






## **Visitor Spending Distribution**


#### **Visitor Spending**


#### Tax Revenue

#### Sales Tax Revenue Benefits


#### State Sales Tax

Utah Office of Outdoor Recreation Grant Funding, 2015-2023











#### Jobs by Industry


2022 vs. 2019 Baseline




Deplaned Passengers by Quarter, 2020-2023 vs. 2019 Baseline



(Millions of 2022 Dollars)





#### State Park Visitation


(Millions of Visits)

#### **Urban Visitor Economy**


Salt Lake County Hotel Occupancy by Quarter, 2020-2023 vs. 2019


# **Utah Population**

#### **Inflation Rates**


