






## Intermountain States Population: 1900-2010





# Total Population: Low, Baseline, and High Scenarios






### **Total Fertility Rates**




### Median Age


### Minority Share


### Female Age at First Marriage

Share of Households: Opposite Sex Married Couple with Children












# Minority Share by Age Group: 2010





# Minority Share of the Population: U.S., Utah, & Salt Lake County & City



Percent of Pop. Age 25 and Over: Bachelor's Degree or Higher




### % of Pop Age 25+: Less Than High School

### % of Households with 5+ People

























Percent of Households: Income Below **Poverty Level** 










# Life Expectancy at Birth
