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Introduction

Data Notes

This Salt Lake City Data Book has been sponsored by Salt Lake City Corporation. It presents the newest available data from various federal and state level entities regarding the demographics, socioeconomics, housing status, and general economic information about the city.

This document utilizes several different data sources:

- 2016 population and housing estimates created at the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute.
- Demographic and socioeconomic information from the American Community Survey 2011-2015
 5-year Estimates (ACS).
- Economic information from the Ivory-Boyer
 Construction Database, Utah Department of
 Workforce Services, U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, and
 the Utah State Tax Commission.

These sources provide insights into various demographic and socioeconomic aspects of communities within Salt Lake City and the cities within Salt Lake County. Data are presented through maps and tables.

The ACS is an ongoing survey that provides information on social and economic characteristics of communities. The ACS began in 2008 and replaced the Census Long Form in 2010. Each year Census publishes updated 1-year ACS data for populations over 65,000 and 5-year data for all available geographies. The data provided by the ACS is based upon a sample rather than a full count of the population and is a "summary of conditions as observed in individual samples over a multi-year period." This, combined with small sample sizes at the tract level, can create large margins of error and can make the data less reliable.

For this Data Book, a coefficient of variation (CV) is employed to help readers understand the "fitness for use" of the data. Although there are no set levels of fitness or reliability with the CV, smaller values are considered more reliable than higher values. Guidance provided by the Census Bureau also suggests:

"A general guideline when working with ACS estimates is that, while data are available at low geographic levels, in situations where the CVs for these estimates are high, the reliability of the estimates will be improved by aggregating such estimates to a higher geographic level." 2

When census tract level data are presented in this document, the data is not further aggregated to reduce high CVs. In 2005, the National Research Center proposed the following thresholds to analyze reliability of ACS data:³

- High reliability less than or equal to 12
- Medium reliability 13 to 40
- Low reliability over 40

Geography Notes

For the majority of the data subjects in this book, communities within Salt Lake City are examined at a census tract level of geography.¹ The 2011-2015 American Community Survey 5-Year data correspond to year 2015 vintages of geography as provided by the Census Bureau.





Figure 1: Share of Tract Population in City Boundary Salt Lake City Tracts, Census 2010

Census tracts are sub-geographies of counties, and are not designed to correspond with place (city/town) boundaries. A small number of the tracts included in this book are only partially located inside the Salt Lake City boundary. The full geographic area of these tracts may include residents of other cities. The maps and tables in this book present data corresponding to the full tract area.² All tracts that have any portion within Salt Lake City are included in the data tables, and the tables denote which tracts have boundaries that extend beyond the city. Tracts 1139.06 and 1101.03 have been excluded from maps due to the very large size of the tracts and their minimal numbers of Salt Lake City residents.³ A tract reference map follows in this section. Figure 1 and Table 1 display shares of the 2010 tract populations which are within city boundaries, illustrating tracts with divided populations.

Some geographic changes to Salt Lake City tracts are visible when comparing Census 2010 tracts to the 2015 vintage. Most changes are small, cosmetic, and do not impact populated areas. A change in the boundary of Tract 1101.03, however, moved the 19 Salt Lake City residents of that tract into neighboring Tract 1042.⁴

City boundaries are updated every year through the Census Bureau's Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS) and are available in annual vintages. The boundaries for Salt Lake City remained the same from the 2010 Census through 2014. In 2015, Salt Lake City boundaries were updated through the BAS. The place boundaries used in this book are 2015 place boundaries, which correspond to the 2011-2015 ACS data.

The population estimates section includes Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute population estimates from 2010 through 2016. Unlike the American Community Survey data, these data represent only the tract portions within the city boundaries. Tract-in-city areas are composed of the Census 2010 blocks which best represent the 2015 BAS city boundary.⁵

Tract codes shown in maps and tables were created by the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute as an abbreviated method of referring to tracts. The letters W, C, and E in tract codes roughly correspond to west, central, and east areas of the city. In the text, a Salt Lake City community council name is given when a tract is discussed to provide context for the tract location. The Salt Lake City Census Tract Reference Map displays both tract and community council boundaries.

¹ American Community Survey 5-Year data are also available at the block group level of geography, which are the sub-geographies of census tracts. As block group data are less reliable than tract data due to decreased sample sizes, we have selected to display tract data. Tract data should also be interpreted with caution.

Tract 1139.06 is at the westernmost edge of Salt Lake City and has no population residing within the 2015 city boundary. Most residents live within the boundaries of Magna. Tract 1101.03 is at the eastern edge of the city and also has no residents in the Salt Lake City 2015 boundary. Most residents live in Emigration Canyon and Millcreek. Though not shown in maps, data for these tracts is shared in each data table, where their tract codes are listed as W1 and E1, respectively.

Census 2010 tract boundaries show 19 residents of Tract 1101.03 (in Block 1052) in Salt Lake City, but the 2015 vintage of tract boundaries appears to have shifted that population to Tract 1042, within the city boundaries. This tract is still included in data tables.

Population and Households Estimates

The following set of maps (Figures 2 through 8) and tabular data (Tables 2 through 8) share estimated changes in population and households in Salt Lake City census tracts from Census 2010 (April 1, 2010) to July 1, 2016. The estimates were produced by the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute using the housing unit method, which uses building permit data to estimate changes in housing units, and then infers population change based on the housing unit changes. Changes in group quarters populations—people in group living situations such as dormitories and jails—are also accounted for where data are available. This section also shares estimated changes in households by tenancy (renter-occupied and owner-occupied). All 2016 estimates refer to the July 1, 2016 reference date. Estimates are calculated for the tract areas within Salt Lake City's 2016 boundary.

The total population of Salt Lake City grew from 186,411 at Census 2010 to 195,262 in 2016, an increase of 8,851 (4.7 percent).² Tract 1014, which holds the University of Utah campus, experienced the largest population growth, adding 1,930 residents. This growth came almost entirely through increases in the campus dormitory population. The next highest growth areas were in Tract 1141 (Sugar House), Tract 1029 (Ball Park), and Tract 1019 (Central City).

The Salt Lake City portion of Tract 1118.02 (Sugar House) experienced the greatest rate of population change, with 86.5 percent growth. The next highest growth rate was in Tract 1141 (Sugar House, 43.2 percent). Other fast-growing tracts were Tract 1014 (University of Utah), Tract 1021 (Central City), and Tract 1001 (Capitol Hill and Fairpark). These tracts grew 40.1 percent, 38.4 percent, and 34.3 percent, respectively.

The city's total household count grew from 74,499 at Census 2010 to 78,017 in 2016, an increase of 3,518 (4.7 percent).³ Households are occupied (rather than vacant) housing units. Tract 1141 (Sugar House) gained the most households, at 470.

Tract 1019 (Central City) followed with 447 new households. Tract 1025 (Downtown), Tract 1021 (Central City), and Tract 1029 (Ball Park) also each gained over 350 new households (405, 392, and 364, respectively).

Renter-occupied households in the city grew by 3,246 (8.4 percent), bringing the 2016 total renter-occupied units to 41,687. This represents 53.4 percent of the city's occupied units. Eleven tracts gained at least 100 new renter households. Tract 1141 (Sugar House) gained the most, with 468 new renter households, followed by Tract 1019 (Central City, 429 new units) and Tract 1025 (Downtown, 404 new units).

Owner-occupied household growth in Salt Lake City was far smaller than renter household growth. Owner households increased by 273 (0.8 percent), for a total of 36,331 owner-occupied units in 2016. This represents 46.6 percent of the city's occupied units. Tract 1033 (Sugar House) gained the most owner households (21 households). Tract 1048 (Sugar House) and Tract 1019 (Central City) followed, gaining 19 and 18 owner households.

Tract 1014 (University of Utah) has the highest renter share of households in the city, at 98 percent. Tract 1148, part of the Avenues neighborhood and bordering the university, has the highest owner share of households in the city, at 94 percent.⁴

The source of building permit data was Construction Monitor, a company that performs ongoing collection of permit data. Permit data were geocoded and analyzed by the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute.⁵

¹ Renter and owner-occupied housing unit counts are provided in Census 2010. Following the census, permits with 0 to 11 units are considered owner-occupied for estimation purposes, and permits with 12 units or more are considered renter-occupied.


² The Census 2010 value is the Salt Lake City population adjusted based on 2015 city boundary changes. Our estimate of the Census 2010 population is 186,411. The population with the Census 2010 city boundary was 186,440 (29 higher in population).

³ The Census 2010 value is the Salt Lake City household count adjusted based on 2015 city boundary changes. Our estimate of the Census 2010 households is 74,499. The household count with the Census 2010 city boundary was 74,513 (14 higher).



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

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












The following set of maps (Figures 9 through 12) and tabular data (Tables 9 through 12) show the total population and total households of the residents of cities in Salt Lake County and the census tracts within Salt Lake City. The data presented are all from the 2011-2015 American Community Survey 5-year estimates. These data provide the denominator for the ACS data shared in the later sections of this book, which present age, race and ethnicity, socioeconomics, and housing.

The 2011-2015 ACS estimates show a population of 190,679 in Salt Lake City. According to this data, Salt Lake City was the largest place in the state during the time period. Census Tract 1006 (Fairpark) has the largest population at 8,181, while Tract 1002 (Capitol Hill) has the smallest population with 1,296 residents.

Salt Lake City also has the largest number of households of all places in the state, with nearly 40,000 more households than the next city (West Valley). Of the Census Tracts with boundaries entirely within Salt Lake City limits, Census Tract 1042 (East Bench) has the largest number of households at 2,620, while Tract 1002 (Capitol Hill) has the smallest number with 522 households.





Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate













Race and Ethnicity

The following set of maps (Figures 13 through 28) and tabular data (Tables 13 through 28) show the population by race, ethnicity, and minority status of the residents of cities in Salt Lake County and the census tracts within Salt Lake City. The data presented is all from the 2011-2015 American Community Survey 5-Year estimates.

In this data, minorities are defined as all who identify themselves as Hispanic, non-white, or mixed race. Although San Juan County has the highest share of minority population in the state at 54 percent, Salt Lake County comes in second at 27 percent. The total minority population in Salt Lake County is the largest in the state at 293,039. Salt Lake County has the highest percentage (17.6 percent) of Hispanic or Latino residents in the state.

West Valley City has the highest minority share of population in Salt Lake County with more than half (51.9 percent) of residents that would be termed minority using the definition above. South Salt Lake is close behind, with 47.3 percent of residents identifying as minorities. Salt Lake City has the fifth largest minority share of population in Salt Lake County at 35 percent.


The non-Hispanic Asian population is the second largest non-Hispanic group in Salt Lake City (5.5 percent) followed by non-Hispanic Black residents at 2.5 percent and non-Hispanic Hawaiian or Pacific Island residents at 2.4 percent. The city has the seventh highest percentage of Hispanic or Latino residents (20.6 percent) in the county, falling behind communities on the west side of the county and South Salt Lake.


Five census tracts in Salt Lake City have a non-Hispanic White population of less than 30 percent. Twelve tracts have less than 50 percent. All of these tracts are located west of the I-15 corridor. Sixteen out of 22 tracts with non-Hispanic White populations between 50 and 80 percent are in the central part of Salt Lake City. Tracts on the eastern side of Salt Lake City have the highest percentage of non-Hispanic White residents.


At the Census Tract level, analysis of the population by race and ethnicity may not be statistically reliable due to small sample sizes. Using the coefficient of variation guidelines mentioned in the introduction, two populations stand out in a small number of tracts. Census Tracts 1014 (University of Utah), 1145 and 1028.02 (Glendale), 1042 (East Bench), 1015 and 1017 (East Central), and 1025 (Downtown) have non-Hispanic Asian populations over 10 percent. Tract 1014 has the highest share of Asian residents at 23 percent. Census Tract 1003.06 (Jordan Meadows) has the largest percentage of non-Hispanic Hawaiian or Pacific Islander population (11.1 percent).

Data for the Hispanic or Latino population in Salt Lake City Census Tracts is generally reliable. Census Tract 12026 (Poplar Grove) has the highest percentage of Hispanic residents at 52.9 percent. Census Tract 1006 (Fairpark) has the largest number of Hispanic residents (4,641 people).

Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate








Figure 16: Non-Hispanic Black or African American Population Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate








Figure 18: Non-Hispanic American Indian and Alaska Native Population Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate










Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate













Figure 24: Non-Hispanic Some Other Race and Two or More Races Population Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate










Figure 25: Hispanic or Latino Population Salt Lake City Tracts, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate









Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate








Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate





Age

This section presents graphic (Figures 29 through 40) and tabular data (Tables 29 through 40) regarding age characteristics for the residents of cities in Salt Lake County and the census tracts within Salt Lake City. The data presented are from the 2011-2015 5-year American Community Survey estimates. This section refers to the population by age groups. School-age children are 5 through 17 years old. College-age individuals are 18 through 24 years old. Working-age population includes individuals 18 through 64 years old. Retirement-age population includes those 65 years and over.

The median age in Salt Lake City is 31.5, placing it firmly in the middle of the median age for places in Salt Lake County. Salt Lake City has the highest percentage of population of collegeage and working-age individuals with a reliable CV in Salt Lake County. Cities in southwest Salt Lake County have the highest percentage of school-age children, while Salt Lake City is on the lower end of the 23 places in the county with 14.4 percent. 7.2 percent of Salt Lake City residents are under 5 years old, which is below the share for Salt Lake County as a whole (8.3 percent).


Census Tract 1014 (University of Utah) has the lowest median age at 21.1 years. This tract also has the highest percentage of college-age individuals at 50 percent. Census Tract 1042 (East Bench) has the highest median age at 48.3. There are three census tracts entirely within the city boundary with a median age over 40 – 1042 (East Bench), 1148, and 1010 (Avenues).


Census Tracts 1019 and 1021 (Central City) have the lowest percentage of residents under the age of five. These two districts in addition to Census Tracts 1025 and 1140 (Downtown) have only 1 percent of their population between the ages of 5-17. Over 30 percent of the population in Census Tracts 1027.02 (Poplar Grove) and 1003.07 (Westpointe) are school-age children. Of tracts contained entirely within the Salt Lake City boundaries, Census Tract 1028.02 (Glendale) has the highest percentage of children under 5 at 12.7 percent.

Three tracts – 1016 (East Central), 1008 (Capitol Hill), and 1033 (Sugar House) – have over 25 percent of their population in the college-age group. Census Tract 1033 is near the Westminster College Campus, and Tract 1016 is on the western boundary of the University of Utah. Every tract in Salt Lake City has over 50 percent of the population classified as working-age. Census Tract 1021 (Central City) has the highest percentage (95 percent), and eight other Census Tracts have over 80 percent of the population in this age group.

Two tracts – 1042 (East Bench) and 1008 (Capitol Hill) – have over 20 percent of their population in the retirement-age group. Census Tract 1021 (Central City) has the lowest percentage of retirement-age people (2.5 percent).

Figure 30: Children Under 5 Years of Age Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate










Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate









Figure 34: College-Age Population Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate









Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate









Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate








Figure 40: Median Age Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate





The following set of maps (Figures 41 through 60) and tabular data (Tables 41 through 60) show details regarding household composition of the residents of cities in Salt Lake County and the census tracts within Salt Lake City. The data presented is all from the 2011-2015 American Community Survey 5-Year estimates.


In the 5-year ACS for 2011-2015, there were 75,330 households in Salt Lake City. The average household size in Salt Lake City is 2.47 people, making it the third smallest in Salt Lake County. About half (52 percent) of households in Salt Lake City are family households, the lowest of places in Salt Lake County. Salt Lake City also has a small percentage of large families (over 5 people), at 8.9 percent. Bluffdale, South Jordan, Riverton, Kearns, and Herriman all have over 25 percent of households of 5 people or more. Conversely, 35.9 percent of households in Salt Lake City are one person living alone. Salt Lake City is one of five cities in Salt Lake County to have over 30 percent of households having one resident.


Census Tract 1003.07 (Westpointe) has the largest average household size at 4.23 people. Census Tract 1021 (Central City) has the smallest at 1.26 people. Census Tract 1021 also has the highest percentage of nonfamily households in Salt Lake City (86 percent).


Of tracts that have the majority of their population within Salt Lake City Boundaries, three tracts – 1003.07 (Westpointe), 1027.02 (Poplar Grove), and 1148 (Avenues) – have over 80 percent of households as family households. Census Tracts 1027.02 and 1003.07 also have the highest percentage of married and single-parent families with children in Salt Lake City. Additionally, Census Tract 1003.07 has the highest percentage of families with 5 people or more of the tracts that fall entirely within Salt Lake City boundaries. Eight tracts –1028.01 (Glendale), 1003.07, 1003.08 (Westpointe), 1147 (Rose Park), 1027.01, 1027.02 (Poplar Grove), 1006 (Fairpark), and 1003.06 (Jordan Meadows) – have over 20 percent of households with large families.

Of the tracts that fall entirely within Salt Lake City boundaries, 1023 (Central City), 1148 (Avenues), and 1042 (East Bench) have over 40 percent of their households with someone 60 years or over. Census Tract 1021 (Central City) has the highest percentage of single-person households (78.7 percent).



Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate








Figure 44: Households with Persons Age 60 or Over Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate









Figure 45: Family Households Salt Lake City Tracts, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate







Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate







Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate








Figure 50: Married Couple Families with Children Under 18 Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate









Figure 52: Single Householders with Children Under 18 Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate







Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate







Figure 55: Nonfamily Households Salt Lake City Tracts, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate







Figure 56: Nonfamily Households Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate







Figure 58: Householder Living Alone Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate












Figure 60: Average Household Size Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate





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Socioeconomics

The following set of maps (Figures 61 through 80) and tabular data (Tables 61 through 80) present socioeconomic characteristics of the residents of cities in Salt Lake County and the census tracts of Salt Lake City. The data presented are all from the 2011-2015 American Community Survey 5-Year estimates.

Salt Lake City has the third highest percentage of foreign-born residents of places in Salt Lake County with 17.4 percent. Eighteen census tracts in Salt Lake City have a higher percentage of foreign-born residents than the city as a whole; nine have over 30 percent. Census Tracts 1003.08 (Westpointe) and 1027.02 (Poplar Grove) have the highest percentage of foreign-born residents at 38 percent. Of census tracts that fall entirely within the city, Census Tract 1037 (Wasatch Hollow), has the lowest percentage of foreign-born residents at 4 percent.

The median household income in Salt Lake City is the second lowest of all the places in Salt Lake County at \$47,243. South Salt Lake has the lowest at \$37,083. Seven census tracts have a household median income over \$100,000. These tracts are located in the eastern part of the city, Capitol Hill, and the Avenues. Three census tracts have a median household income below \$25,000 – Tract 1014 (University of Utah), Tract 1029 (Ball Park), and Tract 1023 (Central City).

Salt Lake City has the second highest percentage of households with incomes below poverty in Salt Lake County at 18 percent. South Salt Lake has the highest at 23 percent. Census Tract 1014 (University of Utah) has the highest percentage of households with incomes below poverty level in Salt Lake City at 45 percent. Census Tract 1029 (Ball Park) has 40 percent. There are five additional tracts with over 30 percent of households having incomes below poverty. Of tracts that are contained entirely within the city, Census Tract 1042 (East Bench) has the lowest percentage of households in poverty.

Educational attainment presents the highest level of education obtained by respondents age 25 and over. While Salt Lake City has a relatively high percentage of residents with a bachelor's degree or higher at 43 percent, it falls behind five communities on the eastern side of the county. The city has the fifth highest

share in the county for those without a high school degree, at 13 percent. The communities with higher percentages for the population without a high school degree are West Valley City, Kearns, South Salt Lake, and Magna. Of the remaining 44 percent of Salt Lake City residents 25 and over, 20 percent have some college, no degree, seven percent have an associate's degree, and 17 percent have a high school diploma.


Tracts 1006 (Fairpark), 1027.01, and 1027.02 (Poplar Grove) all have over 35 percent of the population 25 or over with less than a high school degree. Three tracts – 1148 (Avenues), 1042 (East Bench), and 1041 (Foothill/Sunnyside) – have over 75 percent of the population 25 or over with a bachelor's degree or higher. Of tracts contained entirely within the city, Tract 1011.02 (Avenues) has the highest percentage of the population 25 and over with an associate's degree at 12 percent. Census Tract 1003.06 (Jordan Meadows) has the highest percentage (27 percent) of the population with only a high school diploma.


Sixteen percent of Salt Lake City residents indicated they had moved residences within Utah in the past year. Six percent moved to Salt Lake City from outside of Utah. Two other cities, South Salt Lake and Murray, saw more in-state movers than Salt Lake City. Three communities, Copperton, Alta, and Granite, all saw more out-of-state movers than Salt Lake City, although the CV values for these areas are high and may be less reliable.


Census Tracts 1019 (Central City), 1140 (Downtown), and 1014 (University of Utah) all had more than 30 percent of their population move from in-state. Of tracts contained entirely within Salt Lake City boundaries, Census Tract 1042 (East Bench) had the lowest percentage of in-state movers at 6 percent.

Tracts 1026 (Poplar Grove) and 1003.07 (Westpointe) saw the lowest percentage of movers from out-of-state at 1 percent or less. Census Tracts 1008 (Capitol Hill), 1025 (Downtown), and 1014 (University of Utah) had the highest percentage of out-of-state movers, each with over 15 percent.

Figure 61: Foreign-Born Population Salt Lake City Tracts, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate









Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate









Figure 64: Median Household Income Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate








Figure 66: Households with Income Below Poverty Level Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate






Figure 68: Population Age 25 and Over with Less than High School Diploma or Equivalent Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate







Figure 70: Population Age 25 and Over with a High School Diploma or Equivalent Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate






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

Figure 72: Population Age 25 and Over with Some College, No Degree Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate






Figure 74: Population Age 25 and Over with an Associate's Degree Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate






Figure 76: Population Age 25 and Over with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate











Figure 78: Recent Mover Population, Moved from within Utah Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate










Figure 80: Recent Mover Population, Moved from Another State or Abroad Salt Lake County Places, 2011-2015 Five-Year Estimate





Economics

The Gardner Policy Institute compiled the following economic statistics using data from the Utah Department of Workforce Services, U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, Ivory-Boyer Construction database, and the Utah State Tax Commission. Statistics for all indicators, except for occupation salaries, are provided for Salt

Lake City, Salt Lake County excluding Salt Lake City, and the state; data are unavailable at the tract level. Occupational data are unavailable at the city level and therefore data are provided for the Salt Lake Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA), which includes Salt Lake County and Tooele County.

Employment and Occupations

Salt Lake City's largest provider of jobs is the public sector. In 2015, the most recent year for which data are available, just over 20 percent of all of the city's jobs were in local (including school districts), state, and federal government. About 19 percent of the city's jobs were in the trade, transportation, and utilities industry and nearly 18 percent were in the professional and business services sector. The mining sector accounted for the smallest share of jobs, 0.5 percent.


The Salt Lake MSA's top five occupations include customer service representatives, retail salespersons, general and operations managers, food preparation and service workers, office clerks, and administrative assistance, which comprised over 13 percent of all occupations in 2016. Of the 51 occupations classes with 3,000 or more jobs, 38 had median salaries in Salt Lake MSA that were higher than the median for the rest of Utah; 14 had median salaries in the Salt Lake MSA that were higher than the United States median.

Building Permits

In 2016, residential building permits were issued for 124 buildings, including 3,049 units in Salt Lake City. The value of these permits was over \$377 million, about 9 percent of the statewide value. Nearly all of the new dwelling unit permits issued in the city were for multi-family units, which accounted for over 98 percent of all dwelling unit permits in the city. Statewide, multi-family unit permits accounted for just under 46 percent of all dwelling unit permits. Over 98 percent of

the city's multi-family unit permits were for larger apartment projects (5 or more families).

Nonresidential building permits were issued for 64 structures, with a total value of over \$331 million in Salt Lake City in 2016. Just over 42 percent of the value was in permits for industrial and office building projects; statewide, these projects accounted for about a guarter of all nonresidential permit value.

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Gross Taxable Sales

In 2016, gross taxable sales for Salt Lake City totaled \$7.6 billion dollars, accounting for 30 percent of all sales in Salt Lake County and over 13 percent of sales statewide. Taxable sales in the retail trade sector made up the most sales in the city, 40 percent, a lower share than for the rest of Salt Lake County (over 54 percent) and statewide (just under 52 percent). The relatively lower concentration of retail sales in the city is the result of a relatively higher concentration of taxable service and business


investment sales; combined these sectors accounted for almost 55 percent of all sales in the city, compared to just under 41 percent in the rest of the county and over 43 percent statewide.
