


Job Change



Unemployment Rate by County





Reality Statements


"The first responsibility of a leader is to define reality."









Selected sectors, July 2019-2020, preliminary data







Cyclical v. Structural Trends





Utah Restaurant and Bar Sales



Utah Hotel Room Sales















