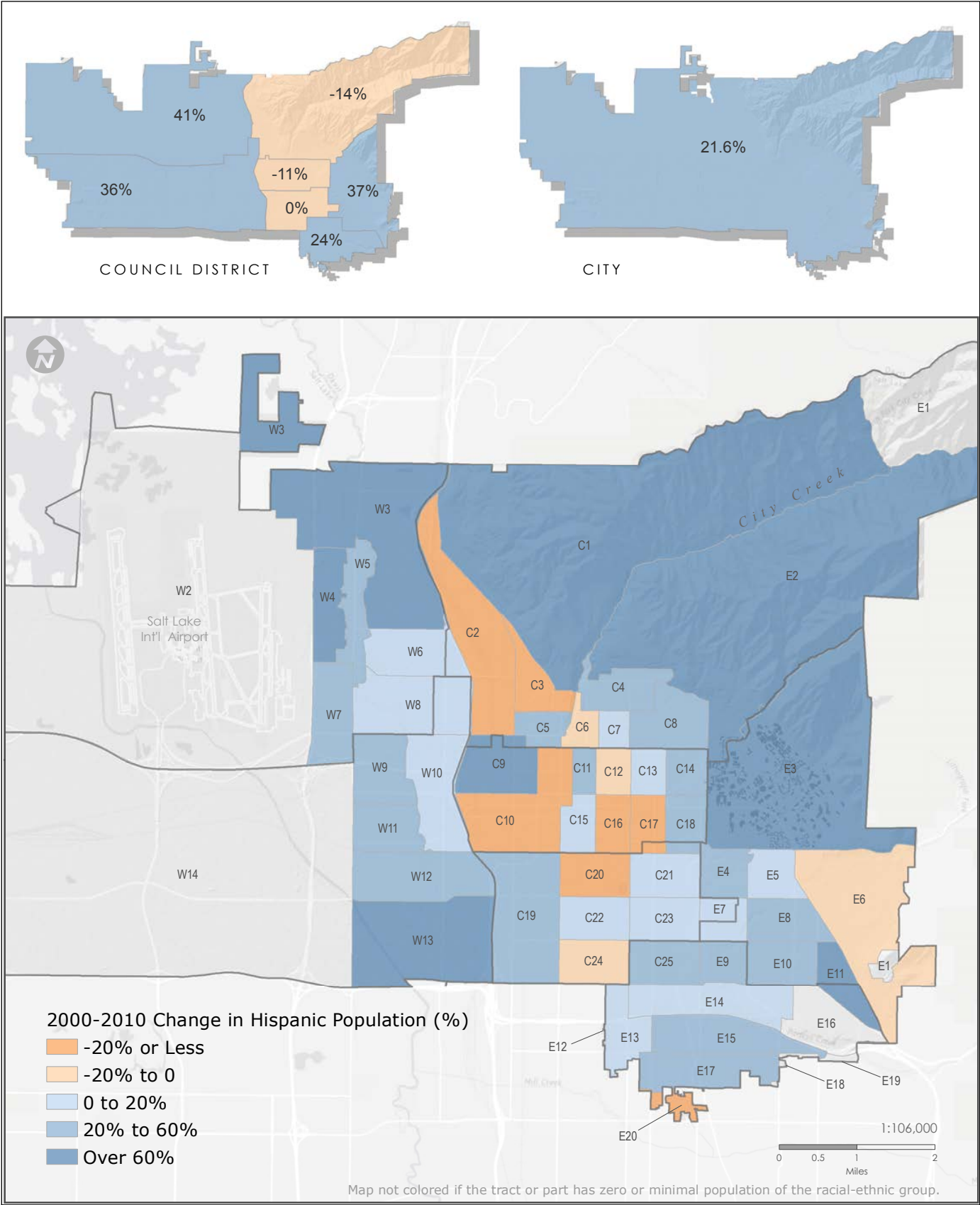

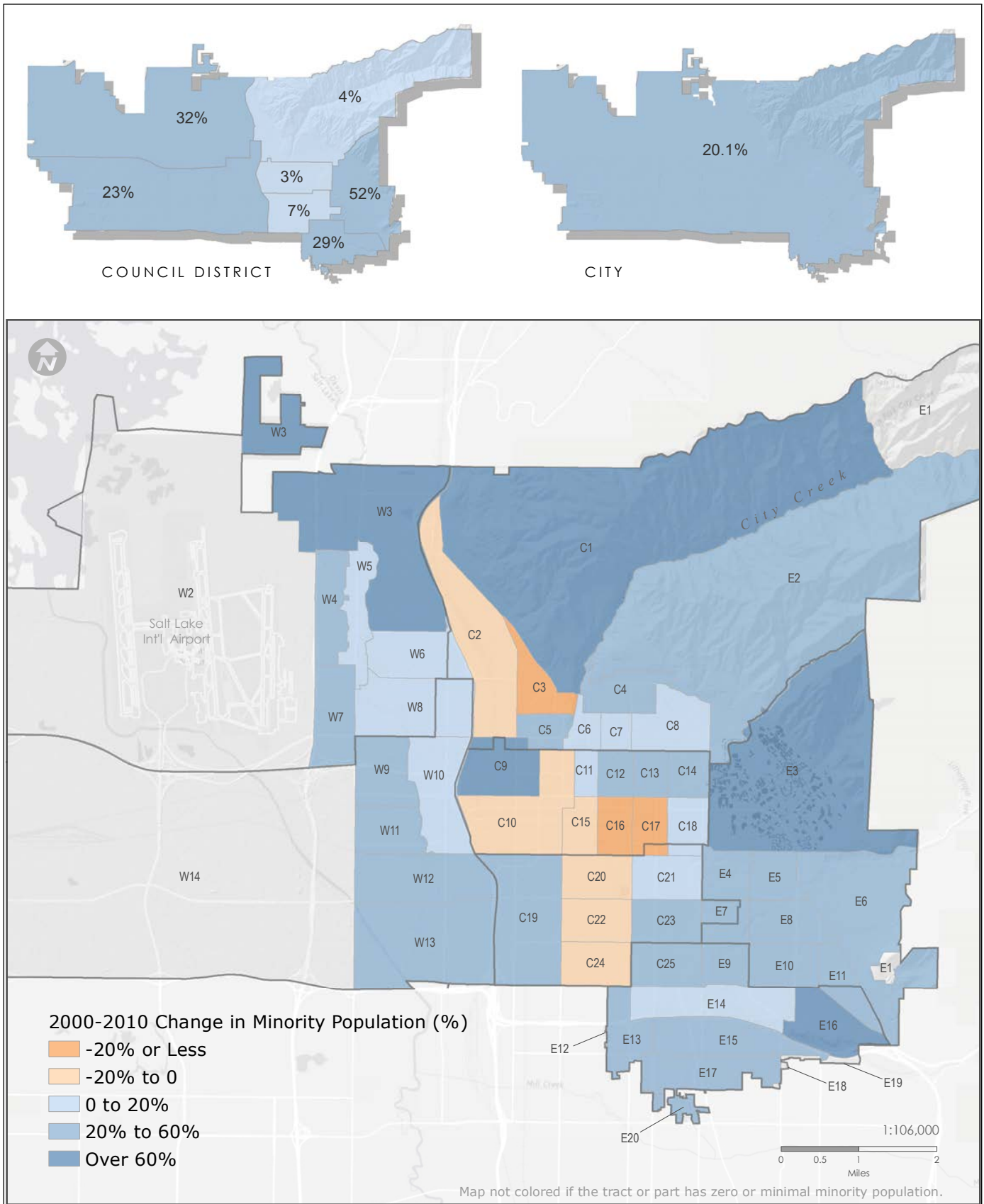

HOUSEHOLDS

3.1 Family Households

This section presents graphic (Figures 18 through 25) and tabular data (Tables 35 through 50) for changes in the number of selected types of family households. Changes by geography from 2000 to 2010 are presented for total family households, family households with children, total married-couple families and those with children, and total number of persons under 18 years old living with families, married couples, and single mothers.

Households are composed of all the people who occupy a housing unit and are categorized according to the relationships between residents. These occupants can be one person living alone, one or more families living together, or any group of related or unrelated persons residing together. The householder is self-identified and is generally understood to be the person in whose name the property is either owned or rented. This is the person listed first on the response to the questionnaire. In this data set, the number of householders or households is equivalent to the count of occupied housing units. Households are classified as family or nonfamily. Family households are people living together related by birth, marriage, or adoption. Nonfamily households are persons either living alone or with other unrelated individuals.⁶

The number of family households residing in Salt Lake City declined from 39,839 in 2000 to 39,093 in 2010, a decrease of 746. Family households increased in Council Districts 1 and 2 by 127 and 111, respectively. All other council districts experienced declines, with the largest declines in Council Districts 3 (decline of 265) and Council District 7 (decline of 224). Census Tract 1029 in Council District 5 had an increase of 234 family households, the greatest numerical increase among tracts within Salt Lake City. At the other extreme, Census Tract 1020 in Council District 4 had a decline of 123 family households.

The number of family households with own children under 18 in Salt Lake City declined by 828, from 19,323 in 2000 to 18,495 in 2010. Households of this type increased in Council Districts 1 and 2 by 54 and 45, respectively. All other council districts had declines in this household type, with the greatest decline being 315 in Council District 3. The tracts with the largest increases in family households with own children under 18 years old were Census Tract 1147 (part) in Council District 1, Census Tract 1029 in Council District 5, and Census Tract 1027.02 in Council District 2 with increases of 125, 114, and 114, respectively. The greatest declines were in Census Tract 1003.08 of Council District 1 (decline of 114) and Census Tract 1032 of Council District 5 (decline of 96).

Married-couple households declined from 29,367 to 28,240 in Salt Lake City from 2000 to 2010, a decrease of 1,127. This household type declined in every council district, with the largest declines in Council District 3 (decline of 280) and Council District 7 (decline of 251). The tract with the largest numeric decline was Census Tract 1005 in Council District 1 (decline of 159), while the tract with the largest gain was Census Tract 1029 of Council District 5 (increase of 100).

The number of married-couple households with own children decreased by 884, falling from 13,865 in 2000 to 12,981 in 2010. All council districts had declines in this type of household, with the largest decline in Council District 3 (decrease of 296). Census Tract 1147 (part) in Council District 1 had the largest increase (112), and Census Tract 1003.08, also in Council District 1, had the largest decline (126).

Households with own children under 18 that were headed by single females (“single” indicates that no husband is present) declined in Salt Lake City from 4,174 in 2000 to 3,936 in 2010, a decline of 238. This household type declined in all council districts except Council District 1, which experienced a slight increase of 27. Council District 4 had a

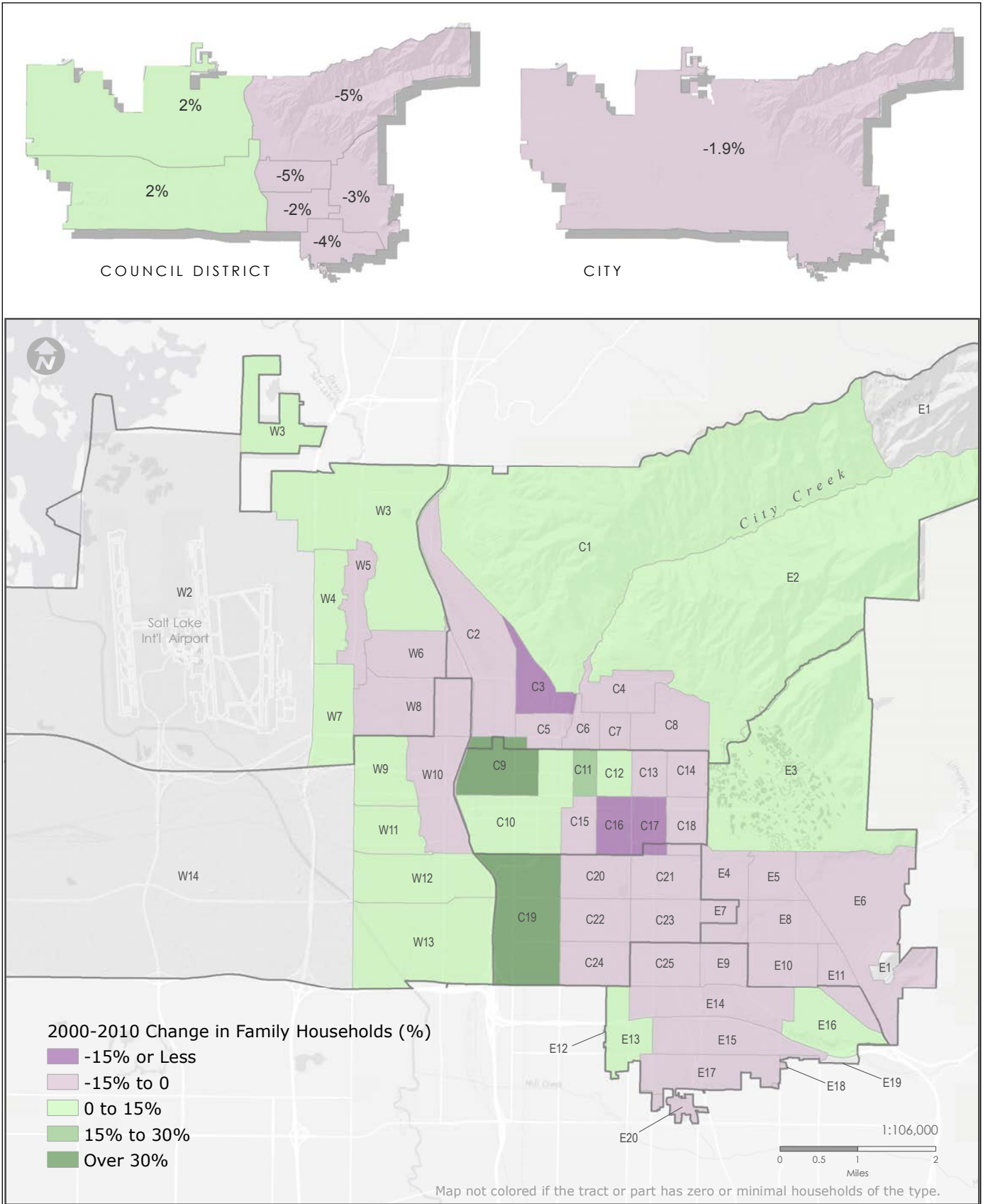
decline of 81, the largest decline among all districts.

The population of children (persons under the age of 18) living in families declined from 37,934 in 2000 to 36,506 in 2010, a decrease of 1,428. The population of children living in families increased by 342 persons in Council District 1 and by 118 persons in Council District 2. Largest declines of this population were 590 in Council District 3 and 489 in Council District 4. The total population of children living in families increased the most in Census Tract 1027.02 of Council District 2 (increase of 348) and Census Tract 1147 (part) of Council District 1 (increase of 281). Largest declines were in Census Tract 1003.08 of Council District 1 (decline of 226) and Census Tract 1020 of Council District 4 (decline of 204).

The number of children living in married-couple families declined from 28,599 in 2000 to 26,606 in 2010, a decline of 1,993. This population decreased in all council districts, with the largest declines in Council District 3 (decrease of 654) and Council District 5 (decrease of 434).

The number of children living with single mothers declined slightly, falling from 7,298 in 2000 to 7,221 in 2010, a decrease of 77 or 1.1 percent. This population increased the most in Council District 1 (increase of 210), with slight increases in Council Districts 2, 3, and 5. Declines in this population occurred in Council Districts 4, 7, and 6, with corresponding decreases of 139, 112, and 79.

Figure 19: Family Households with Own Children Under 18 in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

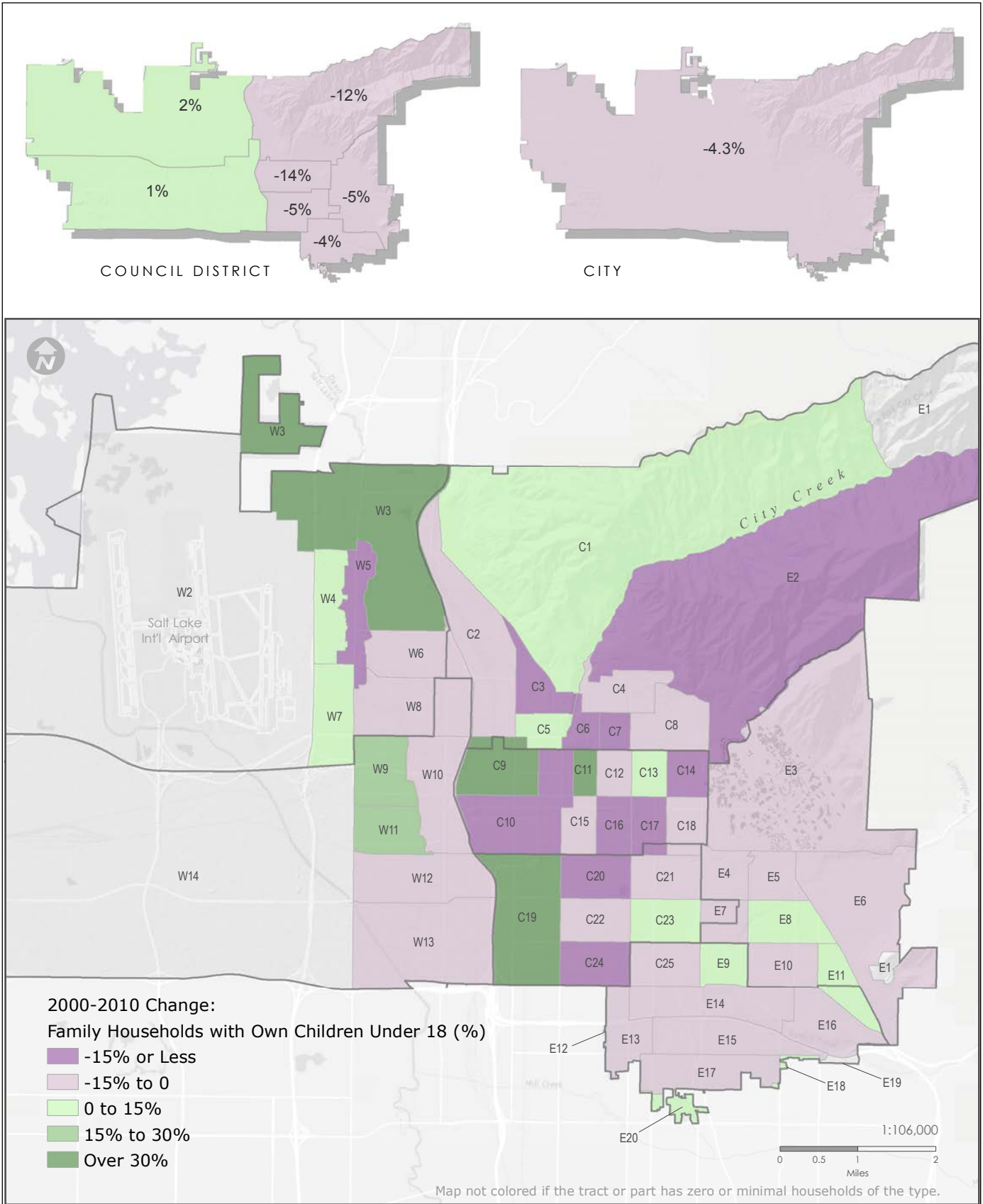

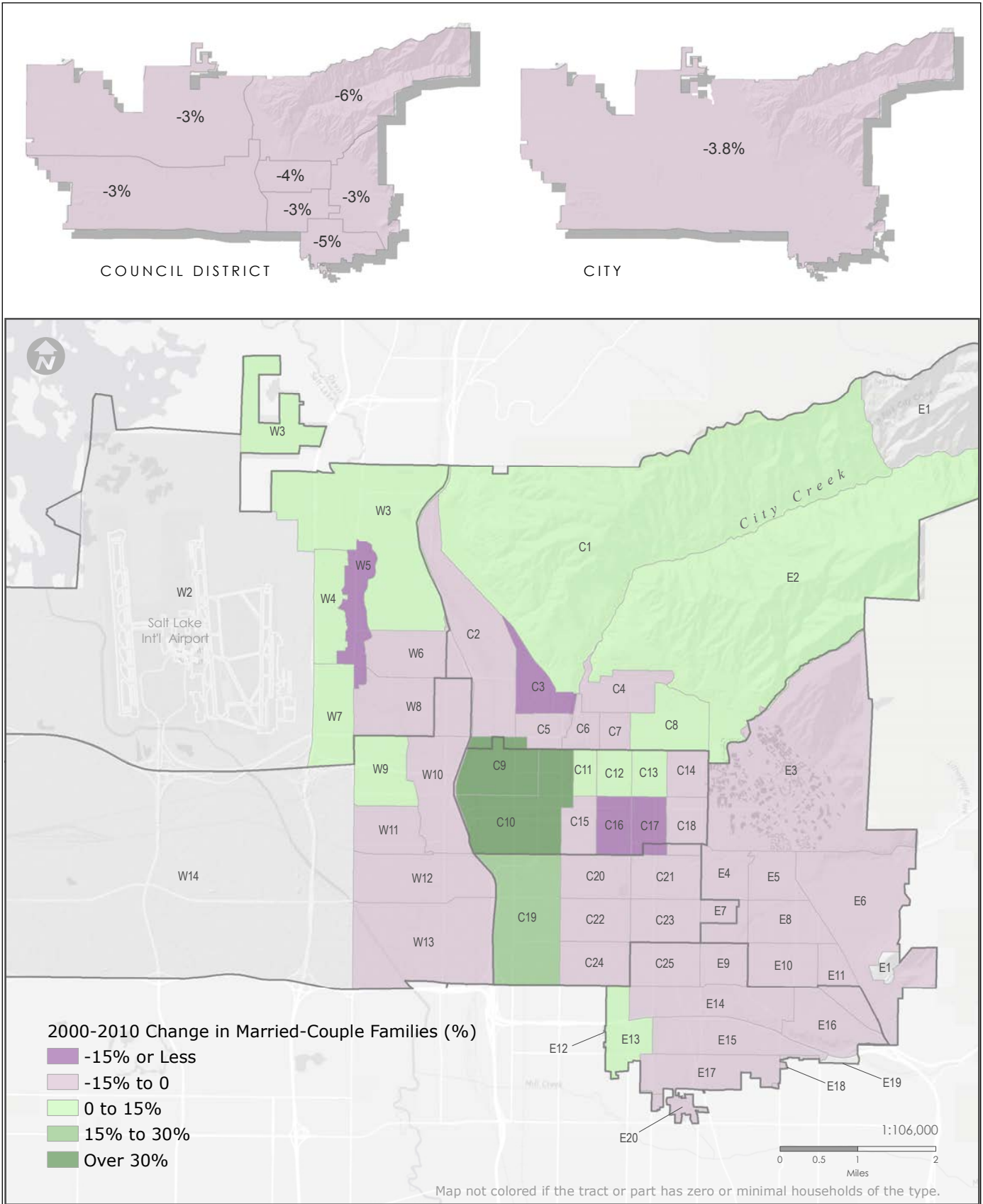

Figure 21: Married-Couple Families with Own Children Under 18 in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

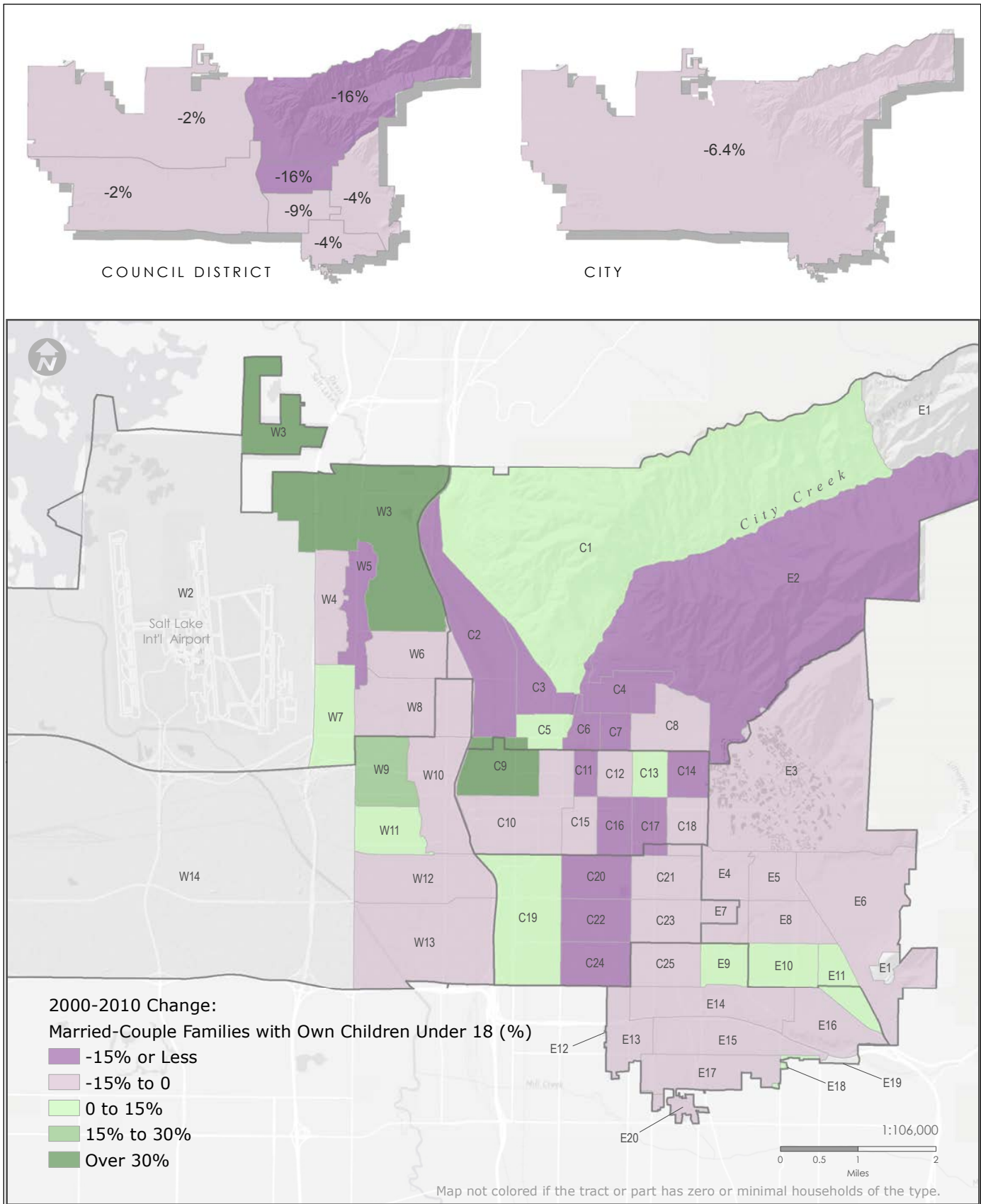

Figure 22: Female Householder, No Husband Present, with Own Children Under 18 in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

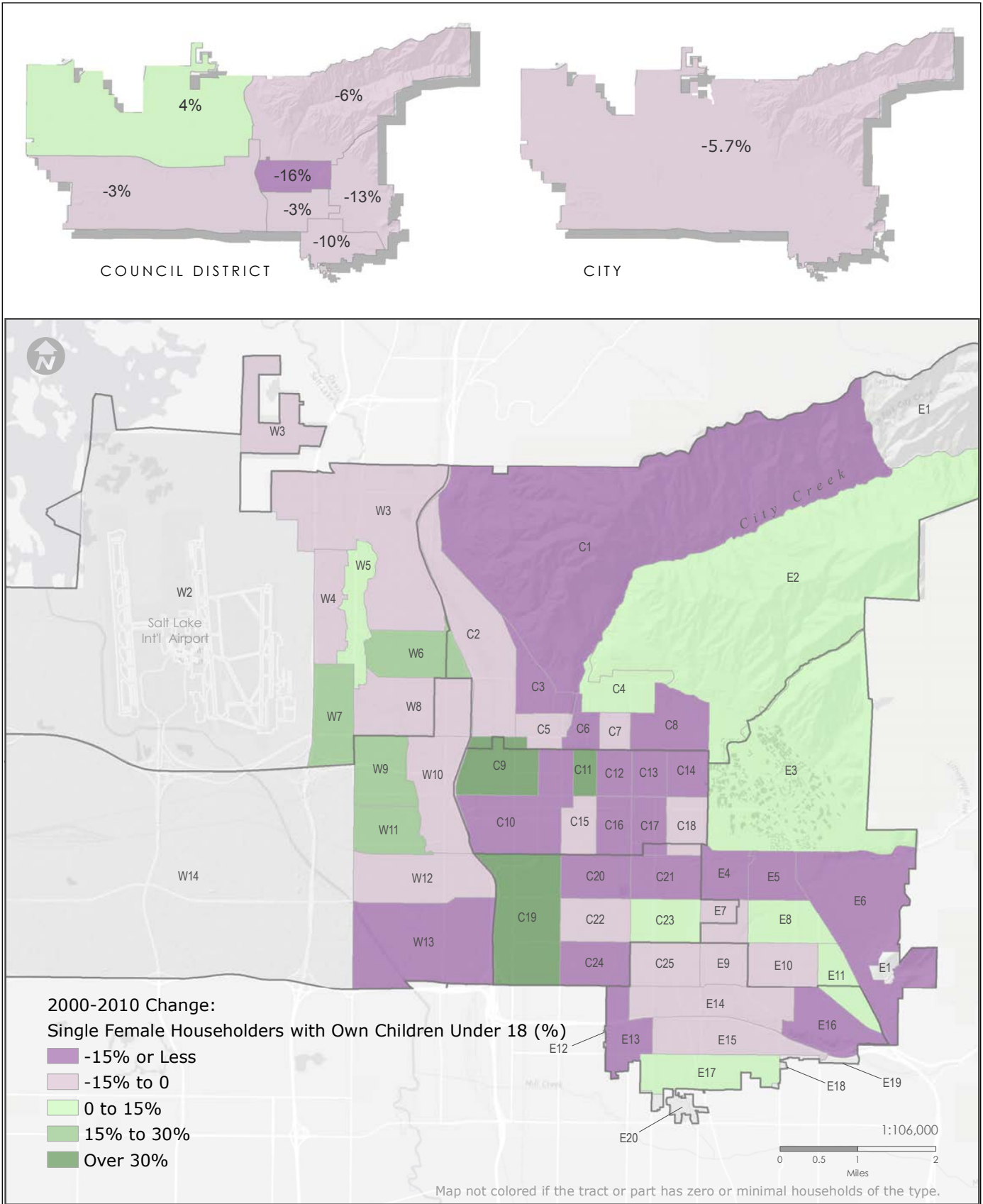

Figure 23: Number of Own Children Under 18 in Families in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

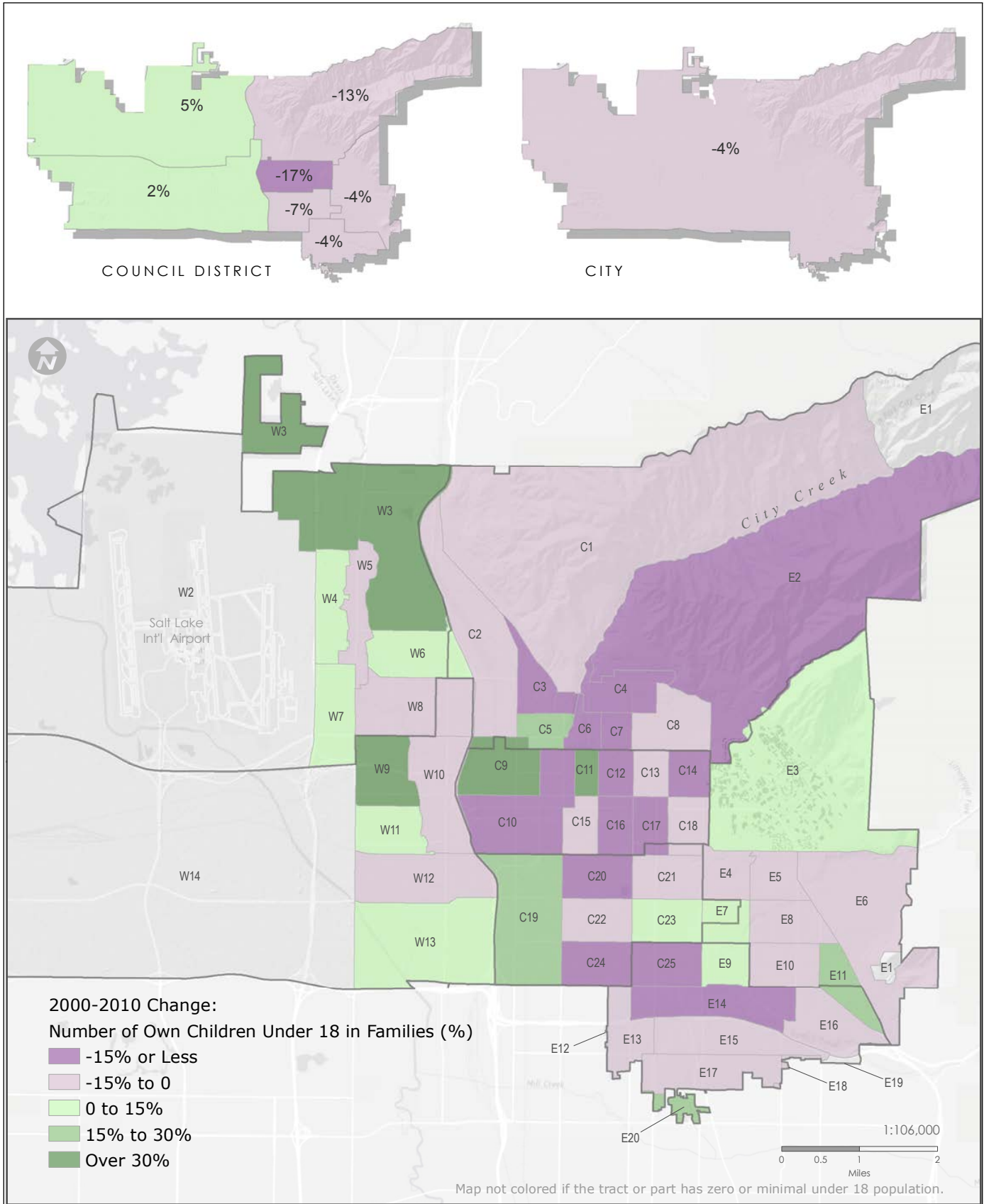

Figure 24: Number of Own Children Under 18 in Married-Couple Families in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

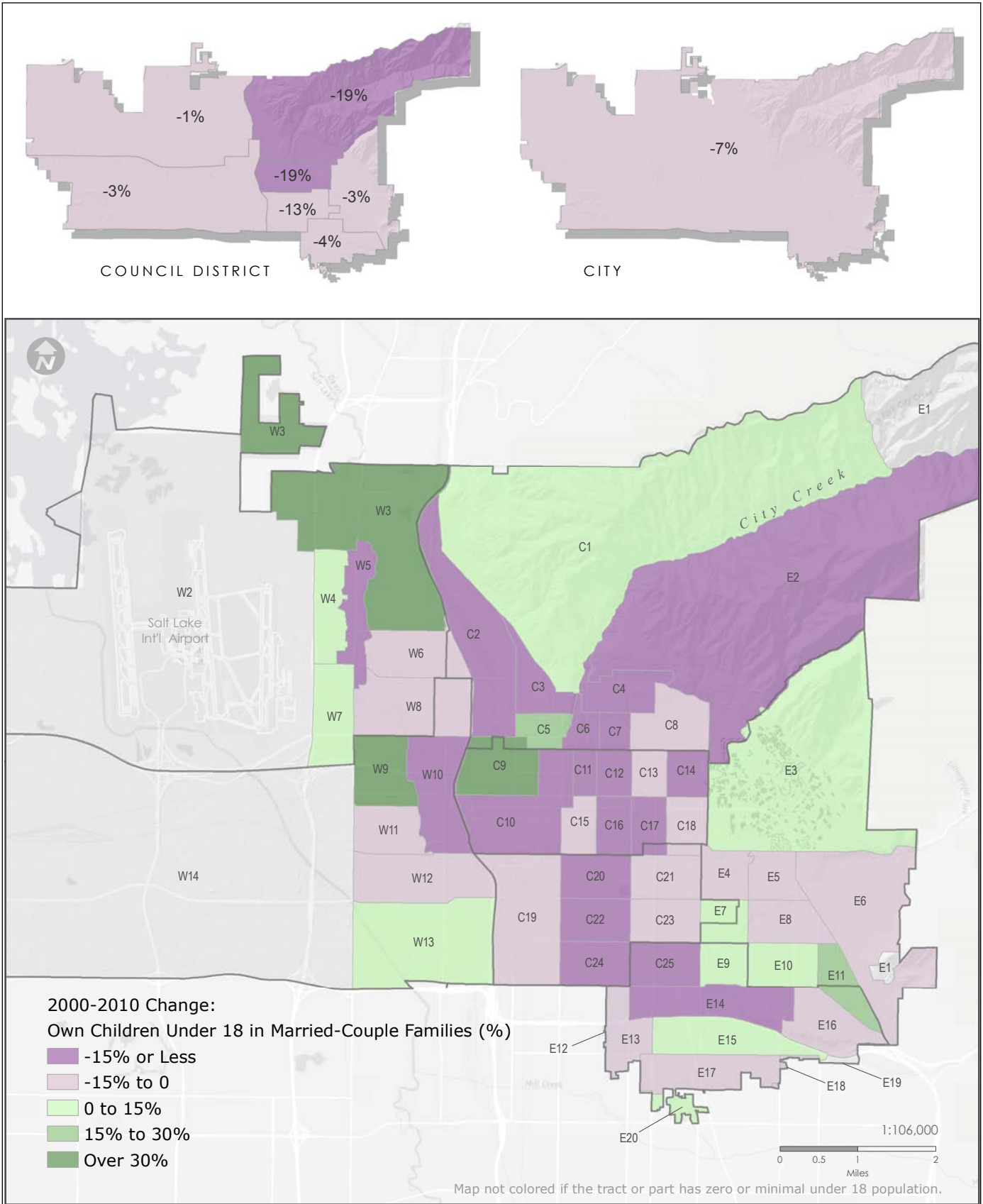

Figure 25: Number of Own Children Under 18 with Single Mothers in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

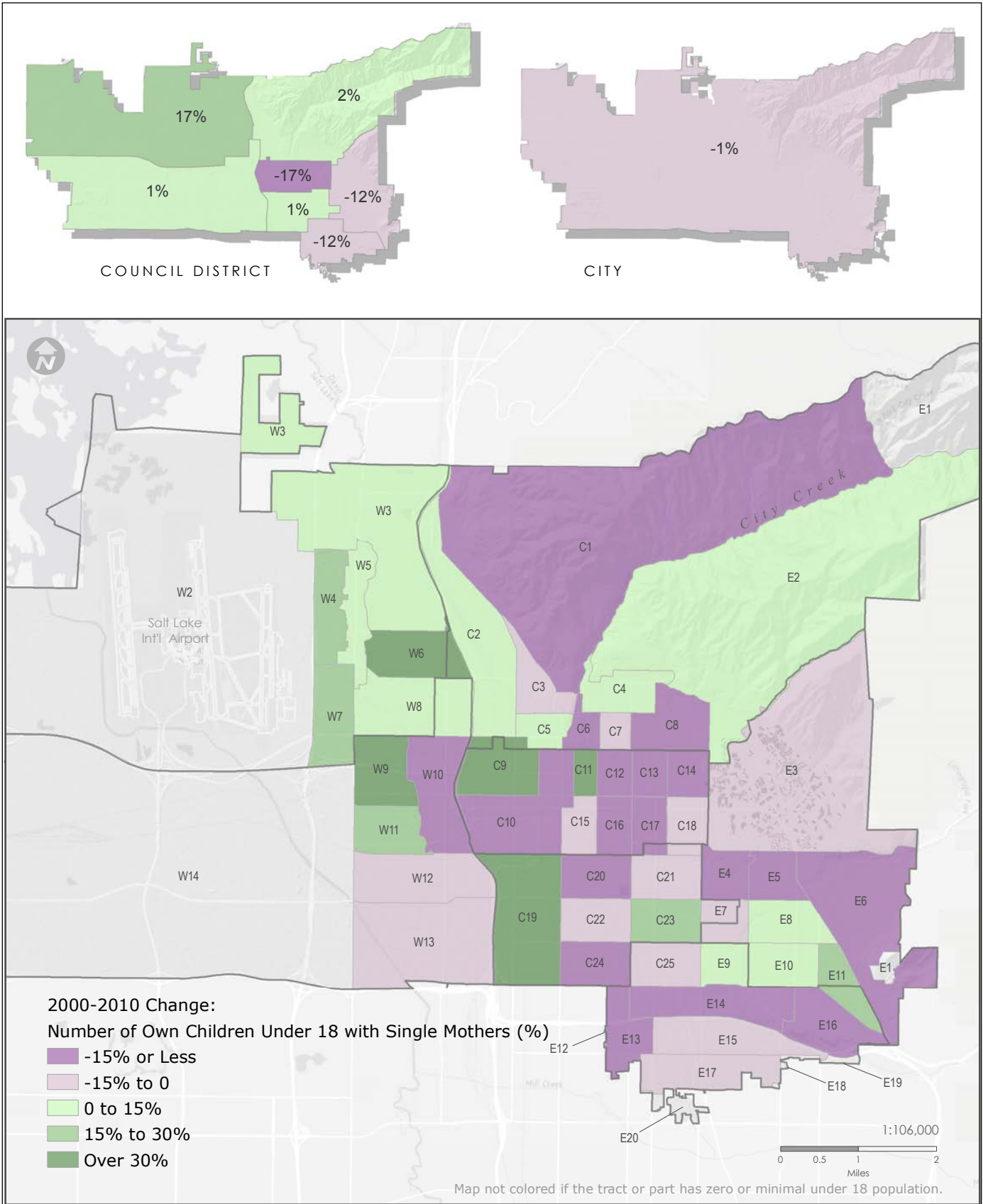

3.2 Nonfamily Households

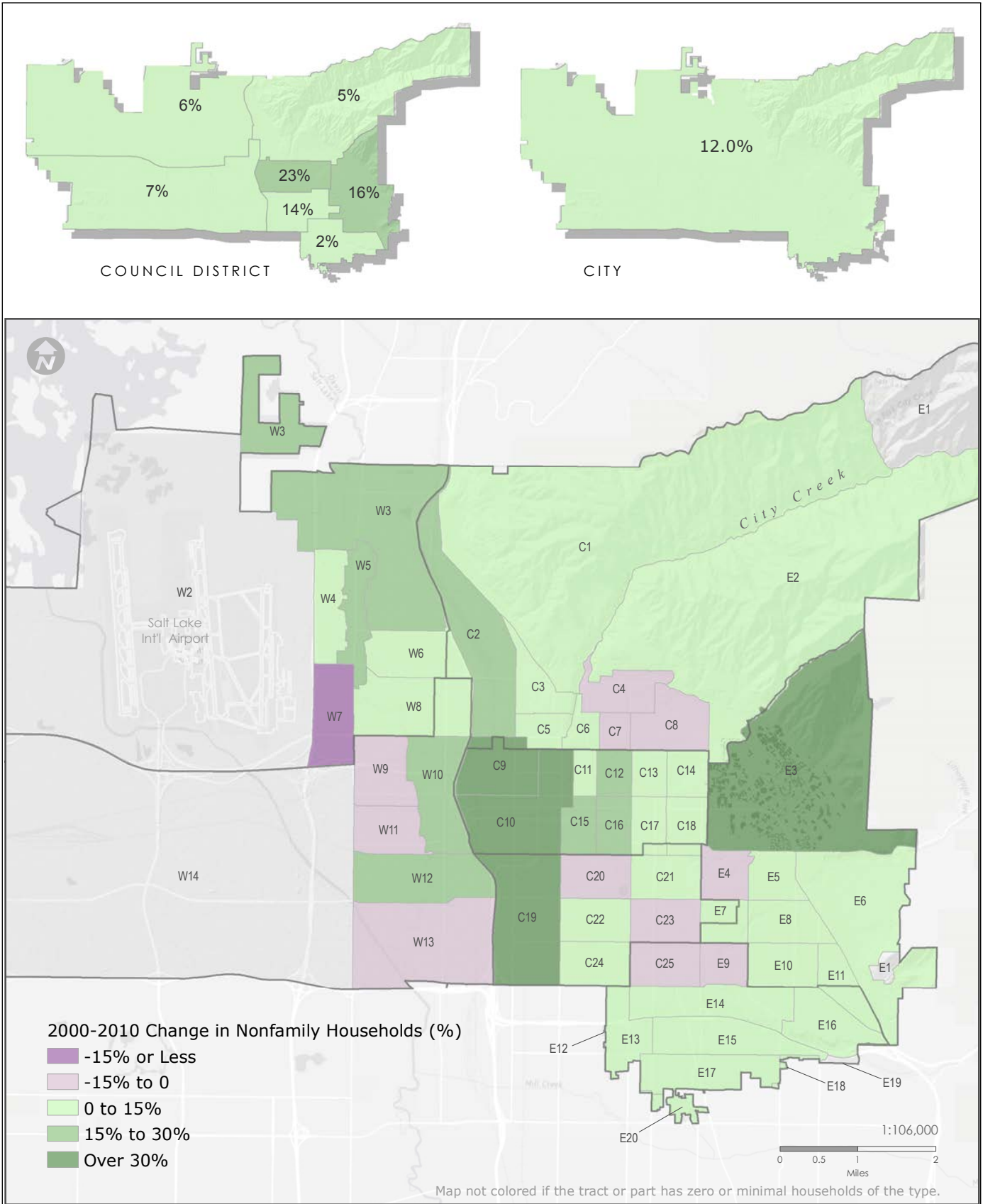
This section presents graphic (Figures 26 through 28) and tabular data (Tables 51 through 56) for changes in the total number of nonfamily households, one-person households, and householders 65 years and older who are living alone. Nonfamily households are defined as people either living alone or living with other unrelated individuals. These 2000 to 2010 changes are shown by geography.

The number of Salt Lake City nonfamily households increased from 31,634 to 35,420 from 2000 to 2010, which is an increase of 3,786 or 12.0 percent. All council districts had increases in nonfamily households, with just over half the increase located in Council District 4 (increase of 1,941). Nonfamily households increased by 726 in Council District 5. Census Tract 1029 of Council District 5 had the largest increase (549) followed by Census Tract 1140 of Council District 4 (increase of 343). The largest numeric decline in nonfamily households was in Census Tract 1003.06 of Council District 1 (decline of 76).

The number of single-person households in Salt Lake City increased by 2,085, from 23,727 to 25,812. Over two-thirds of this increase occurred in Council District 4, where householders living alone rose by 1,438 from 2000 to 2010. Only Council District 7 had a slight decline (loss of 24) in this household type. Single-person households doubled in Census Tract 1029 of Council District 5 (increase of 440). Census Tract 1140 of Council District 4 had the second largest increase, with an increment of 291 more single-person households over the ten-year period. The largest numeric decline in single-person households was in Census Tract 1003.06 of Council District 1 (decline of 79).

A subset of the single-person household category is the single-person household with the resident being at least 65 years old. From 2000 to 2010, this type of single person household declined by 692 for Salt Lake City, falling from 6,907 to 6,215. The share of single-person households in Salt Lake City with residents at least 65 years of age fell from 29.1 percent in 2000 to 24.1 percent in 2010. The largest absolute decline was in Council District 7 (decrease of 329), followed by Council District 5 (decrease of 174). Only Council Districts 3 and 4 had increases in this household type, with corresponding increases of 29 and 56. Census Tract 1048 (part) of Council District 7 had a decline of 102, the largest among tracts. Census Tract 1016 of Council District 4 had the largest increase, with 48 additional one-person households with the resident aged 65 years or older.

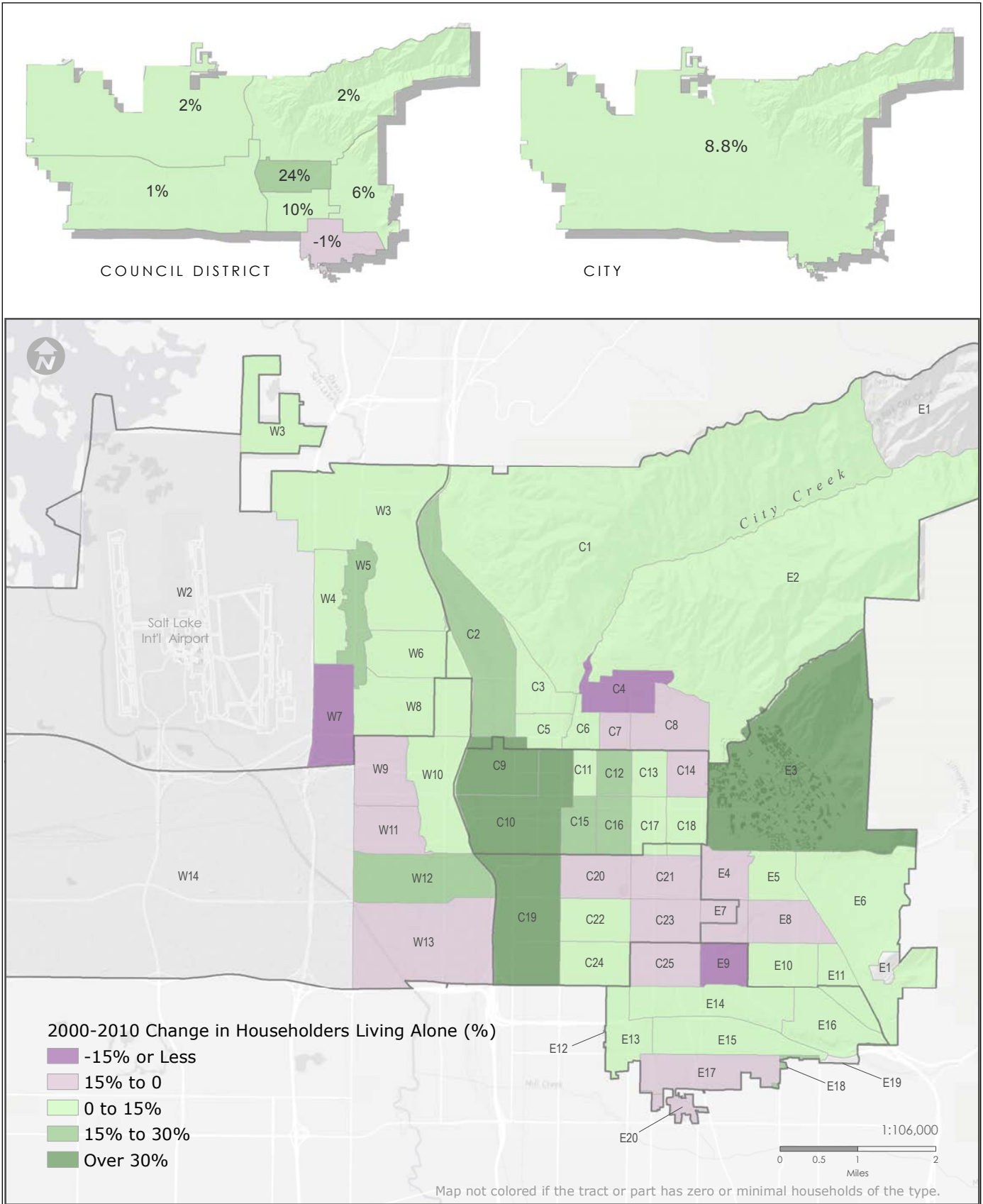

Figure 28: Householder 65 and Older Living Alone in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

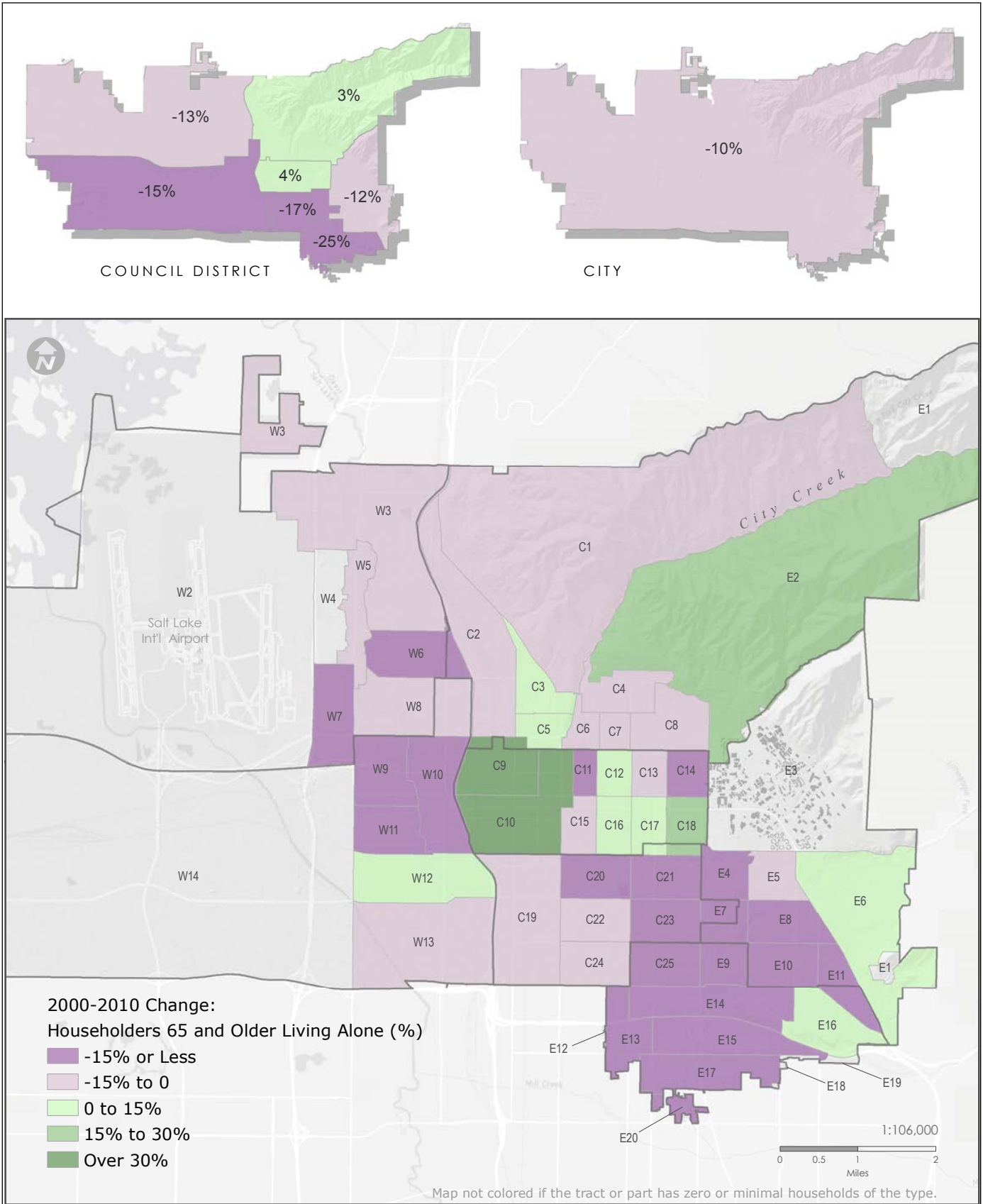

GROUP QUARTERS

This section presents graphic (Figures 29 through 35) and tabular data (Tables 57 through 70) for changes in the Salt Lake City total, institutionalized, and noninstitutionalized group quarters populations by gender. People not living in housing units are classified as group quarters populations. These were divided into institutionalized and noninstitutionalized populations. Institutional group quarters include correctional facilities, nursing homes, other care facilities for the handicapped, and facilities to care for and/or detain juveniles. Noninstitutional facilities include college dormitories, military quarters, group homes, religious group quarters, employment-related housing facilities, and other noninstitutional facilities (e.g., emergency shelters, soup kitchens, YW/MCAs, and hostels).⁷

The group quarters population in Salt Lake City increased from 4,573 in 2000 to 4,795 in 2010, an increase of 222 persons or 4.9 percent. In 2010, Council Districts 4 and 6 had group quarters population of 1,870 and 1,293, respectively, accounting for two-thirds of the city total. The increase in the Council District 7 group quarters population of 208 combined with the increase in Council District 4 of 197 account for almost all of the increase in the city's group quarters population. Council District 5 had a decline of 208 in its group quarters population, exactly offsetting the increase in Council District 7. The changes in group quarters population were numerically small for the other council districts. Census Tract 1025 in Council District 4 had the largest increase, with its group quarters population increasing by 419. Census Tract 1032 in Council District 5 had the largest decline, with the total group quarters population declining by 212.

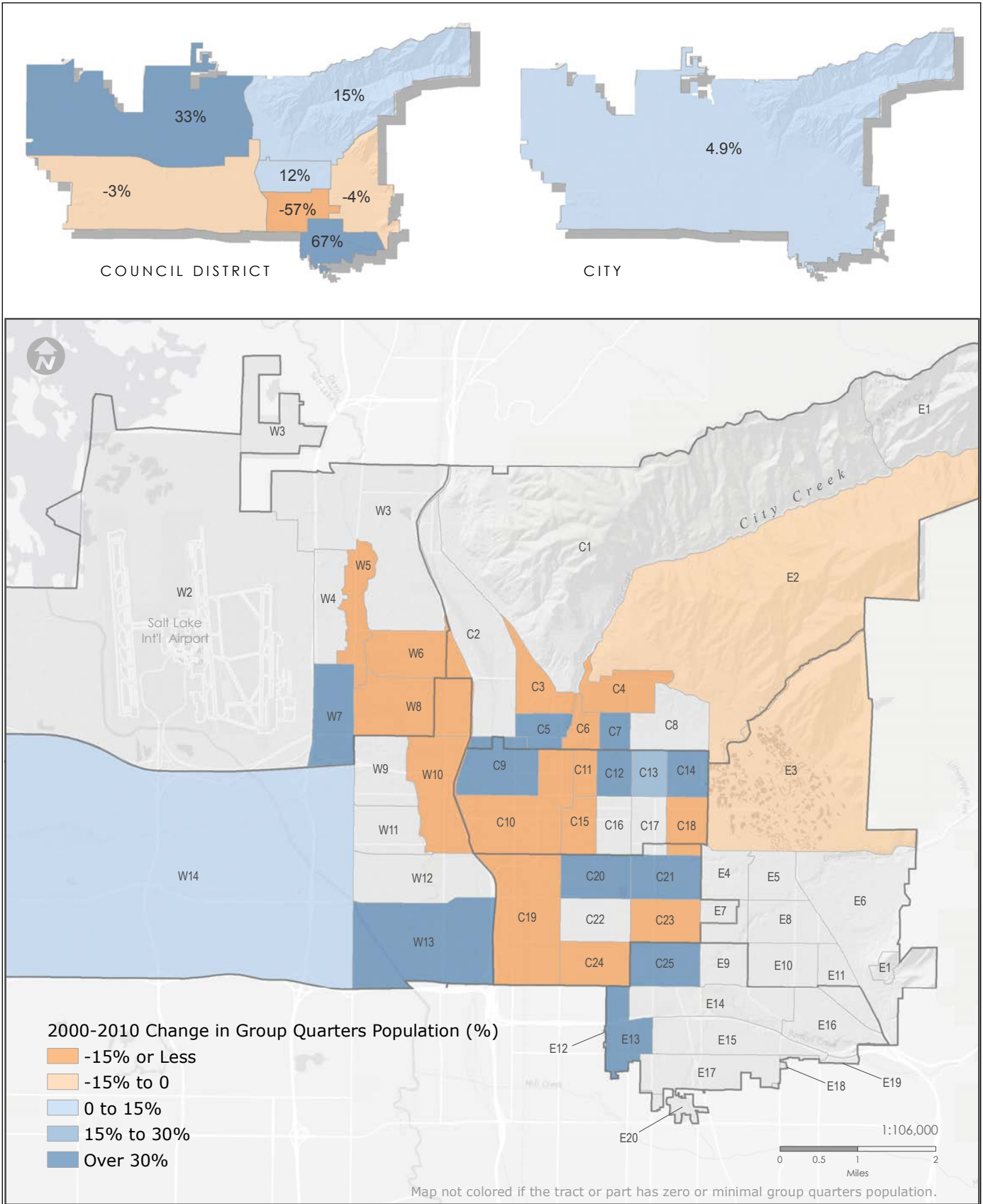
The Salt Lake City male group quarters population increased by 346, while the female group quarters population declined by 124 from 2000 to 2010. The increase in male group quarters population is geographically concentrated in Council District 4 (increase of 219) and Council District 7 (increase of 150). Increases in the male group quarters populations was greatest in Census Tract 1025 of District 4 (increase of 274) and Census Tract 1033 of Council District 7 (increase of 138). The decline in the female group quarters population is predominantly located in Council District 5 (decrease of 161). Census Tract 1032 within Council District 5 and Census Tract 1021 within Council District 4 had largest declines of 164 and 109, respectively. Census Tract 1025 in Council District 4 had an increase of 145 in the female group quarters population.

The male noninstitutional group quarters population increased by 432 or 21.8 percent, increasing from 1,982 in 2000 to 2,414 in 2010. Largest increases occurred in Council District 7 (increase of 154) and Council District 4 (increase of 147). Greatest tract-level increases were Census Tract 1025 in Council District 4 (increase of 274) and Census Tract 1033 in Council District 7 (increase of 138). Census Tract 1140 of Council District 4 had a decline of 126 in the male noninstitutional group quarters population, the largest decrease among all tracts in the city. The Salt Lake City female noninstitutional group quarters population increased by 102, rising from 1,457 in 2000 to 1,559 in 2010. Council District 3 had an increase of 82, the greatest among districts. Census Tract 1025 in Council District 4 has an increase of 145, the largest increase among tracts. Council District 4 had a decline of 76 in this population, with Census Tract 1021 within this district declining by 109, the greatest decline among all tracts.

The Salt Lake City institutionalized group quarters population was 822 in 2010, down from 1,134 in 2000. Both male and female populations declined by 86 and 226, respectively. Council District 6 had the largest decline in the male population (decline of 105), and Census Tract 1014 within this district had a decline of 105, the largest among all tracts. Council District 5 had the largest decline in the female institutionalized group quarters population, decreasing by 165, with Census Tract 1032 within this district experiencing a decline of 159, the greatest among all tracts. Census Tract 1019 in Council District 4 had an increase of 119 in its institutionalized female group quarters population, the largest among all tracts.

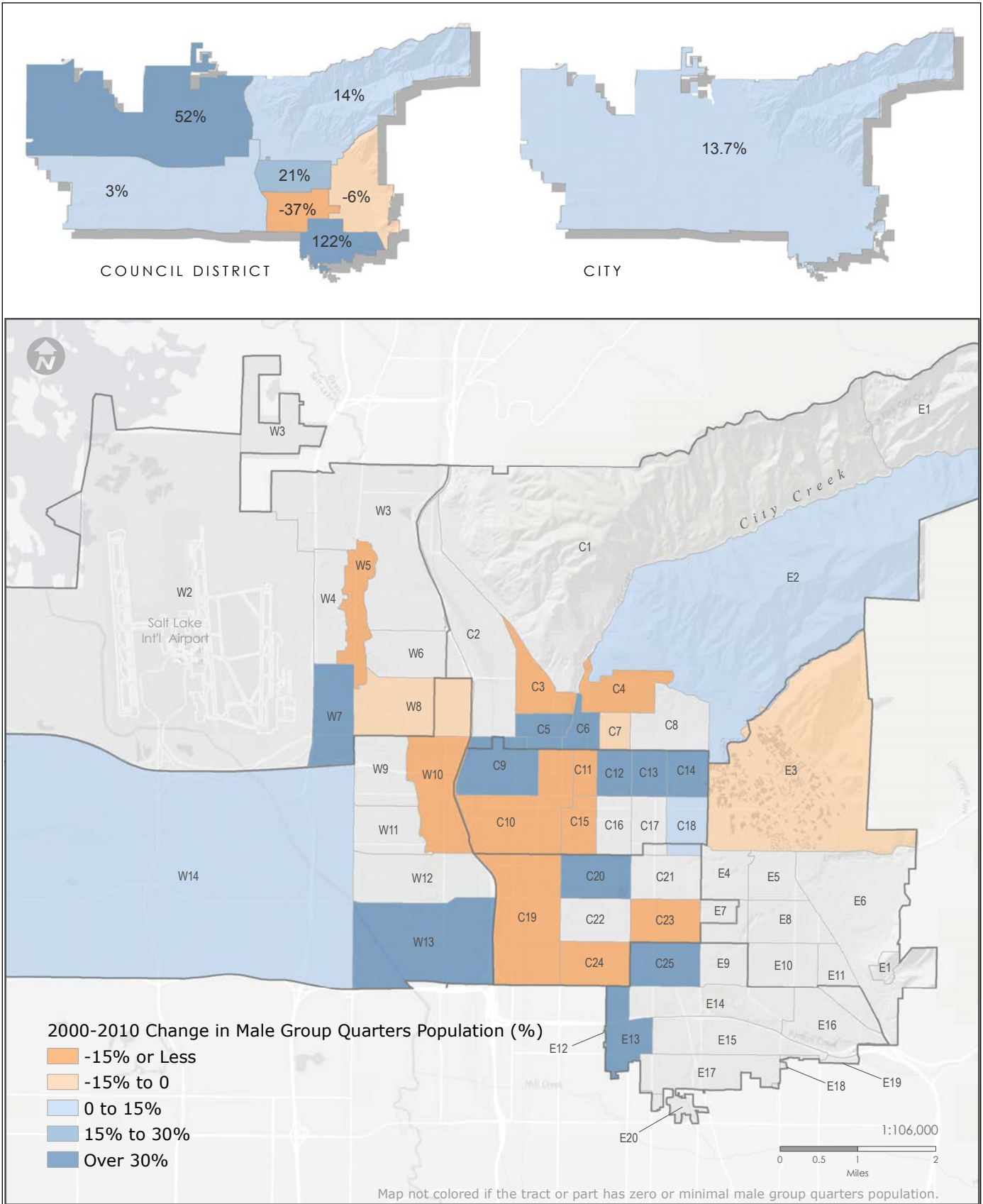

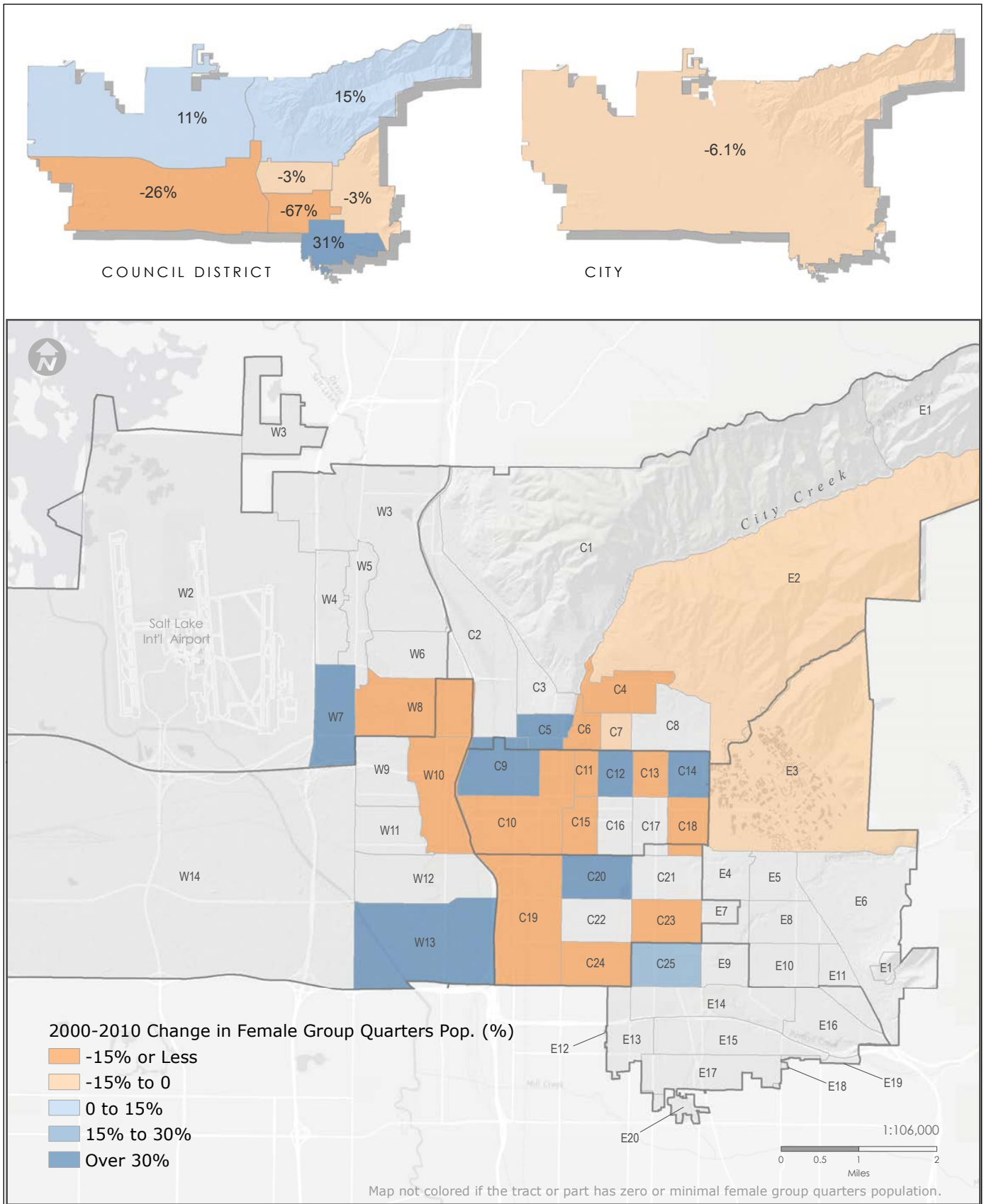

Figure 32: Male Population in Noninstitutional Group Quarters in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

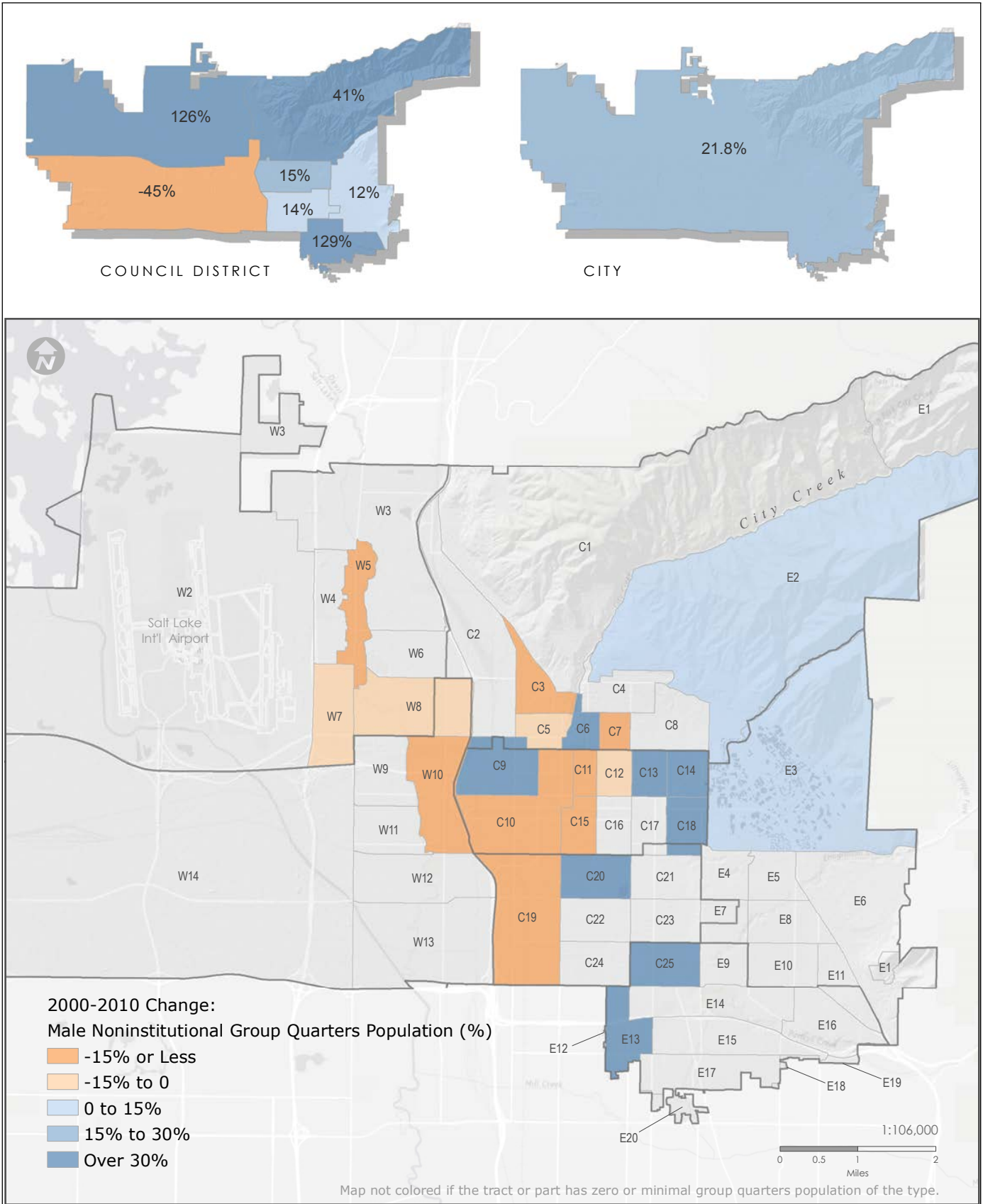

Figure 33: Female Population in Noninstitutional Group Quarters in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

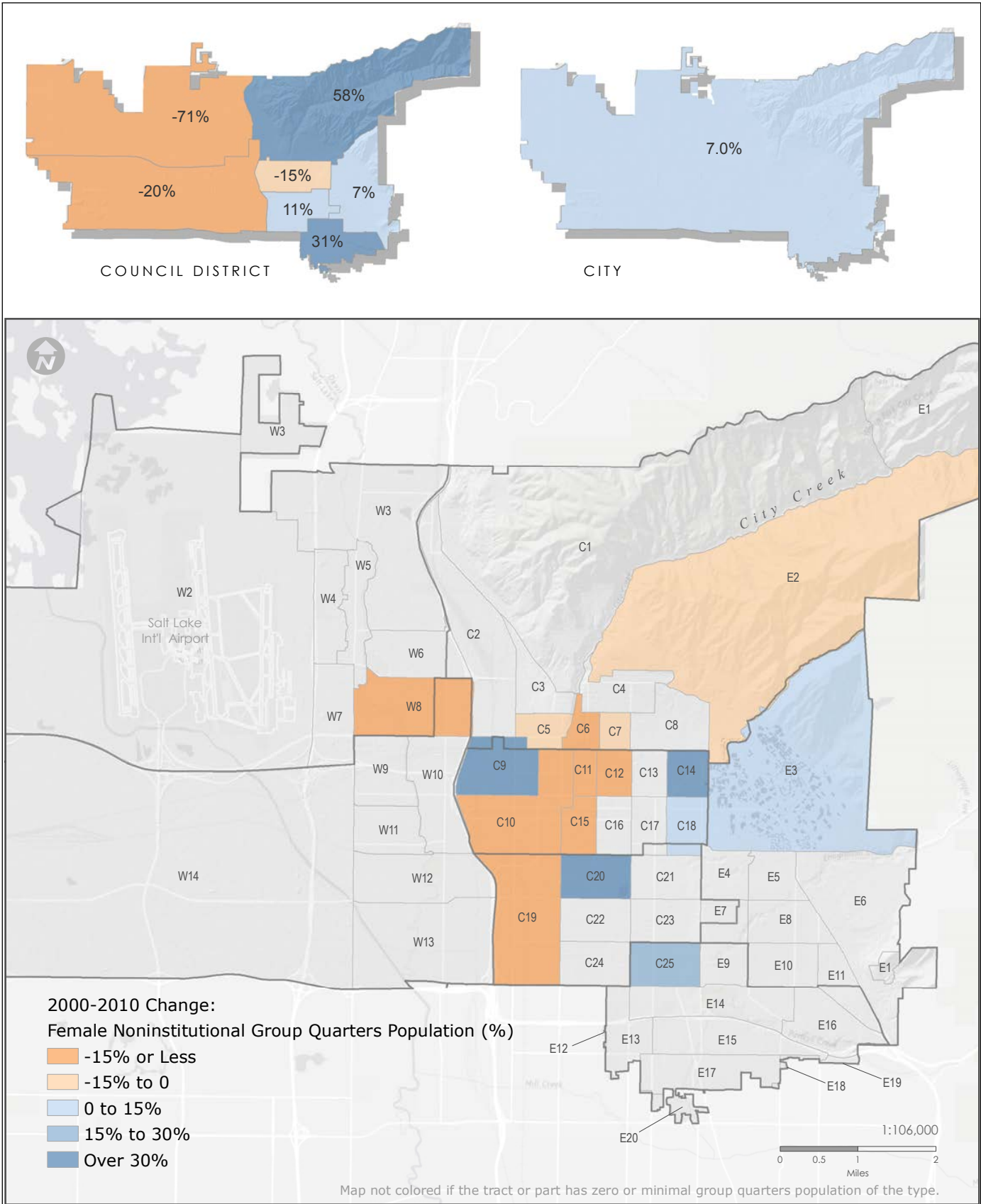

Figure 34: Male Population in Institutional Group Quarters in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

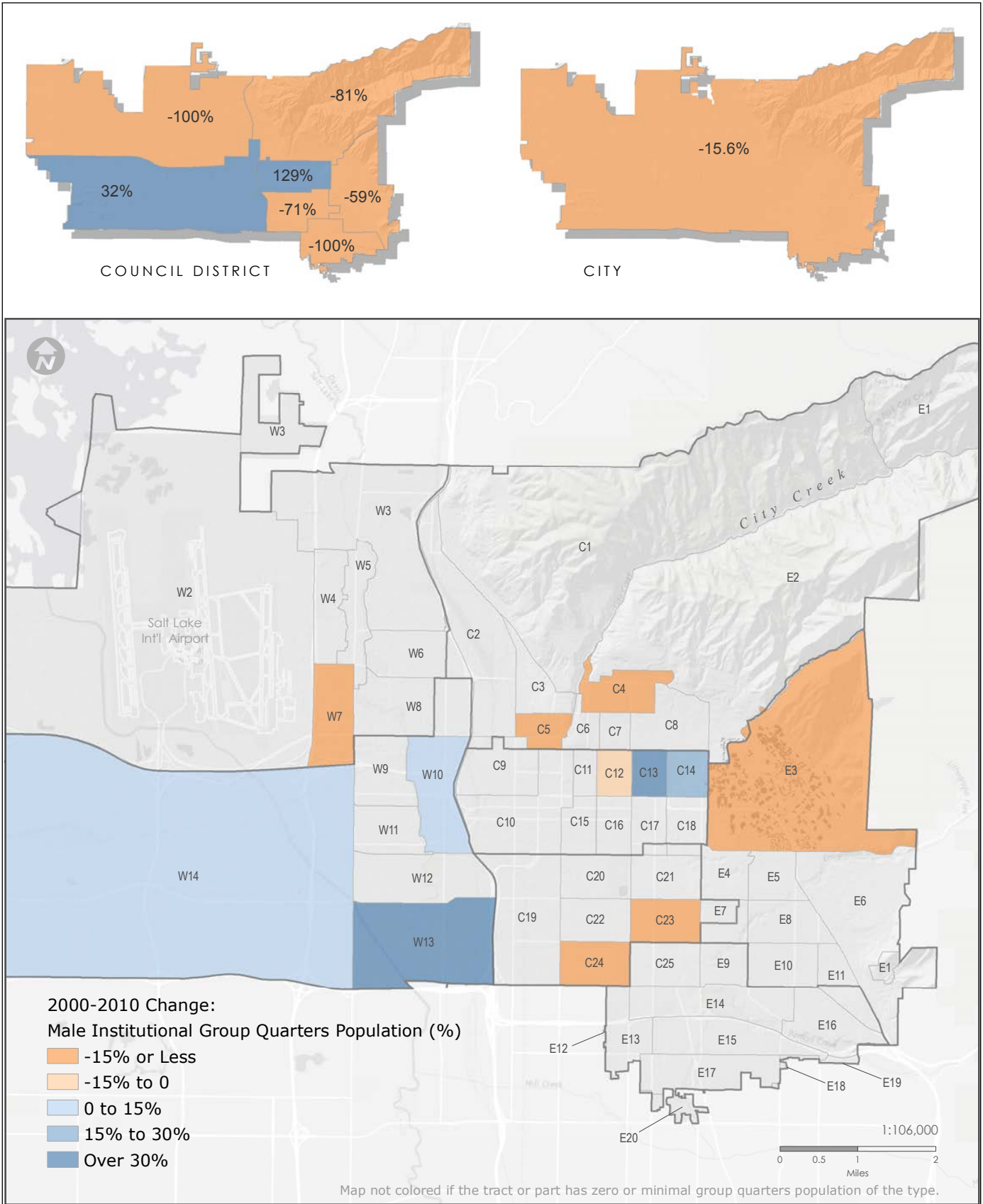

Figure 35: Female Population in Institutional Group Quarters in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

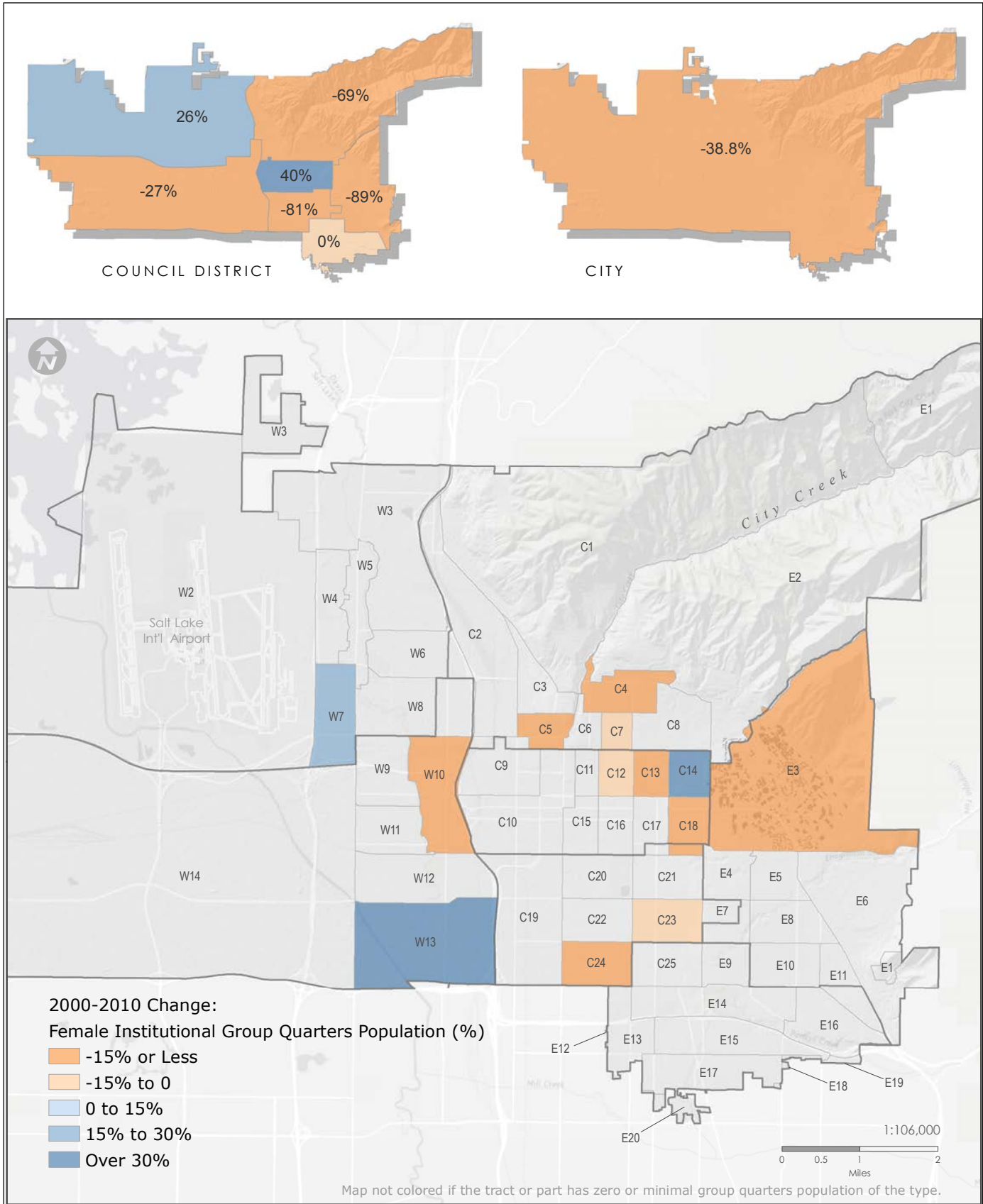

HOUSING UNITS

This section presents graphic (Figures 36 through 44) and tabular data (Tables 71 through 88) for changes in the Salt Lake City total housing units by occupancy (occupied or vacant) and tenure (owned or rented). Changes in shares are examined as well.

Total housing units in Salt Lake City increased from 77,067 in 2000 to 80,724 in 2010, an increase of 3,657 housing units or 4.7 percent. Council District 4 gained 1,680 units, the largest increase among council districts, with Census Tract 1025 within this district adding 1,127. The next largest increase was in Council District 5, which added 675 units. Within District 5, Census Tract 1029 added 844, the second greatest increase among tracts. Only Council District 7 experienced a slight decline in housing units (loss of 27).

Occupied housing units increased by 3,040 from 2000 to 2010, with the geographic distribution of these gains (and losses) following the same pattern as changes in units. Occupancy rates declined from 92.7 percent of all units in 2000 to 92.3 percent in 2010. Vacant units increased from 5,594 in 2000 to 6,211 in 2010, an increase of 617. Census Tract 1025 in Council District 4 had an increase of 129 vacant units, the greatest among tracts. Census Tract 1019 had a decline of 121 vacant units from 2000 to 2010, the greatest decline among tracts.

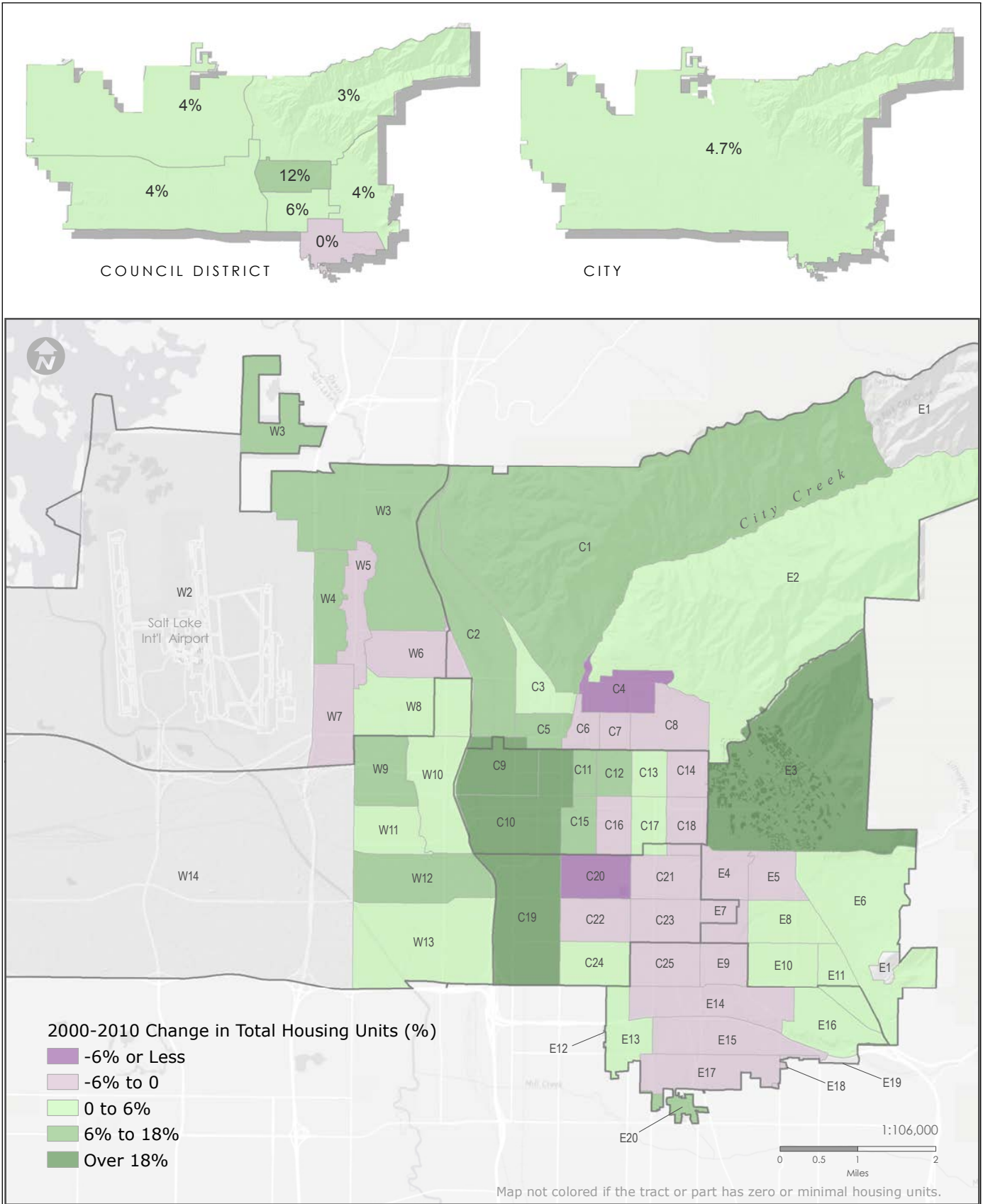
The Salt Lake City housing unit vacancy rate increased from 7.3 percent in 2000 to 7.7 percent in 2010. The greatest number of vacant units in both 2000 and 2010 were in Council Districts 3 and 4. While Council District 3 saw an increase in vacant units, Council District 4 was the only council district to experience a decline. The number of vacant housing units increased the most in Council District 3, with an increase of 325 vacant units or a 28.1 percent increase. Council District 6 had the next largest increase in vacant units, 127 or 26.3 percent increase from 2000 to 2010.

The number of owner-occupied units in Salt Lake City decreased from 36,604 in 2000 to 36,073 in 2010, a decline of 531. The decline was the greatest in Council District 7, which lost 355 owner-occupied units, and Council District 6, which lost 234 owner-occupied units. Council District 4 gained 468 owner-occupied units and Council District 3 gained 14. All other districts experienced declines. Greatest increases were in Census Tracts 1025 (gain of 173) and 1140 (gain of 171), both of which are located in Council District 4. The largest losses in owner-occupied units were in Census Tract 1048 (part) of Council District 7 (loss of 160) and Census Tract 1003.08 of Council District 1 (loss of 113).

From 2000 to 2010, the owner-occupied share of occupied housing units in Salt Lake City declined from 51.2 percent to 48.4 percent. This means that the renter-occupied share increased from 48.8 percent to 51.6 percent. By 2010, rentals made up the majority of occupied housing units in Council District 4 (rental rate of 78.4 percent), Council District 3 (rental rate of 59.9 percent), and Council District 5 (50.3 percent). Owner-occupied shares declined (and rental shares increased) in all but Council District 4, which saw a slight change in both rates in the opposite direction from the rest of the city.

Rental-occupied units increased from 34,869 in 2000 to 38,440 in 2010, an increase of 10.2 percent or 3,571 units. All council districts had increases in rental-occupied units, with the great increases in Council District 4 (increase of 1,267) and Council District 5 (increase of 828). Census tracts with the greatest numeric increases in rental-occupied units are Census Tract 1025 in Council District 4 (increase of 825) and Census Tract 1029 of Council District 5 (increase of 788). The census tract with the greatest increase in the rental share of occupied units is Census Tract 1029 of Council District 5, where the rental share increased from 59.8 percent to 75.7 percent, a 15.9 percentage point increase.

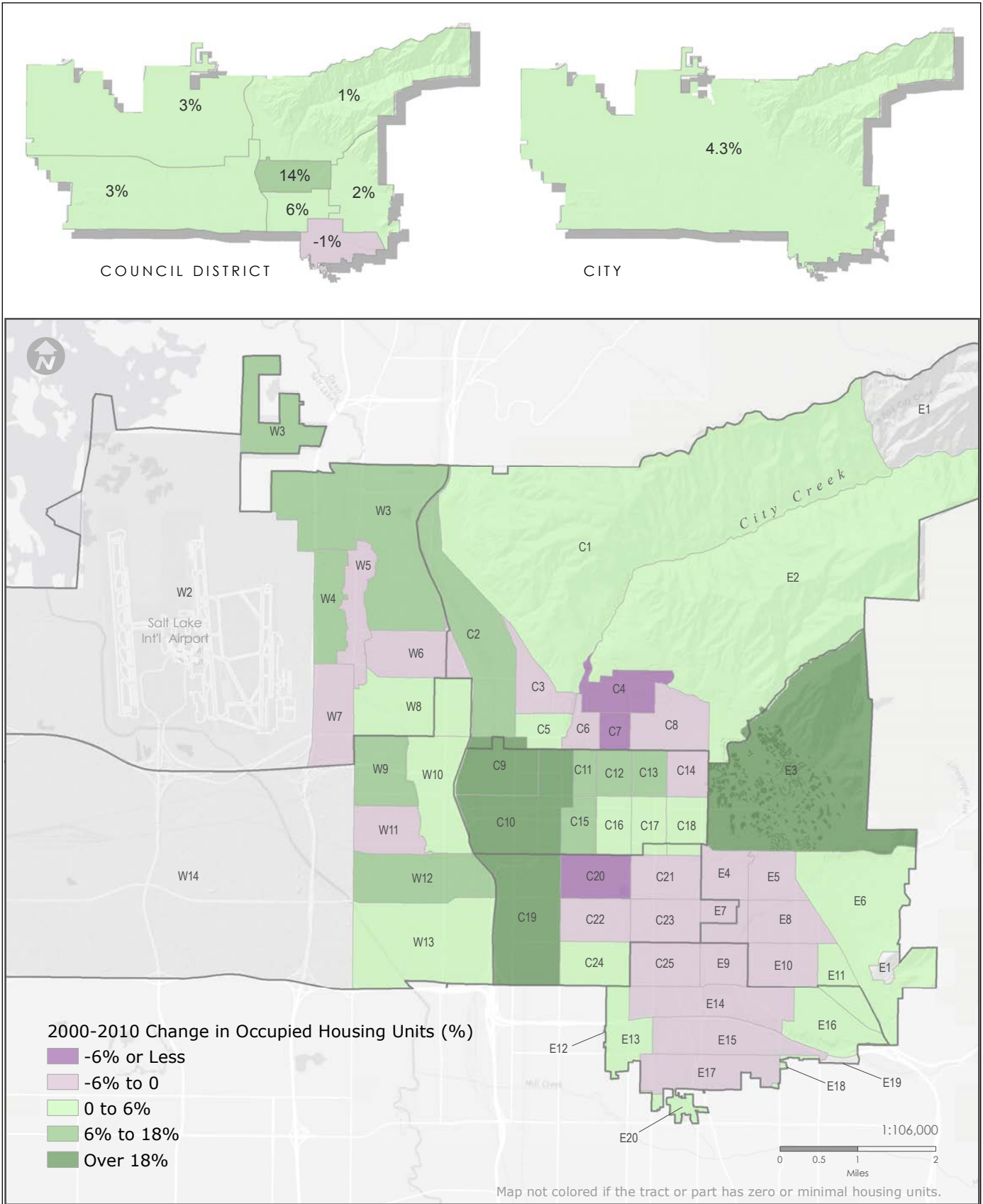

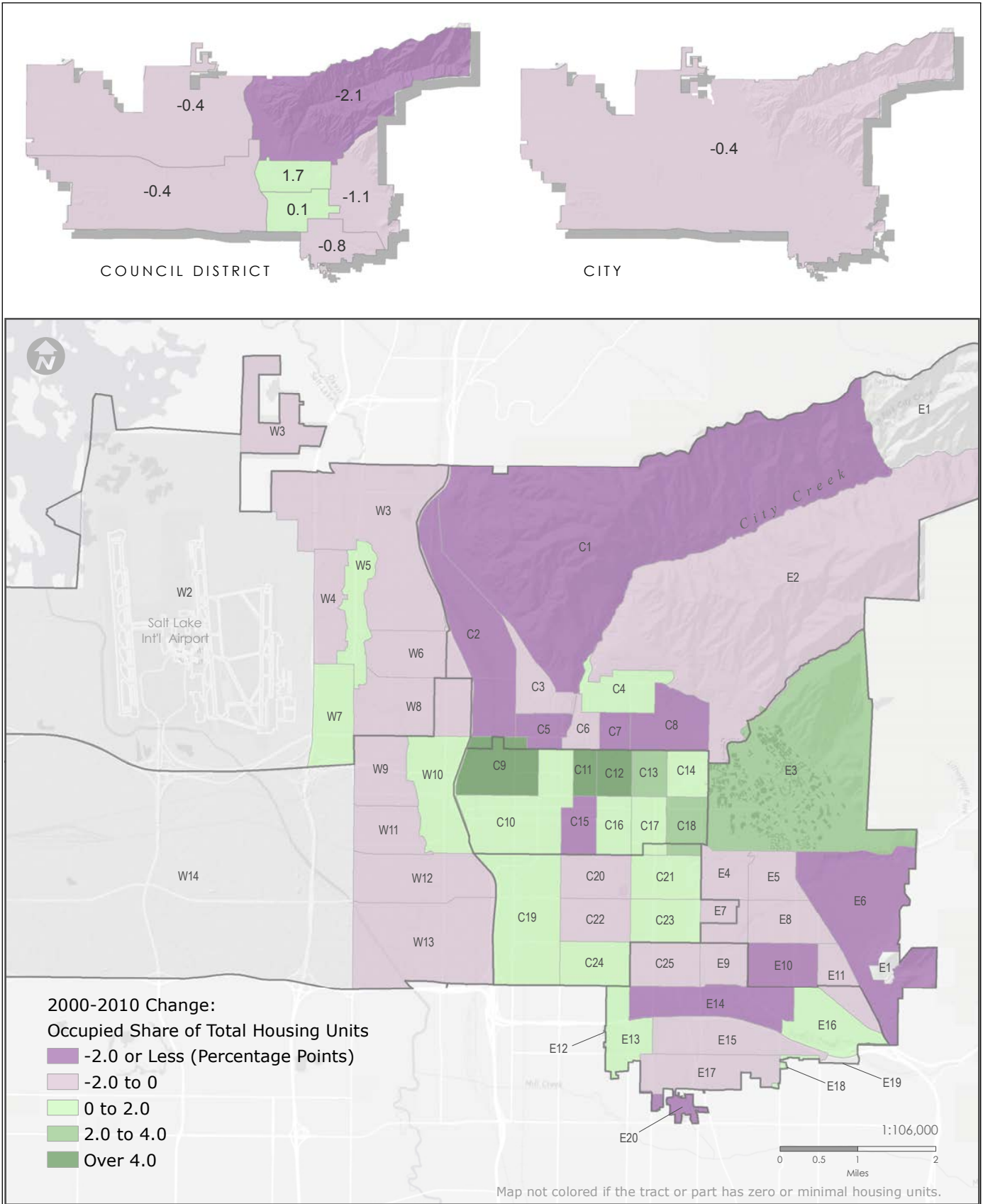

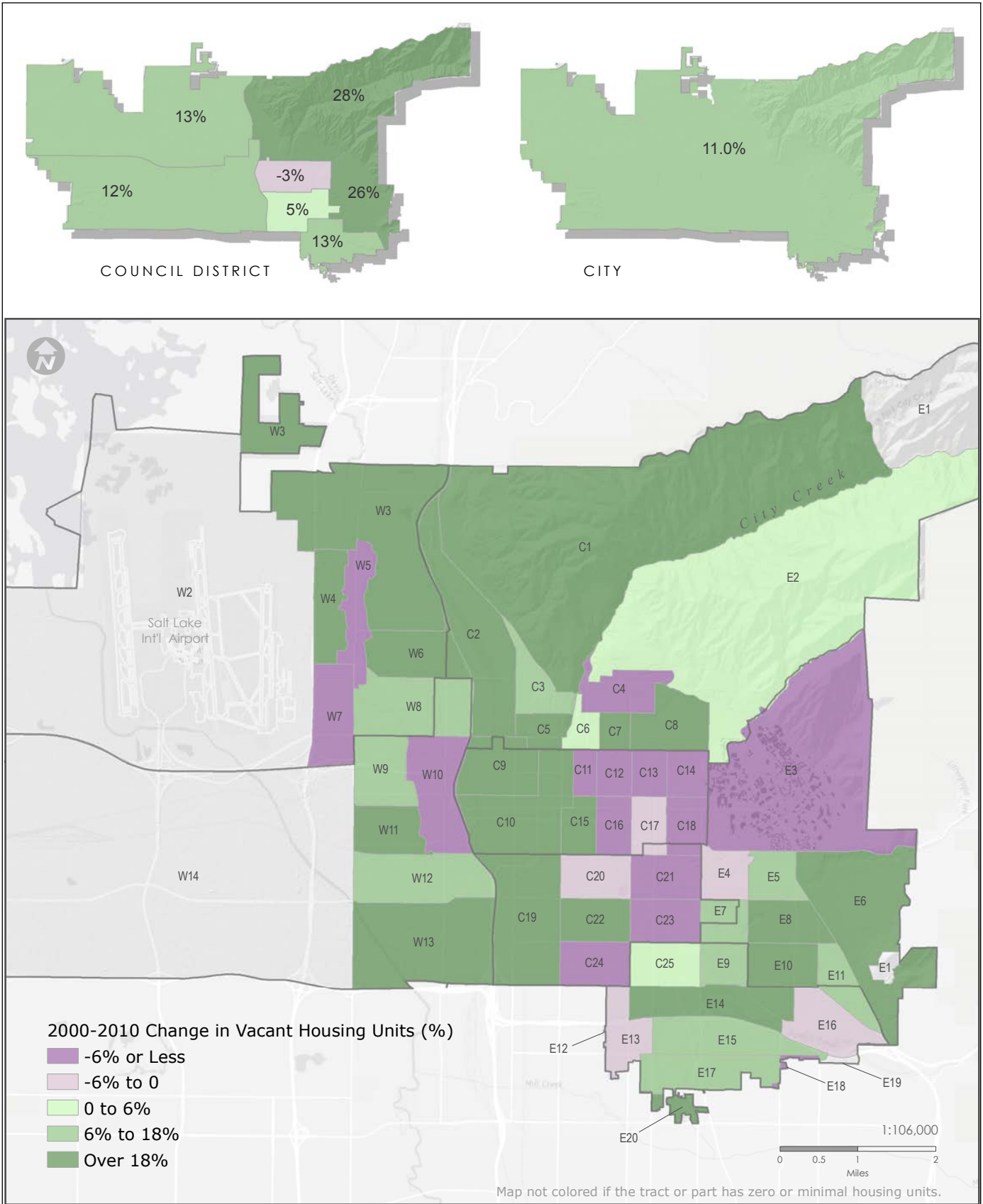

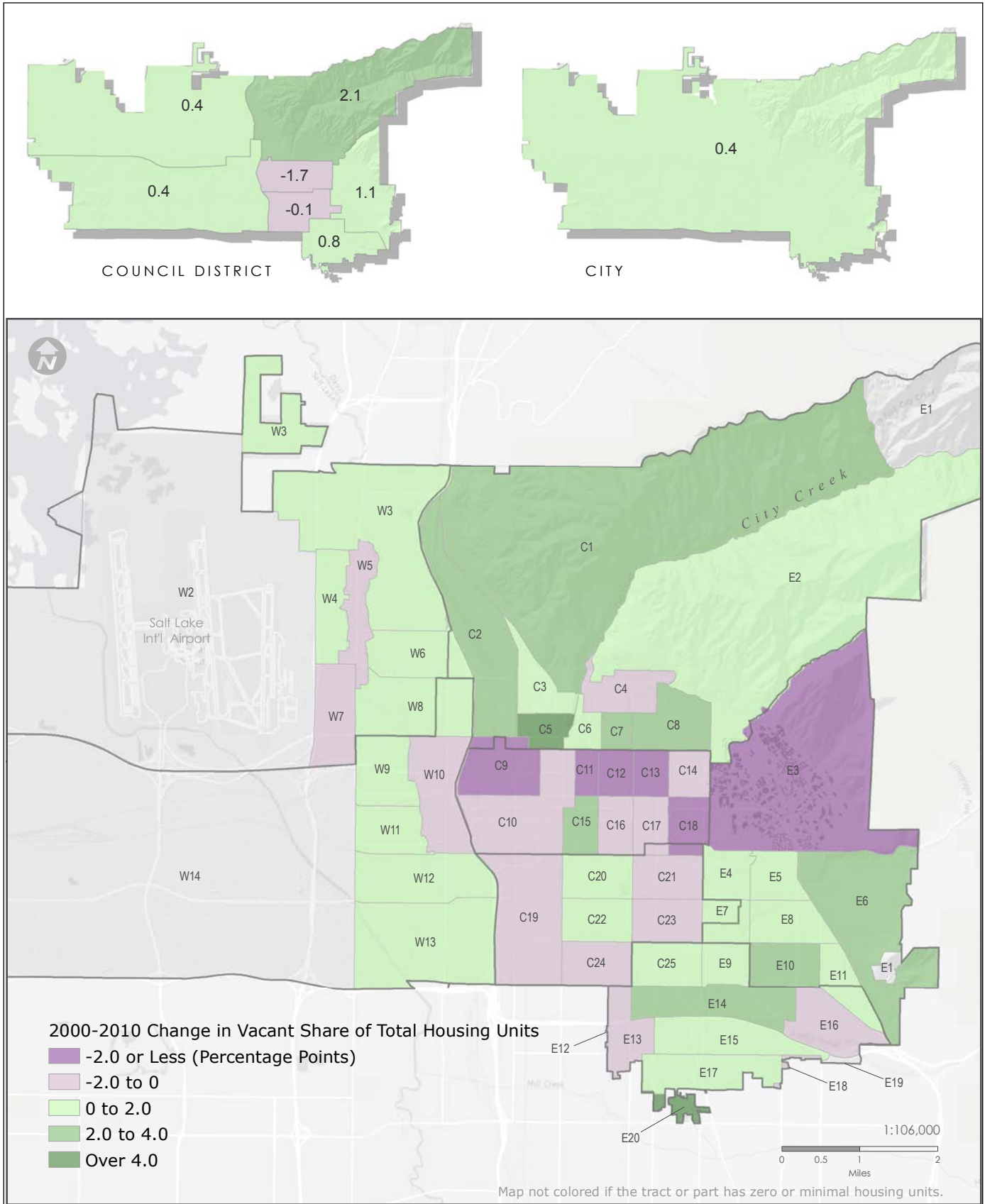

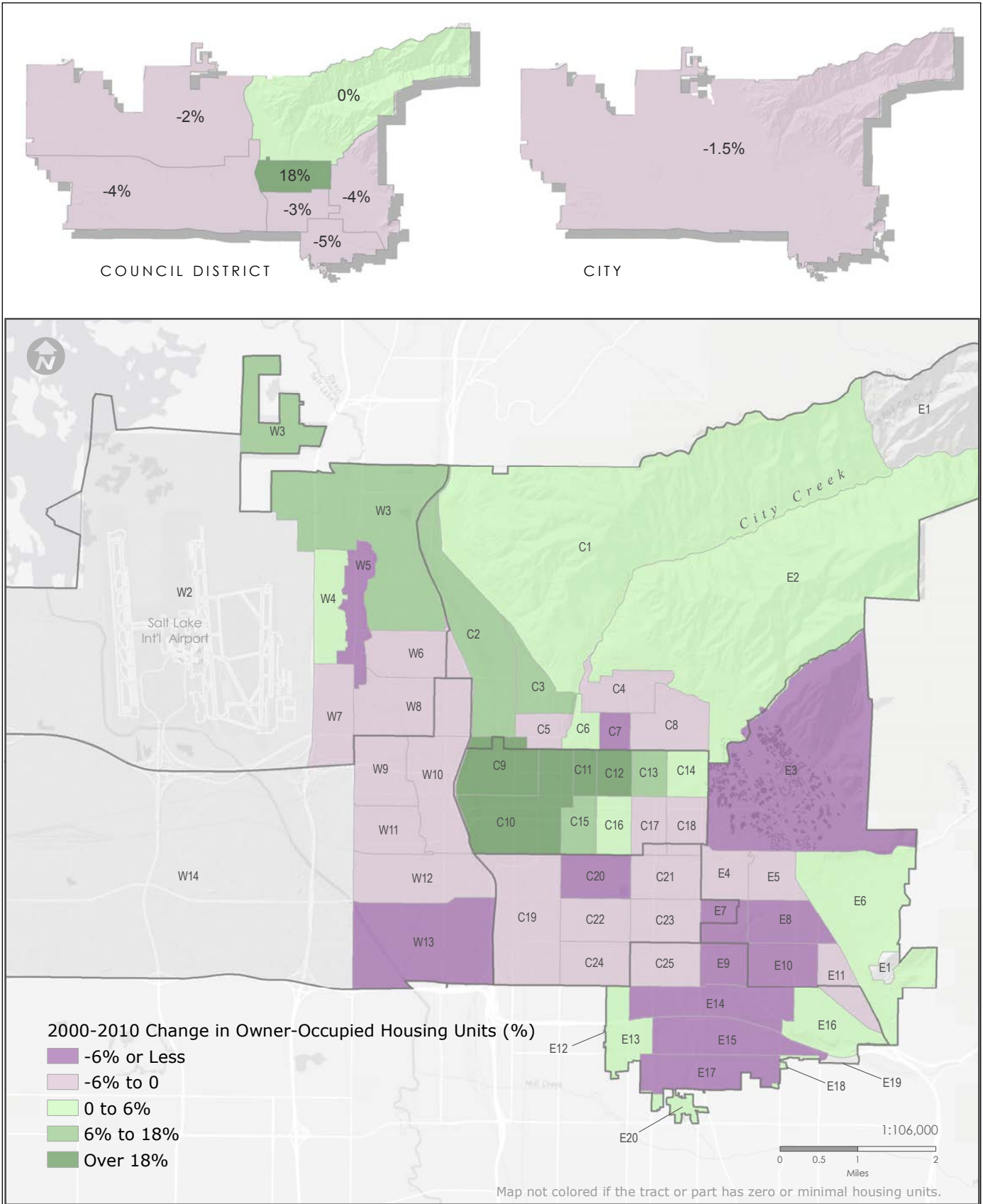

Figure 42: Owner-Occupied Share of Occupied Housing Units in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

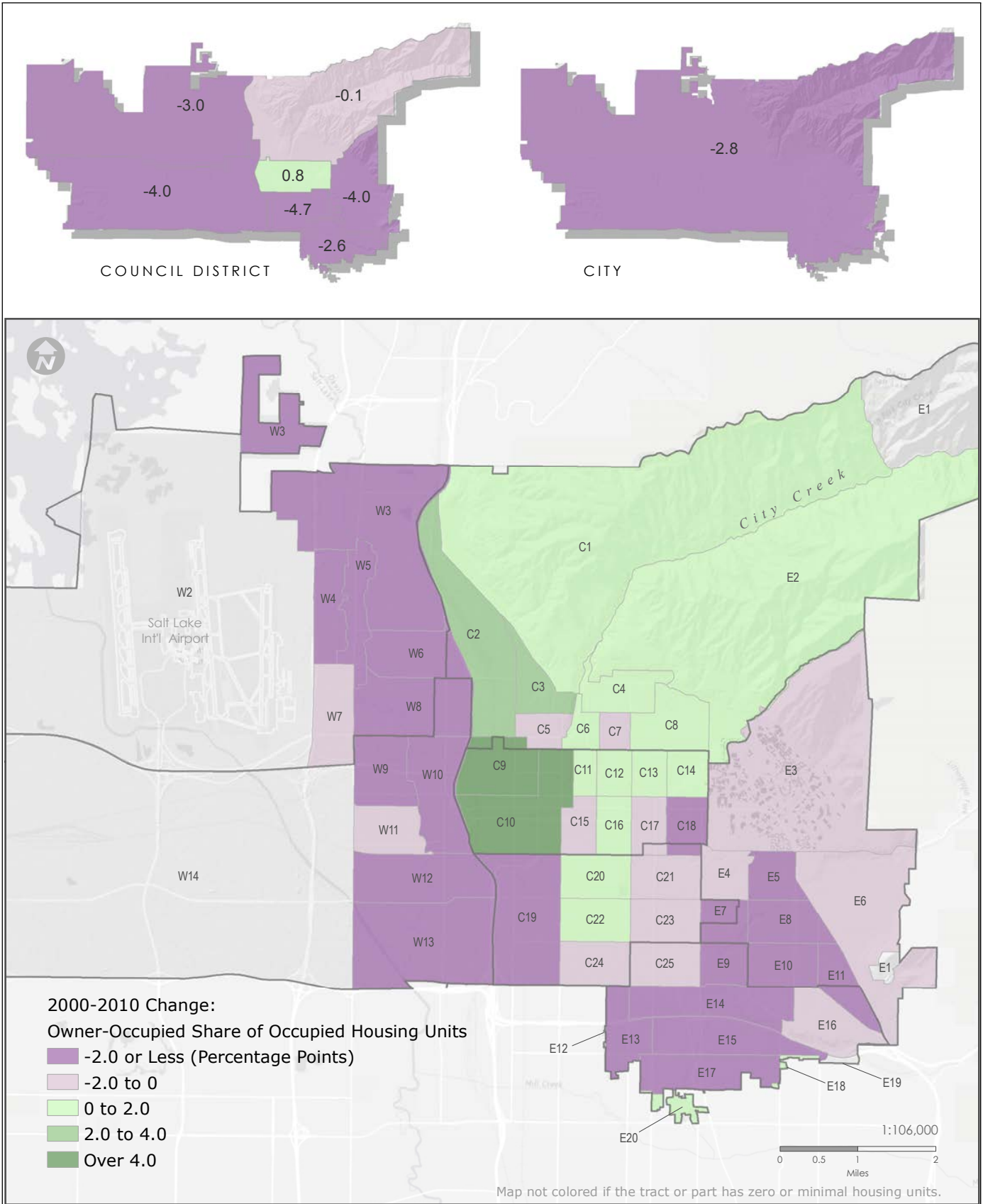

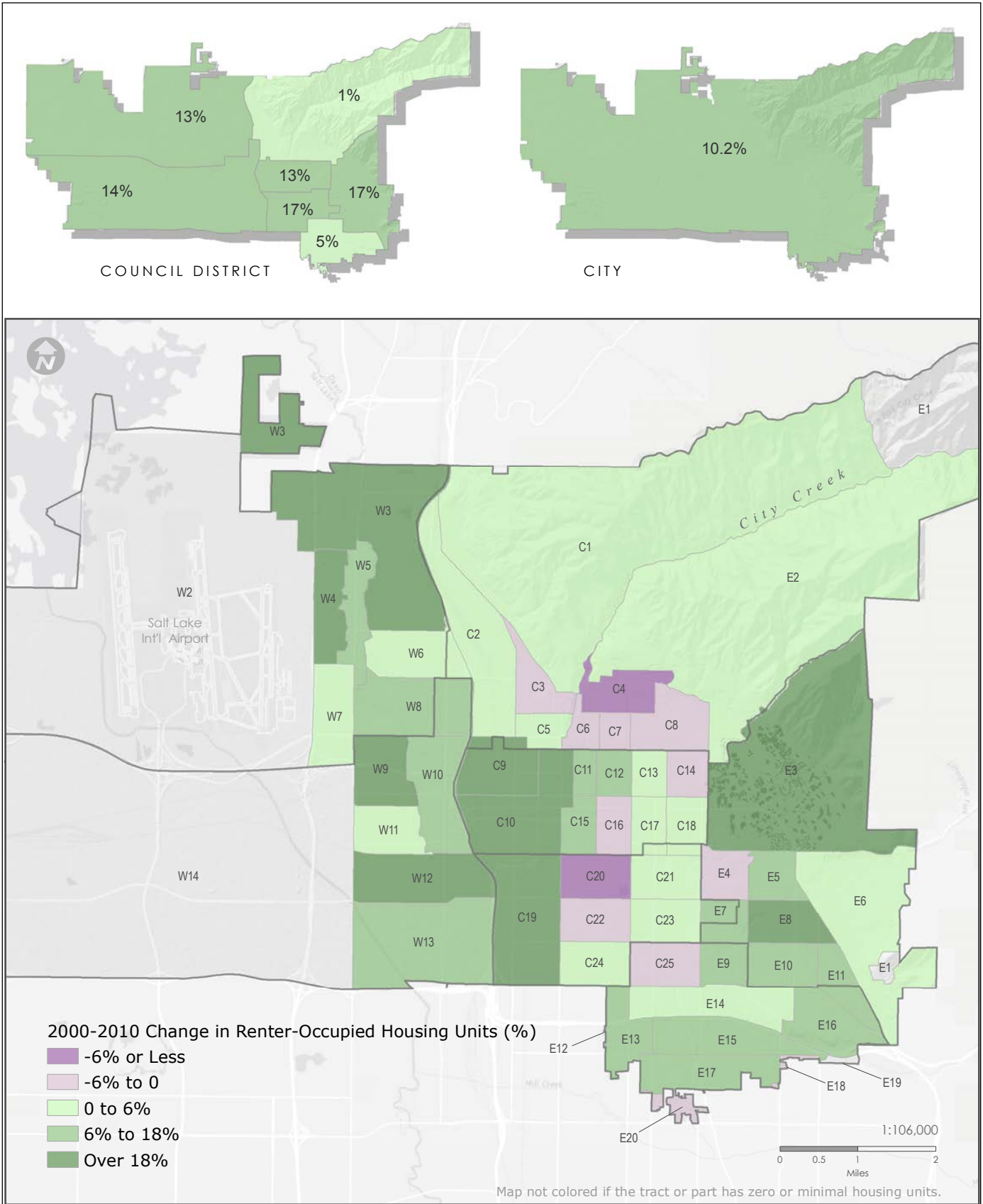

Figure 44: Renter-Occupied Share of Occupied Housing Units in Salt Lake City, 2000–2010

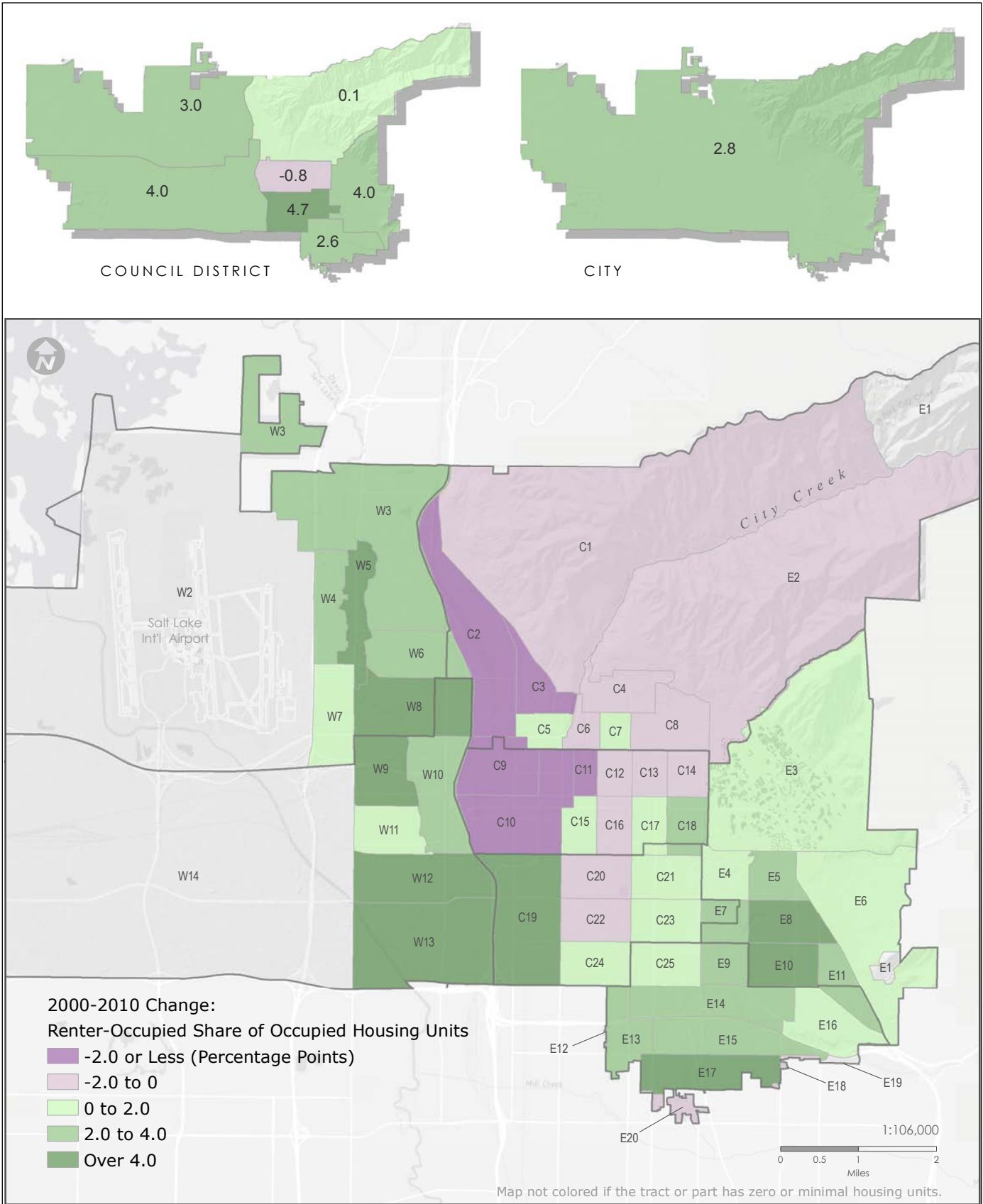
