

## U.S. Census Bureau Estimates for Race and Hispanic Origin, Vintage 2019

Each year, the Census Bureau produces population estimates at varying levels of geography. The age, sex, race and Hispanic origin estimates at the nation, state, and county-level completes the 2019 vintage estimate package. Prior pieces of this release include national, state, county, metropolitan/micropolitan, and incorporated place (cities and towns) estimates. All of these releases include annual estimates from Census 2010 to July 1, 2019. This expansive, final estimates release contains two fact sheets detailing the results: one for race and Hispanic origin, and one for age and sex.

This fact sheet details Race and Hispanic origin at the state and county level. The five race categories used by the Census Bureau (White, Black or African American, American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, and Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander) were defined by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) in 1997. Any determination of race is through self-identification, and a person who identifies with multiple race groups is included in the “Two or More” category.

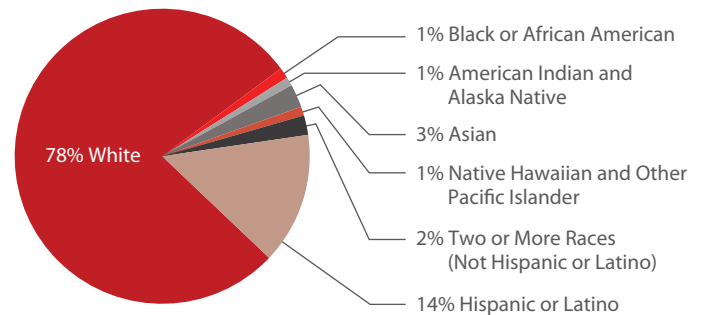
The term minority in this document refers to those who identified as Hispanic or any race category other than white. When discussing racial groups, this document is referring to people who identify as non-Hispanic, single-race (i.e. White, Asian, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander), or Two or More Races.

### National Picture

These estimates highlight increasing diversity across the United States. All race and ethnic groups grew between the 2010 and 2019 estimates, but non-Hispanic Whites are still the slowest growing group, with only 4.3% growth since 2010.

Between 2010 and 2019, Asians were the fastest-growing racial group due to net migration, the Hispanic population grew mostly due to natural increase, and the non-Hispanic White population continues to experience natural decrease (more deaths than births).

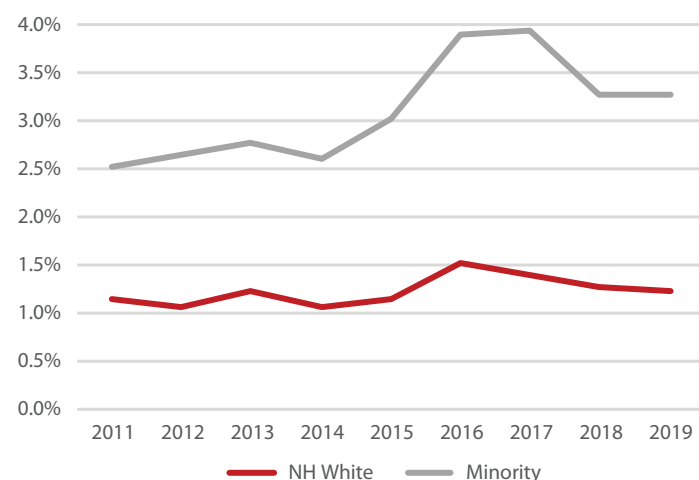
### Race and Hispanic Origin in Utah

Utah is becoming increasingly diverse. In 2010, Utah was 19.4% minority, and is now 22.0% minority. Since 2018, Utah's minority population has increased 3.3% from 689,589 to 712,199.

The Black, Two or More Races, and Asian populations (in that order) experienced the fastest rates of growth between 2018 and 2019, while Whites experienced the slowest annual growth.

The Hispanic or Latino population, Utah's largest minority group, increased 2.9%, from 449,150 in 2018 to 462,051 in 2019. Utah's Asian population is the second-largest minority group in Utah (81,646 individuals). It is no longer the fastest-growing racial minority in Utah this year, but is still the fastest-growing race since 2010, followed closely by the Two or More Races population at 47.2 % since 2010.

### Annual % Growth: White and Minority Population, 2010-2019



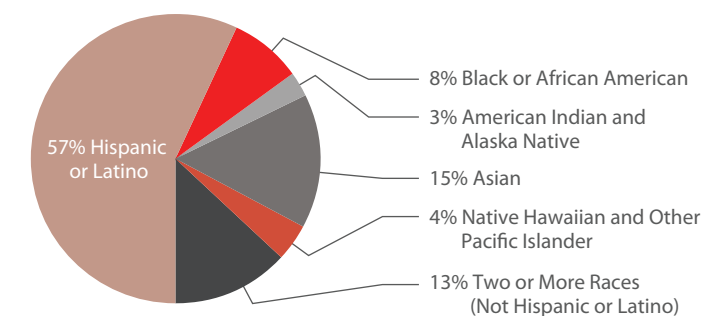

### Percent of Minority Growth, 2018-2019



Utah's minority population may only account for 22% of the total population, but it contributed 43% of statewide growth between 2018 and 2019. The Hispanic or Latino population accounted for over half of minority growth (57%), and the Asian population and Two or More Races group collectively added 28% of minority growth.

## Age and Race in Utah

Utah is a young state due to high fertility and a strong economy that attracts working-age individuals, but these age patterns differ by race/ethnicity. The non-Hispanic White population has the highest percentage of the 65+ population, the second-highest percentage of the 18+ population (behind the Asian population), and the second-lowest percentage of the under 18 population. The low percentage of under 18-year-olds is mostly due to falling fertility rates and births of the non-Hispanic White population and is consistent with national trends.

Over one-third (34.8%) of the minority population is under age 18, and one in four Utahns under age 18 are minorities. Two-thirds of these minority children are Hispanic. Additionally, almost half of Two or More Races, the second fastest-growing racial minority in the state, is under the age of 18, and only 2.8% are 65 years and over.

## Race and Hispanic Origin in Utah Counties

San Juan County continues to be the only county in the state which is minority-majority, with 55.7% of the population identifying as a minority, and 84% of their minority population (8,528 individuals) identifying as American Indians (the largest share in the state). Salt Lake County has the largest minority population at 344,482 or 29.7% of the population, with the Hispanic population comprising nearly two-thirds of the minority population, and a higher than average share of Asians (4.4%).

Among counties, Morgan County has the largest percentage of non-Hispanic Whites (94.4%), the least racially diverse of Utah's counties. Salt Lake County has the largest proportion of Hispanics, Black or African Americans, Asians, and Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islanders. Utah County has the highest percentage of Two or More Races.
